



ARTICLES IN THE WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN
MEETING.

FIRST.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges, and make appropriations of the same.

SECOND.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for decorating the graves of soldiers.

THIRD.

To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of the law relating to state aid for highways, and raise money for the same.

FOURTH.

To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to purchase a piano for the town hall.

FIFTH.

To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to destroy the brown tail moth, and pass any vote relating thereto.

SIXTH.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray the expenses of the town.

SEVENTH.

To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid early in the year, and specify the same.

EIGHTH.

To choose Town Clerk, Treasurer, Selectmen, Auditors, and all other officers and agents for the year ensuing.

ARTICLES IN THE WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL SCHOOL
MEETING.

FIRST.

To choose a moderator for the ensuing year.

SECOND.

To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

THIRD.

To choose a treasurer for the ensuing.

FOURTH.

To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.

FIFTH.

To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise for the repair of school houses.

SIXTH.

To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise for the support of schools in addition to the amount required by law.

SEVENTH.

To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise for the purchase of text books and supplies.

EIGHTH.

To see if the district will vote to unite with one or more towns for the purpose of forming a supervisory district, and raise money for the same.

NINTH.

To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any matter embraced in this warrant.

STONE CRUSHER.

One hundred and ninety rods of road were built of crushed stone at a total cost of \$1,019 86, an average of \$5 36 per rod, 32 cents per foot. This average is about three-tenths of a cent less than it cost to build the gravel surface road from the Corner to Duncan Lake, and ought to establish the practicability and economy of building a portion of Macadam road each season.

THE TOWN HALL.

The bills for the repairs on the town hall aggregate \$976 61, but \$69 47 was received from the sale of lumber left over, leaving the actual cost of the repairs, \$907 14.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

Another successful school year has been completed, a record year, there having been thirty-six weeks taught in all districts except Ossipee Valley and Granite; and, owing to the early closing of the school last year, thirty-seven weeks were taught at Fogg's Ridge. There being only four pupils at Granite, the school was closed during the winter term, and the pupils transported to Fogg's Ridge, resulting in a saving of about six dollars per week.

Every school in the district, with the exception of two, have been visited twice each term by a member of the board. The discipline and advancement never has been better than during the past year, with a single exception. There was a lack of attendance in one school, caused almost wholly by the parents siding with the pupils against the teacher. Even in this school, where the attendance was regular, the improvement was marked; the school officials are firmly of the opinion that any lack of interest or non-attendance was more the fault of the parents than the teacher.

This brings up the question of parents visiting the schools, which has been so often recommended in these reports. It is a duty that parents owe, not only to themselves and their children, but also to the teacher and school officials, that they go to the school room and see for themselves the exact attitude of both teacher and pupil. No parent has any right to criticize the discipline of a school, or the ability of a teacher until this is done. It has been demonstrated year after year, that in those schools where parents evince sufficient interest in the welfare of their children to make a personal investigation, "to go and see for themselves", in those schools there is perfect harmony, and the greatest advancement.

The houses throughout the town are in good repair. It will require about the same amount to keep them in condition as has been raised during the past few years, \$150.

The district received \$595.85 as its apportionment of the

School fund. This is no guarantee this amount will be received this year. Assistance is given by the State to enable us to maintain better schools, not to reduce the assessment for school purposes. This makes it essential to continue the same liberal appropriations as in the past. Any reduction will certainly result in the loss of any aid from the State.


