

On the cover this year is the Lady Blanche Murphy house located on the West Side Road, which is situated directly in front of Humphrey's Ledge and was built circa 1790. Its name originates from Lady Blanche, more officially known as Right Honorable Blanche Elizabeth Mary Annunciata Noel. She was the eldest daughter of the Earl and Countess of Gainsboro and she was born on March 25, 1845.

Lady Blanche fell in love and eloped to America with Thomas P. Murphy who was the organist at the church on the Earl's estate. The commoner and Lady Blanche were married on March 6, 1870. They came to America and after numerous travels in the northeast, they ended up in the North Conway area where Mr. Murphy taught at The Kearsarge School for Boys. Using a small inheritance from Lady Blanche's aunt, they bought their little cottage on the West Side Road which would become known as the Lady Blanche Murphy House.

Lady Blanche was a talented writer and contributed to such publications as *Harpers* and *Atlantic Monthly* and to the *American Encyclopedia* as well. Although Lady Blanche died an early death at her beloved cottage on March 21, 1881 at the age of 35, she was remembered by her neighbors for her gentleness and charity.

The Lady Blanche Murphy house has withstood the test of time and has been admired by many over the years. It is currently owned by and under the stewardship of Mr. Richard Goff.

2009 TOWN MEETING WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett, New Hampshire in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in the Town affairs: You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall in said Bartlett on Tuesday, March 10, 2009 at eight o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects hereinafter set forth. The voting on Article 1 will be by official ballot at the Town Hall and the polls shall open for balloting at eight o'clock in the forenoon and shall not close before seven o'clock in the evening. The following articles (Articles 2-33) in the warrant will be acted upon on Thursday, March 12, 2009 at six thirty o'clock in the evening at the Josiah Bartlett Elementary School in Bartlett Village.

ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,833,130.00 to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70,000.00 for the purchase of a loader for the Highway Department and to authorize the issuance of not more than \$70,000.00 of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (NH RSA 33) and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon. Selectmen favor. (2/3 ballot vote required)

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50,000.00 for a used highway grader. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$145,000.00 for town road improvements. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$68,500.00 for the purchase of an ambulance for the Bartlett Jackson Ambulance Service (this amount represents Bartlett's 50% share of the cost of the ambulance) and to authorize the issuance of not more than \$68,500.00 of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (NH RSA 33) and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon. Chandler/Garland favor/Tanguay abstains. (2/3 ballot vote required)

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,200.00 for the completion of the installation of the generator at the Josiah Bartlett School. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,035.00 for the purchase of a new phone system at the Glen Fire Station. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,800.00 for two doors on the highway garage, an engineering study for an addition to the highway garage, retaining wall blocks for the loader ramp, and a laptop computer for the highway department. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 for building repairs and driveway maintenance at the Glen and Bartlett Village Fire Stations. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of

\$4,900.00 to complete the purchase of the new wing, plow, blades and hookup for the new highway truck purchased last year. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for testing at the former landfill property in order to meet State requirements. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 as Bartlett's share of a purchase of a backhoe for the Transfer Station. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,300.00 as Bartlett's 50% share to install a radio monitoring system at the repeater site on Tyrol (in Jackson) used by emergency personnel and possible enhancements for supplying power. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,800.00 for Bartlett's 50% share (with the Town of Jackson) of the replacement/upgrades of the dispatch radio system at Carroll County Sheriff's Office. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125,000.00 for Capital Reserve to offset large fire department purchases. Agreeable to a petition signed by Paul Caplan and others. Selectmen oppose.

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$42,333.00 for a Fire Chief's Response vehicle. Agreeable to a petition signed by Joseph Orsino and others. Tanguay favors/Chandler & Garland oppose.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,970.00 to upgrade the current 2000 Ford F150 to have the equivalent equipment of the current 1953 Dodge (DRED owned) Vehicle. Agreeable to a petition signed by Peter Villaume and others. Tanguay favors/Chandler & Garland oppose.

ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$19,000 to repair the fire stations and driveway, to address rotting issues, driveway issues, and painting of interior walls. Agreeable to a petition signed by Paul Caplan and others. Selectmen oppose.

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,800.00 for the replacement/upgrades of dispatch radio system at Carroll County Sheriff's Office (shared costs). Agreeable to a petition signed by Ernest Hiscox and others. Selectmen oppose.

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 to install a radio monitoring system at the radio repeater site for dispatch to oversee proper tone and radio communications with Bartlett Fire and Bartlett-Jackson Ambulance. Agreeable to a petition signed by Laura Villaume and others. Selectmen oppose.

ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Eastern Slope Airport authority for its use in operating the Eastern Slope Regional Airport in 2009. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to change the purpose of the Bartlett Library Capital Reserve Fund that was established in 2005 under the provisions of NH RSA 35:1 for the purpose of acquisition of land and costs associated with planning and construction of a new Bartlett Public Library to the Bartlett Library Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of acquisition of land and costs associated with the construction

of a new Bartlett Public Library (the word "planning" is being removed). This article is supported by the Bartlett Public Library Trustees. Selectmen favor. (2/3 Majority vote required)

ARTICLE 24. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of NH RSA 41:14a to allow the Board of Selectmen to acquire or sell land, buildings or both; however they shall first submit any such proposed acquisition or sale to the planning board and conservation commission for review and recommendation by those bodies. This article will remain in effect until rescinded by majority vote.

ARTICLE 25. To see if the Town will vote to appoint the Selectmen as agents to expend from the Bartlett Public Library Capital Reserve fund. This article is supported by the Bartlett Public Library Trustees. Selectmen favor. (Majority vote required)

ARTICLE 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,769.00 to support Bartlett home delivered meals (Meals on Wheels), congregate meals, transportation, and program services provided by the Gibson Center for Senior Services, Inc. Agreeable to a petition signed by Robert A. King and others. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,582.00 to assist The Mental Health Center. Agreeable to a petition signed by Cornelia Kilgour and others. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,435.00 for the support of the White Mt. Community Health Center to help meet the healthcare needs of the uninsured and underinsured residents of Bartlett. Agreeable to petition signed by Drew Smith and others. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for support of the Tri-County Community Action Program for the purpose of continuing services of the Fuel Assistance Program for the residents of Bartlett. Agreeable to a petition signed by Steven Nealley and others. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,800.00 for the Early Support and Services Program (birth to 3 yrs.) of Children Unlimited, Inc. Agreeable to a petition signed by Alissa Whittle and others. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,348.00 to help defray the costs of Service Delivery of the Mt. Washington Valley Chapter of the American Red Cross. Agreeable to a petition signed by Peter Villaume and others. Chandler opposes - not a proper use of town funds for national organizations/Garland and Tanguay favor.

ARTICLE 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,433.00 in support of Starting Point providing crisis services to the victims of domestic and sexual violence and their children. Agreeable to a petition signed by Suzette Indelicato and others. Selectmen favor.

ARTICLE 33. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

Once again we start our report with great appreciation to all of our town employees and volunteers who contribute so much every year in making Bartlett such a great community. On behalf of the Selectmen and all of Bartlett's citizens we give you a big THANK YOU!

We don't think that anyone that was in town last winter needs to be told that it was quite a season. Despite adding money to the budget at Town Meeting, we were still forced to overspend the bottom line by some \$38,517. With fuel prices skyrocketing, roofs to shovel, snow and ice problems on the road, it all added up to an expensive year. Fortunately, our revenues came in \$42,640 over what we had budgeted which offset the overexpenditure. Hopefully this year will be a little more manageable.

The Selectmen have prepared this year's budget and warrant articles with an extra special eye to trying to hold the line on tax increases. Our proposed budget is less than 2% higher than last year and is a little less than we actually spent last year. With the economy in such a state of flux, we need to be extra prudent in our spending this year. We need to be ever mindful of people's ability to pay their taxes and keep their homes.

Warrant articles this year include \$70,000 to pay for a new loader. Last year our old loader experienced mechanical problems which would have cost \$33,000 to repair. Given the age of the loader (1996), the Selectmen didn't feel it was a wise use of taxpayer money to repair it. We struck a deal whereby we "leased" a new loader with the agreement that we would not pay any lease fees until Town Meeting. If the town does not vote to purchase the loader, we will owe the lease amount. If the town does vote to purchase it, we pay nothing in lease fees. The \$70,000 price includes a credit of \$9,000 for our old loader in as is condition.

We are asking for \$5,200 to complete the generator project approved last year since the bids came in higher than we were originally quoted. We have been approved for a \$50,000 grant for the project. Other warrant articles include \$20,000 for repairs to the Glen and Bartlett fire stations, a phone system for the Glen Station in the amount of \$2,035 and \$4,500 for testing at the old landfill to meet State requirements. Also included is \$68,500 as Bartlett's share of the cost of a new ambulance for use by the Bartlett Jackson Ambulance Service and \$50,000 for the possible purchase of a used grader should one become available. The Selectmen are recommending bonding for three years the ambulance and loader purchase. This allows us to spread out the impact on the tax rate. We also have an article for some highway garage related items including \$2,000 for an engineering study looking toward the necessary expansion of the garage. The total effect of the Selectmen's warrant articles (excluding petitioned articles) is approximately \$40,000 less than the ones approved last year.

Recycling at the Transfer Station is mandatory in Bartlett and is critical to our waste disposal program as it can save us lots of money. Even when the revenues from recycling are down, we still save dumping and hauling costs. Please be sure to pick up the handout on Voting Day and Town Meeting and do your part to help save taxpayer dollars.

Legal fees are continuing to climb as developers and others who disagree with the town's regulations seek remedy through the courts. A breakdown of legal fees includes \$13,000 spent to date over acceptance of Pear Mountain Road, \$5,300 to date over Red River Property Development regarding road issues and \$5,000 to defend the town's assessments at the Board of Tax and Land Appeals with Bearfoot Creek Condominiums. Pear Mountain and Red River will continue in 2009 as will action taken against Lil Man Snowmachines/Ed Furlong over access and zoning violations. We are mindful of the legal costs but need to enforce our regulations with fairness to all and not give in when threatened by lawsuits.

Please be mindful of your E911 emergency number and post it in a visible area of your property. Be sure to remove any old numbers or identifying features that may cause confusion should emergency personnel need to find your property. The Bartlett Firefighters Association has number signs available for sale if you need them. If for some reason you choose not to display your assigned number, please remove any old numbers so as not to affect the property that has been assigned that number. If you don't know your E911 number, it can be found on your tax bill or by contacting the Selectmen's office.

It looks like the biggest road projects of the year will be done in conjunction with the Lower Bartlett Water Precinct on Glen Ledge Road and Linderhof. Last year, the Highway Department did work on Stanton Farm Road, Rolling Ridge, Abbott Brook Rd., Moat Mountain Circle, South Ledge Rd. and Birch Ledge Rd. Additionally, in conjunction with work the Lower Bartlett Water Precinct was doing, we rebuilt the majority of Ludwig Strasse in Linderhof.

The amount of new construction has declined dramatically since last year and along with the drop in property values in some areas of town, it means that we have to be extra careful with our spending, both at the town and school level. We will not have the increase in property value to offset expenditures as we have had in the past so it will be a struggle to maintain a low tax rate.

The town's website, www.bartlettnh.org, is up and running and you can get town information, Selectmen's Meeting minutes, some forms, and contact information from it. It is somewhat basic at this time, but we will be adding features and information, so stay tuned. Thanks to Craig Harrison of Harrison Creative for assisting us with and maintaining the website.

The Selectmen meet on most Friday mornings from 9am-11am but are able to meet at other times if the regular meeting time is a problem. Please call our office if you wish to meet with us.

PLANNING BOARD ANNUAL REPORT 2008

The pace of Planning Board activity picked up a bit in 2008 after a slow year in 2007. In 2008 the Board:

- approved 7 subdivisions totaling 23 lots or units. (One of these involved a lot previously approved for 12 units being subdivided into 6 separate lots, thus reducing the approved density.) Two subdivisions totaling 23 units are currently under review.
- approved 7 boundary line adjustments.
- approved 2 voluntary lot mergers.
- accepted the first application for commercial site plan review, involving a proposal to construct 108 rental suites in multiple buildings across from the Bear Peak Ski Area.

At the 2008 Town Meeting voters approved five amendments to the Zoning Ordinance. These involving a clarification of the designation and allowed uses of open space in residential developments, adjustment of language for granting variances by the Zoning Board of Adjustment to bring the ordinance into compliance with current state law, and three minor adjustments to provisions or definitions regarding shopping centers, shopping malls, and frontage. No amendments to the Zoning Ordinance are being proposed for the 2009 Town Meeting.

The Board also approved several amendments to the subdivision regulations. These were primarily technical in nature and were required to bring the regulations into compliance with recent legal opinions regarding the approval of roads in subdivisions.

The Board continues to consider ways to deal with on-going development issues. Among the issues the Board is likely to take under consideration in the coming year is a review of road standards to determine if a multi-tiered approach to road development within subdivisions is warranted. Currently Bartlett has a "one size fits all" standard for roads, whereas many other towns have a range of road standards depending on the expected level of use. Other issues the Board may be considering are protection of the Saco River aquifer and development on steep slopes.

The Board meets on the first Monday and third Tuesday of each month. Citizens with an interest in town planning and zoning are encouraged to join these sessions and discuss any matters of interest with the Board.

BARTLETT PUBLIC LIBRARY REPORT 2008

2008 was once again a very busy year. The circulation for books, periodicals, videos and sound recordings for the combined school and public library was 15,628. One thousand seventy nine materials were added to the collection. (723 were added to the Bartlett Library collection and 351 to the JBES collection. The librarian weeded 653 books from the total collection. The current materials collection is 22,810.

The librarian attended four Carroll County Library Cooperative meetings, two CHILIS (Children's Library Services) meetings, and two workshops this year.

Two areas in our library needed improvement: the audio-visual collection and the birth-through-preschool book collection. The library developed a corner for its youngest patrons by moving the small existing shelves and adding a rotating rack to house its growing collection. One shelf in this rack is devoted to books on parenting these young children. Stuffed toys and a rocking chair completed this area. We have already seen an increase in the number of books being circulated to these children. The audio-visual area outgrew its space and a rotating rack has been added for its growing collection. The library began purchasing books on CD's to meet the needs of our adult readers who are also busy travelling to work or classes and welcome being able to listen to a book. This area also showed an increase in its usage as its collection is improving. The library is using the Believe in Books grant it received to purchase some of these materials.

The other area with a significant increase in circulation is the adult fiction which increased by 11%. The library strives to keep its collection current by purchasing the new titles as they become available. The three BPL computers are nearly always in use when the library is open. Many part-time residents and vacationers in the valley drop in to use them. Our library also now offers wi-fi.

The summertime Tuesday morning story hours were well attended with an average of 40 children most weeks. The children especially like the special program featuring Mr. Phil, the Magician. His show was entertaining to all ages. The theme was G'Day for Reading with a focus on Australia and its wildlife.

The BPL Reading club which met on the second Tuesday of each month was also successful. A special thanks goes to the Library Friends who sponsored 6 New Hampshire Humanities programs on some of the Tuesdays as well as helping facilitate our regular meetings. The Friends also gave considerable help with the Annual Book Sale held this year on July 4th. The Friends now totals more than 100 members and are now making plans for 2009.

A new service now being offered to Bartlett Library patrons is the New Hampshire Downloadable Audio Books. This service, provided through the New Hampshire State Library, makes it possible to download audio books on your home computer. Once free software is loaded into your computer you can access the collection and download books. For details ask at the library.

The Library Site Committee is continuing to meet and work towards locating a site for a library. This year the Trustees chose not to ask for Special reserve Funds as the economy is so uncertain.

This year Mrs. Garland was chosen for Librarian of the Year through the New Hampshire Trustees Association. She is pleased for the recognition and wishes to thank the Friends, Trustees and Selectmen for their part in the festivities.

As of January 1st, 2009 Mrs. Garland retired from the Bartlett Public Library. She felt fifty-five years was long enough. She does plan to remain on the Library Site Committee, work to complete the Library Building Program space needs assessment, and to work as a volunteer organizing the Bartlett History Files.

The new librarian is Kathleen Van Deursen. She will be a great addition to Bartlett Public Library's staff. Plan to stop by and meet her. Remember this is your library and we are here to serve you.

THE BARTLETT HISTORY FUND

The Bartlett History Fund was established by the Bartlett Library Trustees following the Town's bicentennial in 1990. The purpose of the History Fund is to further the recording of the history of Bartlett and its vicinity. Profits from the sale of the two local histories, *Bartlett, New Hampshire, In the Valley of the Saco,* and *The Latchkey was Always Out* and the sale of bicentennial memorabilia were sent aside to establish the Bartlett History Fund.

The following guidelines for the Bartlett History fund have been established:

- All moneys received from future sales of the Bartlett History books, bicentennial memorabilia, and any other project undertaken by the Trustees for the History Fund will go into the History Fund.
- This money is put into a separate account under the name "Bartlett History Fund."
- This fund may not be used for the Library budget. The Library may, however, use this fund to purchase books and material relating to the history of the town. This material will then become a part of the Bartlett History Collection which is being maintained in a special fireproof file cabinet.
- The money in the History Fund may be expended for historical projects, pictures, postcards, and other types of historical materials.
- The Bartlett Library Trustees must approve the above expenditures. Donations of materials and monetary gifts may be made to the Fund.

Cash on hand as of December 31, 2007 was \$18,468.96.

Receipts from book and map sales and the interest accrued were \$768.61. The expenditures were \$250.00 for the restoration of the Champney painting. Cash on hand as of December 31, 2008 is \$18,987.57.

The Library has copies of its two histories : *Bartlett, New Hampshire; In the Valley of the Saco* and *The Latchstring Was Always Out: A History of Lodging, Hospitality and Tourism in Bartlett, New Hampshire,* by Aileen Carroll, and a reproduction of the 1896 Birdseye Map of Bartlett for sale in the library. These books are also for sale in the local bookstores.

BARTLETT POLICE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT 2008

As with most other departments, the Bartlett police have noticed the effects of the current economic slowdown. While people struggle with loss of jobs and the higher cost of living, we have seen an increase in petty theft, reports of gas driveoffs, and bad checks. During the summer we experienced a number of home burglaries which resulted in the arrest of three individuals. These arrests were due, in part, to direct citizen intervention. We are thankful for this help, which enabled us to make quick arrests, which undoubtedly prevented further crimes and loss of property.

As a department, we are working very hard to curtail expenses and keep within the limits of our budget, which has been reduced for this coming year. Our only major purchase for 2008 was two S-200 Stingers. These are non-lethal electronic immobilization devices capable of incapacitating an individual for a short period of time. The officers who carry the Stinger were fully-trained in their use, and were subjected to being "tased" as part of their training.

Officer Suzanne Scott attended the 145th session of the New Hampshire Police Academy and was presented with a certificate at graduation on March 28, 2008. Officer Scott is a much-welcome addition to our department, and we have received many positive comments from her interaction with the townsfolk of Bartlett.

Officer Garry Sherry has assumed prosecutorial duties for the department and has been attending on-going training at the academy.

As always, we are indebted to the Bartlett/Glen Fire Department, Bartlett/Jackson Ambulance and Bartlett town road crews who are always there when we need them. We would like to publicly thank the dedicated members of these departments for their help and continued support.

We are additionally supported by the Board of Selectmen and the town's administrative staff, and would like to take this opportunity to publicly acknowledge and thank them, also.

In 2008 we again worked with the Josiah Bartlett Elementary School on the Thursday afternoon ski program and the "Project Alert" substance abuse curriculum and thank the administration and staff at JBES for their continued support.

We look forward to serving the community of Bartlett in 2009.

Bartlett Jackson Ambulance Service is currently working with Kennett High School on an internship with its students. A cadet program is in the development stages where younger students can gain knowledge and assist EMT's with station chores and other aspects of emergency response work.

BARTLETT FIRE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT 2008

The year 2008 has been the busiest in the department's history reaching another record of responding to 380 calls. This year's number equates to an increase of 433% since 1989 and 236% since 2003. These continuing increases are definitely putting a strain on the Chief, membership, and apparatus. At our current rate of call volume growth our department will be responding to 760 calls by 2014.

We applied for and were approved for a FEMA Assistance to Fire Fighter's Grant in 2007 and completed the purchase portion of the grant this year with the purchase of 14 new Self Contained Breathing Apparatus or SCBA. This new equipment replaced units of which the majority were 20 years old. The new SCBA are significantly lighter, utilize modern technology, and have many features our old units did not. These new features and updates have increased the fire fighter safety of our members at a very small cost to the taxpayers. The Town's responsibility to this grant was \$3,600 which is less than the \$5,200 cost of just one of the new SCBA units.

In addition to our in-house twice monthly training, we have had a total of 5 members increase their knowledge and skills by becoming certified in formal training offered by the NH Fire Standards & Training Academy. Two members will be certified to the Fire Fighter I level and three are certified to the Fire Fighter II level. These classes were held at the Glen and Conway Fire Stations and ran two nights a week, every other Saturday, and one weekend at the NHFS&T live-burn facility in Concord. All 5 of these members spent a combined total of 710 hours in classes of which they received no compensation for their time, which in effect donated over \$7,500 in value learning to become better fire fighters to protect the lives and property of the inhabitants and visitors of Bartlett.

Our mutual aid association, Mt. Washington Valley Mutual Aid Association, continues to meet on a monthly basis and works to improve our mutual aid system. The member departments that consist of our association extend south to Madison, east to Fryeburg, ME, north to Jackson, Bartlett to the west and all the other departments in between. This gives all of us a large pool of resources to draw from if the need arises. All the member departments rely on each other to provide manpower and apparatus during our larger incidents or during times of limited available personnel.

If you haven't already, please post your 911 street address on your property. These numbers are extremely important and help reduce response time when we are responding to emergencies in Bartlett. Place your 911 street address number where it can be readily seen and make sure it is reflective so it can be seen at night. If your building is not close to the road place your sign out at the end of your driveway. Also remove any "old" numbers as these add to the con-

fusion when responding to emergencies. If you need more information please contact the Town Hall as they are the contact agency for 911 information.

In closing I want to thank the Officers and members of the Bartlett Fire Department for their dedication, commitment, and support of this increasingly very busy department. In addition, the other agencies and departments of the Town of Bartlett who we work closely with, including the Bartlett/Jackson Ambulance, Bartlett PD, Bartlett Highway Dept, and Board of Selectmen and administrative staff. Last but definitely not the least, the taxpayers and voters who not only support us at the Town meeting but the other 364 days a year as well.

If you find yourself in need of our assistance, please do not hesitate to call 911. This is what we do 24/7/365.

Moderator Rob Clark swore in the election officials and read the following to open the meeting at 8:00AM on Tuesday, March 11, 2008 at the Bartlett Town Hall, 56 Town Hall Road, Bartlett, New Hampshire:

To the inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett, New Hampshire in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in the Town affairs: You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall in said Bartlett on Tuesday, March 11, 2008 at eight o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects hereinafter set forth. The voting on Article 1- 6 will be by official ballot at the Town Hall and the polls shall open for balloting at eight o'clock in the forenoon and shall not close before seven o'clock in the evening. The following articles (Articles 7 - 30) in the warrant will be acted upon on Thursday, March 13, 2008 at six thirty o'clock in the evening at the Josiah Bartlett Elementary School in Bartlett Village. We hereby certify that we posted a like copy of said Town Warrant and Budget on February 25, 2008 at the Post Offices in Glen and Bartlett, at the Town Hall in Intervale (Bartlett) and the Josiah Bartlett Elementary School (the places of meeting), all being public places within the said Town of Bartlett, New Hampshire. A true copy of warrant attest: Board of Selectmen - Gene G. Chandler, Douglas A. Garland and Jon Tanguay.

<u>ARTICLE 1.</u> To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 2. Are you in favor of the adoption of AMENDMENT No. 1 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town of Bartlett Zoning Ordinance as follows: to replace the current Article X (Open Space) in its entirety with a new Article X which provides greater clarity as to how Open Space should be designated and what uses are allowed within it.

There were write-ins for the various positions and a copy of those are available at the Town Clerk's Office. Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting until Thursday, March 13, 2008 at 6:30PM at the Josiah Bartlett Elementary School. Vote was taken - adjourned at 7:01PM.

Moderator Clark opened the deliberative portion of Town Meeting held on Thursday, March 13, 2008 at 6:30PM at the Josiah Bartlett Elementary School. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Ravyn Deshais, Brook Deshais, Gigi Miller, and Mary Jane Roberts. Clark outlined where the various documents and information was available in the room, as well as the location of the automatic defibrillator, where the emergency exits were and read the results of Articles 1-6 as outlined above. Clark then proceeded with the rest of the warrant as follows:

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,733,125.00 to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Selectmen favor. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Selectman Gene Chandler spoke to the article explaining that as indicated in the newspaper and posted throughout town, that due to the severe winter we would be asking to amend the budget by adding \$60,000. Chandler explained that this figure included \$13,000 for sand, \$14,000 for salt, \$19,000 for rentals, \$6,000 for diesel fuel, and \$8,000 for roof shoveling and related maintenance. Motion was made by Chandler, seconded by Selectman Doug Garland to add \$60,000 to the budget. No discussion. Vote was taken on the amendment = PASSED +\$60,000 (\$1,793,125). Chandler went on to review the budget line by line. Marcia Burchstead, Library Trustee, explained that the library had submitted a budget that included money for paying for more hours to the librarian and assistant librarian and to bring the salaries more in line with the current going wage for librarians and the Selectmen had reduced their budget. Burchstead went on to explain how many hours the librarian works and has not been paid for and feels she should be paid for those hours. She also noted that Town Librarian Jean Garland has worked for the town for 55 years. Burchstead then made a motion, seconded by Linda Hastings, to add \$6,256 back into Acct. No. 4550 Library. Linda Hastings then spoke in support of the article and explained the Friends of the Bartlett Public Library. No further discussion. Vote was taken on the amendment = PASSED + \$6.256 (\$1.799.381). Norman Head then asked what happened to the money appropriated last year for maintenance of the hotel site park and how will it be maintained this year. Chandler explained where to find the information and that he hoped that volunteers would be willing to help as much as possible with that so we wouldn't have to spend the money, but there was money in the budget (Acct. No. 4613) for that. No further discussion. Vote was taken on the article as amended (\$1,799,381) = **PASSED** (\$1,799,381).

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$125,000.00 for town road improvements. Selectmen favor. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Selectman Gene Chandler spoke to the article. There was no discussion on the article. Vote was taken = **PASSED (\$125,000)**.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 to replace the shingles on a portion of the roof at Town Hall. Selectmen favor. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Selectman Gene Chandler spoke to the article. There was no discussion on the article. Vote was taken = **PASSED** (\$12,000).

<u>ARTICLE 10.</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$102,000.00 for a new four wheel drive highway truck with plow and wing. Selectmen favor. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read.

Selectman Gene Chandler spoke to the article stating that due to an oversight, we will need to raise the amount on this article to \$120,000 (an addition of \$18,000) in order to be able to put the hydraulics on the truck necessary to operate the plow and wing. Chandler made a motion to add \$18,000, which was seconded by Selectman Doug Garland. Lydia Lansing asked whether truck replacement is based on mileage or years and whether we were trading a truck or selling one. Chandler stated it was a 1996 truck we were replacing but it is also mileage and wear that determines replacement and we would either trade in or sell the 1996 truck. Gordon Daly suggested the town consider either refurbishing trucks or getting a refurbished truck. Frank Graham stated that in light of the increase in the budget that perhaps we should work with what we've got and wait another year to buy a truck. No further discussion. Vote was taken on the amendment of adding \$18,000 = PASSED (\$120,000). Discussion continued on the amended amount of the article of \$120,000. Rob Upton asked if we should consider long or short term borrowing so cost is extended out more. Chandler stated that that is sometimes considered but that we will most likely be purchasing a grader next year and will probably consider financing that and we don't want to have too many outstanding debts. Lansing asked if we have an inventory of vehicles and a replacement plan. Chandler reviewed the inventory. No further discussion. Vote was taken on the article as amended = **PASSED** (\$120,000).

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for a new plow for use by the Highway Department. Selectmen favor. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Selectman Gene Chandler spoke to the article explaining that this was going on the 2000 two wheel drive highway truck. There was no discussion on the article. Vote was taken = **PASSED** (\$6,000).

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,100.00 for a new collector street sweeper attachment for the backhoe. Selectmen favor. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Selectman Gene Chandler spoke to the article explaining that this would pay for itself in a few years as we would not have to pay to have the streets swept and we would recycle the sand since it was being collected. Chandler also indicated that there was a water dust thing to minimize the dust factor. There was no discussion on the article. Vote was taken = **PASSED (\$10,100**).

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 for the town's share of the purchase and installation of an emergency generator to be placed at the Josiah Bartlett School. Selectmen favor. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Selectman Gene Chandler spoke to the article explaining that the town has received a \$50,000 grant and the \$12,000 was for installation and other materials to get it up and running and the obvious purpose is to provide a fully operational emergency shelter. Roger Labbe asked if the school was paying a portion of this. Chandler stated no. Labbe asked why not. Chandler said they said no. There was no further discussion. Vote was taken = **PASSED (\$12,000**).

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$78,820.00 for the purchase of 14 new air packs (SCBA's) for the Fire Department; and to authorize the receipt and expenditure of federal and/or state grants in the amount of \$74,879.00, with the balance of \$3,941.00 to be

raised by general taxation. Selectmen favor. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Selectman Gene Chandler spoke to the article. Fire Chief Pat Roberts explained that some of the current air packs are 20 years old and technology has advanced so that these new air packs will be much better. Bill Fabrizio questioned the wording of the article and it was explained it was worded correctly. No further discussion.Vote was taken = **PASSED (\$78,820)**.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,350.00 for a 40 yd. compactor container (costing \$7,300) and a new 40 yd. open top container (costing \$4,050) for the Transfer Station to replace containers that are inoperable. Selectmen favor. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Selectman Gene Chandler spoke to the article explaining that unfortunately we have already purchased the compactor container as it broke in January and was beyond repair. There was no discussion on the article. Vote was taken = **PASSED** (\$11,350).

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Eastern Slope Airport authority for its use in operating the Eastern Slope Regional Airport in 2008. Selectmen favor. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. No one spoke to the article and there was no discussion. Vote was taken = **PASSED** (\$500).

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to deed 2+/- acres of land currently held jointly by the Towns of Bartlett and Jackson identified as a segment of the Bartlett Jackson Transfer Station under NH RSA 31:3. Such land to be utilized by the Town of Jackson for a garage, sand and salt shed. The Town of Jackson would pay for any modifications needed for the siting, access road and peripheral costs. A sum of \$50,000.00 would be given to the Town of Bartlett as compensation for the acquisition for this land. Article placed on the warrant at the request of the Jackson Selectmen. Selectmen oppose at this time. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Voter asked why the Selectmen were opposed. Chandler stated that he wanted to make clear that it was not an adversarial thing, that the proposal came late in the budgeting process and not enough information or detail was presented and questions are/were unanswered about certain things, but the Bartlett Selectmen agreed to put it on the warrant if the Jackson Selectmen requested it (which they did). Rob Upton asked if would be appropriate to amend the wording of the article to give the Selectmen the option to negotiate on behalf of the town. Chandler stated we really don't need that as they can negotiate with Jackson now, but that the Selectmen feel strongly that any decision on use of town land should be made by the taxpayers preferrably at Town Meeting or a Special Meeting if necessary. Bill Fabrizio agrees that this is premature and needs more information and planning as we are working on a master plan for the Transfer Station. Motion was made by Frank Graham, seconded by Bill Fabrizio to table the article until a future time. Gordon Daly then tried to discuss the article further but the table motion is non-debatable and had to be voted on unless the parties withdrew their motion. Graham and Fabrizio both withdrew their motion. Daly then stated that he felt the Selectmen needed more information to present to the taxpayers, perhaps they needed to form a committee to look at it, but that he felt it was worth looking at. No further discussion. Vote was taken = FAILED.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to help support The Bartlett Historical Society and defray the costs of operation for the same. Agreeable to a petition signed by Norman J. Head and others. Selectmen oppose. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Norman Head spoke to the article explaining the status of the Society and why they needed the funds. Lydia Lansing spoke in support of the article, feeling it should be supported by the town and that we are making history tonight. Selectman Doug Garland stated after hearing Head's explanation of the need, he was changing his position to favoring the article for one year but is hoping this is just seed money and would not become an annual request for funds from the town. Head stated he could not guarantee that for sure but hopes it is not an annual thing. A voter asked if they would consider joining with the Jackson Historical Society. Head stated no, they have about \$600,000 in their account and Bartlett has about \$900 and there probably isn't any interest there. Vote was taken = **PASSED** (**\$2,000**).

ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to help fund Project Prom, a start-up safety initiative, for our high school seniors. Agreeable to a petition signed by Kyler Drew and others. Chandler/Garland oppose/Tanguay favors. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Moderator Clark stepped down from the podium and appointed Selectman Gene Chandler as Moderator pro tem. Clark then spoke to the article outlining the purpose of the program and fundraising. Selectman Doug Garland stated that this article should be on the school warrant and not the town but really felt that private organizations can come forward and cover the \$500. Selectman Jon Tanguay stated that parliamentary procedure is not the right reason to fail this article. Lydia Lansing stated she felt it should be on the school warrant. Bill Fabrizio asked if all prom participants are taking part. Clark stated that all were invited. Frank Graham stated that in 37 years in Boston on the police dept. that prom night was the worst night and something should be done to keep it safe. Amy Patch stated that what is one kid's life worth but agreed it probably should be on the school warrant and not the town. Moderator pro tem Chandler noted that true to town meeting form, the most discussion is generated on the article with the least amount of money. No further discussion. Vote was taken = **PASSED** (\$500).

Moderator Clark returned to the podium and continued with the warrant as follows:

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$35,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund established in 2005 under the provisions of NH RSA 35:1 for the purpose of acquisition of land and costs associated with planning, and construction of a new Bartlett Public Library. Agreeable to a petition signed by Marcia Burchstead and others. Chandler opposes/Tanguay favors \$10,000/Garland abstains. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Library Trustee Marcia Burchstead spoke to the article and progress being made. Frank Graham spoke in support of the article especially on the needs outlined in the library report in the town report. No further discussion. Vote was taken - UNANIMOUS VOTE (no dissenting votes) = **PASSED (\$35,000**).

Motion was made and seconded to take Articles 21-27 as a block. Vote was

taken - **PASSED** to take Articles 21-27 as a block. Clark asked for any discussion on the articles. There was none. Vote was taken - **ARTICLES 21-27 PASSED as follows:**

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,769.00 to support Bartlett home delivered meals (Meals on Wheels), congregate meals, transportation, and program services provided by the Gibson Center for Senior Services, Inc. Agreeable to a petition signed by Ernest Menard and others. Selectmen favor. **PASSED** (\$4,769).

<u>ARTICLE 22.</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,582.00 to assist The Mental Health Center. Agreeable to a petition signed by Maureen C. Hanlon and others. Selectmen favor. **PASSED** (\$3,582).

ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,896.00 for the support of the White Mt. Community Health Center to help meet the healthcare needs of the uninsured and underinsured residents of Bartlett. Agreeable to petition signed by Drew Smith and others. Selectmen favor. **PASSED** (\$6,896).

ARTICLE 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for support of the Tri-County Community Action Program for the purpose of continuing services of the Fuel Assistance Program for the residents of Bartlett. Agreeable to a petition signed by Ellen Hayes and others. Selectmen favor. **PASSED** (\$4,000).

ARTICLE 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,800.00 for the Early Support and Services Program (birth to 3 yrs.) of Children Unlimited, Inc. Agreeable to a petition signed by Suzette Indelicato and others. Selectmen favor. **PASSED (\$3,800)**.

ARTICLE 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,345.00 to help defray the costs of Service Delivery of the Mt. Washington Valley Chapter of the American Red Cross. Agreeable to a petition signed by Thomas Enos and others. Chandler opposes - not a proper use of town funds for national organizations/Garland and Tanguay favor. **PASSED** (\$1,345).

ARTICLE 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,110.00 in support of Starting Point providing crisis services to the victims of domestic and sexual violence and their children. Agreeable to a petition signed by Suzette Indelicato and others. Selectmen favor. **PASSED (\$1,110)**.

ARTICLE 28. To see if the Town will vote on acceptance of the deed for six tenths of a mile of Parker Ridge Road. The road begins at an intersecting point at Stanton Farm Road in Stilling's Grant and runs six tenths of a mile to a cul-desac. Final acceptance is subject to verification by the Selectmen that all construction and surfacing has been completed to current town standards. Agreeable to a petition signed by Anthony Rocco and others. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. No one spoke to the article and there was no discussion. Vote was taken **= PASSED**.

<u>ARTICLE 29.</u> To see if the Town will vote to accept the deed for the road running from the intersection of Birch Ledge Road to Glen Ledge Road, together with the spur road running southwesterly to a hammerhead off that road. Final acceptance subject to verification by the Selectmen that all construction and surfacing has been completed to current town standards. Agreeable to a petition signed by Mary Hamblett and others. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. No one spoke to the article and there was no discussion. Vote was taken = **PASSED**.

ARTICLE 30. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Gail Paine asked if there was a liaison for the Transfer Station between the two boards. Chandler stated no, they act as a board. Paine would like the town to take the lead and do something with plastics and glass.

Bill Fabrizio made a motion, seconded by Gordon Daly to reconsider Article 8. Vote was taken to reconsider Article 8 = PASSED. Fabrizio stated that the roads are really taking a beating this year and perhaps we need to put some more money in there for repairs but didn't know what would be an appropriate amount, perhaps the Selectmen or Road Agent Travis Chick would know. Daly asked that the town explore avenues available to us for funding for the roads. Chandler stated the only funding available is taxpayers unless there is declared a state of emergency in which FEMA would help out like they did last year. Motion was made and seconded to add \$50,000 to Article 8. Road Agent Chick spoke to the article stating that while he hated to turn down money, there was only so much work that could be done by them in a season and the \$125,000 would be OK. Jean Garland questioned whether it was appropriate to bring this article up for reconsideration at this point. Clark ruled that it was since it was not bringing up anything new, just reconsideration of a previous article. Burr Phillips asked whether we could add \$5,000 to the article to include a master plan for roads to be done through a program at the University of NH. Clark ruled that would not be appropriate as it would change the intent of the article. Vote was taken on the amendment to Article 8 to add \$50,000 = FAILED.

Frank Graham stated that Bartlett School Principal Joe Voci's son was in a bad skiing accident and had some serious injuries and asked for a moment of silence for prayers for his son's recovery. Clark asked for a moment of silence.

Selectman Jon Tanguay thanked all of the town employees and people who helped with getting town meeting together and running smoothly like the Supervisors of the Checklist, Town Clerk, Moderator, and Town Staff.

Henry Villaume reminded everyone that the Annual School Meeting was next Tuesday, March 18, 2008 and the budget is up 20% this year, added to the 20% last year so we are looking at some major increases in a very short period of time. Please come and participate in the meeting.

Motion was made by Bill Fabrizio and seconded by Bert George to adjourn. Vote was taken - Meeting adjourned at 8:30PM.

TOWN OF BARTLETT REGULATIONS

The Town of Bartlett Officials closely monitor compliance with the following ordinances, regulations, and by-laws. This list is provided to make people aware that these regulations exist and a summary of each regulation appears here. Complete descriptions may be obtained from the Selectmen's Office and any questions should be directed to that office.

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WINTER PARKING ORDINANCE: prohibits parking on town streets between Nov. 1 and May 1 (24 hours a day). Violation = fine of up to \$50.00 plus towing charges.

SNOW PLOWING REGULATION: prohibits the plowing of snow into or across any town road.

EXCAVATION PERMIT REGULATION: requires permits to be acquired 24 hours prior to excavation in a town road. Violation - fine of \$100.00.

ILLEGAL DUMPING ORDINANCE: prohibits dumping and littering at other than in authorized areas at the Transfer Station. Violation - fine of \$100.00.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE ORDINANCE: prohibits drinking of alcoholic beverages in public places. Violation - fine of \$25.00.

TEST PIT INSPECTION ORDINANCE: requires inspection of pits prior to application for State septic design approval. Fee of \$25.00 per pit dug.

SEPTIC SYSTEM DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION ORDINANCE: governs the design and construction of septic systems and requires all septic system designs, prior to submission to the State, to be reviewed by the Selectmen's Office. Fee of \$50.00 per design.

BUILDING PERMIT ORDINANCE: required for construction of signs, structures, changes of use, etc. which would affect property value and/or to which zoning requirements apply. Violation = fine up to \$275/day. The following is the new fee schedule effective as of 2003:

HOUSE/CONDO UNIT	\$ 25.00
GARAGE	15.00
DECK, ADDITIONS, SHEDS, & SIGNS	10.00
CHANGE OF USE	20.00
MAJOR COMMERCIAL	100.00
MINOR COMMERCIAL	50.00
RENEWALS, MISC. & OTHERS	10.00

PERMIT TO OCCUPY ORDINANCE: required prior to occupancy of any construction that is intended for habitation or for which a septic system is required. Violation = fine of up to \$100 and/or \$10/day each day of violation. ZONING ORDINANCE: addresses the regulation of such items as signs, setbacks, density, green areas, frontage, permitted uses, telecommunications, ridgeline development, etc.

SITE PLAN REVIEW REGULATIONS: governs the review and approval /disapproval by the Planning Board of site plans for the development, change, or expansion of use of non-residential tracts where the total square footage of the footprint of the building(s) is greater than 5,000 square feet.

FLOODPLAIN ORDINANCE: governs activity in the floodplain.

GRAVEL PIT ORDINANCE: governs excavation of gravel pits.

DOG LEASH BY-LAW: requires that all dogs be restrained by leash or under direct control of owner. Violation - fine of up to \$100 plus board reimbursement.

SPECIAL EVENTS ORDINANCE: regulates the conduct of special events. Violation = fine of up to \$300.

ELECTIONEERING ORDINANCE: eliminates all electioneering or signature gathering on Town or School owned property at any meetings or elections held within the Town of Bartlett.
