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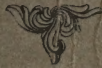

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan, in the County of Coos, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Androscoggin Hall at Milan, in said town, on Tuesday, 11th day of March, 1924, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers.
2. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of poor, and other necessary charges arising within the town.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
4. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for breaking roads, winter of 1924 and 1925.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Trunk Line Construction.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Trunk Line Maintenance.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid Maintenance.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be applied on the river road, on the east side of the Androscoggin River, from Berlin line to Dummer line.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of books and supplies for the Public Library.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day, and appropriate the same to the Grand Army.
11. To choose by ballot one Trustee of Cemetery Trust Fund for three years.
12. To choose one Trustee of Public Library for three years.
13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair cemetery fences.
14. To see if the town will appoint a committee to investigate the feasibility of establishing a town forest and make recommendations at the regular town meeting in March, 1925.
15. To see if the town will vote to establish a police court at Milan.

School Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of Milan:

I present herewith for your consideration, my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools, together with table of school statistics for last complete school year, ending July 1, 1923.

During the year last completed, a total of 156 visits were made to the different schools by your superintendent; an average of about 22 visits per school for the year of 36 weeks.

The work for the various grades in the different schools was assigned at the beginning of the year, and at subsequent visits various classes were examined in the portion of the work covered. Assistance was given in various schools in making out a daily schedule for classes at the commencement of the year.

Standard tests have been given at intervals during the year, and on the whole the pupils have done very well in these tests. In cases where the pupils seemed lacking in the knowledge necessary for these tests, an effort was made to remedy the defects. At the State Tests given in November to all pupils of the eighth grade, the average rank in spelling was 80, and in arithmetic, 59. The average for the State in these same tests, were 67 in spelling, and 49 in arithmetic. This would seem to indicate that the Milan Eighth Grade pupils were somewhat more proficient in spelling and arithmetic than the average eighth-grade pupils of the State.

New language books, the Palmer copy books and some new supplementary readers have been introduced.

Quite extensive alterations were made during the summer on the Hodgdon Hill school building. This building is now greatly improved in its lighting and sanitary arrangements. The Hamlin school has had a new hardwood floor and new slate blackboards, while the Milan Hill school building has been repainted outside and inside. The school buildings of the town now seem to be in good condition, as regards lighting and ventilation, and are in fact in very good general condition. No further extensive alterations should be needed for some time, although new seats in some rooms may soon be necessary.

At the close of the year in June, 12 pupils in different schools were graduated from the eighth grade. Public exercises were held at the Hall for the eighth grade at Milan Village.

During the summer vacation an eye clinic was held at the superintendent's house at Milan Village; thus giving all pupils who might be suspected of having any defects in eyesight, an

opportunity for free examination by a specialist. Considerable benefit was derived from this clinic.

In closing, I wish to thank the School Board for assistance and support given me during the year.
