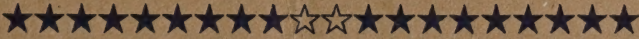

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF NORTHUMBERLAND
QUALIFIED TO VOTE IN TOWN AFFAIRS:

You are hereby notified to meet at Forbush Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, to act upon the subjects hereinafter mentioned: The polls will be open at said place and date from 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon for the reception of your ballots upon the election of Town Officers under the Australian Ballot Law; furthermore, you are hereby warned that on said date and place at 11:00 o'clock in the forenoon, the matters of appropriations and such other business properly coming before said meeting will be taken up for your consideration and action.

1. To choose by ballot a Town Clerk for the ensuing year by major vote, or by a plurality vote if such is the will of this meeting.

2. To choose by ballot one Selectman for the ensuing three years by major vote or by a plurality vote if such is the will of this meeting.

3. To choose by ballot one or more Road Agents and other necessary Town Officers, Agents and Auditors for the ensuing year by major vote or by a plurality vote if such is the will of this meeting.

4. To choose by ballot one Library Trustee for the ensuing three years by major vote or by a plurality vote if such is the will of this meeting.

5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of town poor, and to pay Town Officers.

6. To raise such sums of money as may be found necessary for the support of the Police Department.

7. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for building and repairing highways and bridges, including money for trunk line repairs, trunk line maintenance, state aid and maintenance, and state aid construction.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for sewer maintenance and sewer construction.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for building and repairing sidewalks.

10. To see what sum of money the town will raise for lighting streets for the ensuing year.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial Day.
12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the Public Library.
13. To see if the voters will sanction a license to one of the drug stores of Groveton to dispense spirituous liquors for medicinal purposes. It being necessary and in some cases indispensable for the treatment of certain diseases.
14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs and improvements on public playgrounds and to elect a committee to expend the same.
15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to apply on the Northumberland Bridge note.
16. To see what action, if any, the town will take with regard to the employment of a district nurse and to raise money for the same.
17. To see if the town will vote to exempt the churches from water tax. This representing the property of each church where, heretofore, water rent has been paid.
18. To see what action, if any, the town will take with regard to the extension of the permanent street from the Boston & Maine Railroad crossing to the town bridge, and from Main Street down Mechanic Street to the Groveton Paper Company Store.
19. To see what action, if any, the town will take with regard to the appointing of a Building Inspector.
20. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before said meeting.

On the whole the work has gone very well the past year.

There is still much more in the line of corrective work to be done among school children. It is to be hoped that every parent will seriously consider the remedying of defects, especially the defective eyesight. No children who are unable to see the work on the blackboards from the seats assigned them are doing first class work or getting a square deal from the parents who are responsible for them.

The idea kept before the children daily is the preservation of health and the prevention of unnecessary sickness.

There have been in the past year several outbreaks of contagious diseases, but by a great effort on the part of the teachers and myself and with but a few exceptions the help of the parents, they have been quite quickly subdued, consequently much loss of schooling prevented and much suffering and expense spared.

The plan established two years ago for serving hot soups to the school team children is still carried out during the winter months with much success.

Last fall we were able to hold, with the help of state and county officers, two very successful clinics. At the baby clinic 48 babies were thoroughly examined and advice given. Twenty-six patients were examined at the tuberculosis clinic.

We expect to be able to have more clinics along these same lines as soon as the weather is warmer.

Many forms of the Public Health work receive less attention than they should because so much of my time is taken up with the bedside nursing which, of necessity, must come first, the other work fitting in as I can find the time to do it.

To all who help along this work by their encouragement, approval and cooperation I wish to offer my sincere thanks.

While the figures given above are for the year ending July 1, 1923, it may be well to add a few words regarding the work of the present year and the needs of the future.

In his report last year, Mr. Holman recommended the hiring of a special teacher to work with backward pupils in the elementary school. This recommendation is being carried out this year and the results seem to be very satisfactory. The chief aim in employing this teacher is to give extra help to those who especially need it and thus reduce the number of pupils who are obliged to repeat their grade. Each pupil who has to repeat a grade means an additional expense to the town of approximately \$65, besides the loss to the pupil himself and his parents.

In order to make the work of the special teacher most effective our first problem has been to find out just which pupils are most in need of special assistance. Accordingly

several Standard Tests have been used during the past half year. Standard tests are tests made out by experts which have been given to thousands of pupils in different parts of the country and the results recorded. By giving these tests we are able to get a very clear idea how our pupils compare with those in other towns and cities and how they compare with each other. One of the first results which we obtained was the fact that there is a tremendous difference between the achievement of pupils in the same grade. For example: we found a pupil whose achievement was represented by 59 reciting in the same classes with another whose achievement was represented by 150. To expect the same results from those two pupils is to expect the impossible.

Tests have been given in all grades and divisions arranged so that, as far as possible, those capable of working rapidly are put into divisions which are expected to do the maximum amount of work for that grade. The slower ones are also in divisions by themselves. By giving special help where it is needed, we are striving to get the pupils in this division to do enough work so that they will not have to repeat the grade. Of course there will be some who will fail, but we hope that this number will grow smaller each year. I have never seen a group of teachers who seemed more interested in their work and more anxious to succeed than Mrs. Merriam and her corps of teachers.

At the high school good work is also being done. Mr. Cook and his corps of teachers are also working faithfully and harmoniously. For best results in all schools we must have teachers who remain in the same position for some length of time. We have been hampered this year because of the fact that so many teachers have been new. It takes several weeks for pupils and teachers to become adjusted. If we could retain our teachers year after year we could expect better results. To do this we must pay higher salaries than we are now paying.

We are also hampered at the high school for lack of room. Every room is now filled to its capacity practically every period in the day and the Commercial, Manual Training and Domestic Science departments are badly crowded. A class of less than 20 will be graduated in June, while a class of approximately 50 pupils will be ready to enter the school next fall. We are likely to have entering classes of about the same size during the next five years. To take care of these pupils we must have more room at the high school.

The annual budget will be presented at the school meeting.
