THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Chatham in the County of Carroll in said state qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chatham on Tuesday the 13th day of March next at 9 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the ensuing year.
 - (a) To choose a Moderator.
 - (b) To choose a Town Clerk.
 - (c) To choose a Road Agent.
 - (d) To choose a Selectman for three years.
 - (e) To choose a Town Treasurer.
 - (f) To choose a Tax Collector.
 - (g) To choose a Constable.
 - (h) To choose two Auditors.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.
- 3. To see if the town will accept state aid for high-way maintenance and construction.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise \$567 for state road construction.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise \$525 for state aid maintenance.

- 6. To see what the town will vote to do if anything about winter ploughing of roads.
- 7. To see if the town will raise a sum for white pine blister.
- 8. To see of the town will co-operate with the town of Stow by raising a sum of money or offer other inducments to a doctor to settle in the community.
- 9. To transact whatever other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The balance reported as of June 30, 1926 was \$552.13. This included \$414.00 due but not actually paid to the school treasurer at that date. In order that our accounts shall conform to the regulations of the state tax commission, we are reporting a balance of \$138.13 instead of \$552.13 and have added \$414 00 to the receipts of the year beginning July 1, 1926. This explains the discrepancy.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

TO THE SCHOOL BOARD AND CITIZENS:

Your estimate of revenue for the current year is \$4.913.19, while the estimated expenditures amount to \$5,146.80 making a deficit of \$233.00. However, in the year 1925-26 a credit accrued to the district for approved expenditures in excess of state aid furnished and this amount of \$290.22 will enable you to close the year with no or a small deficit. The cost of transportation having increased during the school year may create a small deficit.

Last year's report stated that the town owed the state \$571.76. The state, of course, deducted this from last year's equalization payment. This so reduced the state aid received last year that you had a substantial deficit which should have been made up by a deficiency appropriation. This, however, was not done and the board borrowed from the selectmen \$361.40 of this year's money. We did not know at that time that we should receive the additional allotment of \$290.22. If at the time of the district meeting it should be apparent that any deficit is likely this year the amount should be appropriated as a deficiency appropriation. At this date we do not know the amount of state and to be paid next year, but at the time of the district meeting this information will be at hand.

If this sum added to the \$5 tax is less than the board's estimate for operation, the difference should be voted in addition to the \$5 tax.

Your schools are in excellent condition with able and progressive teachers in all of them. The standard of achievement is high and the general health of the pupils much above the average. There are some, however, who should receive dental treatment.
