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## **MINUTES OF THE 1963 TOWN MEETING**

At 7:30 P. M. the meeting was opened and the Warrant read by the Moderator. Balloting for Town Officers followed.

#### ARTICLE I

#### ARTICLE II

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to defray town charges.

#### ARTICLE III

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for for maintaining highways and bridges.

#### ARTICLE IV

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for General Expenses of the Highway Department.

#### ARTICLE V

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$371.58 for Town Road Aid.

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#### ARTICLE VI

Voted that the Town will appropriate a sum not exceeding \$12,000.00 for the purpose of making improvements on the following class V roads within the town: (road No. 67 and 63) such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 83, Laws of 1951 as amended by Chapter 331, Laws of 1953 and to authorize the selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Sullivan.

#### ARTICLE VII

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for Winter Maintenance of Highways.

#### ARTICLE VIII

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for support of the Public Library.

#### ARTICLE IX

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$550.00 for the Fire Company.

#### ARTICLE X

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

#### ARTICLE XI

Voted to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, or Committees as printed in the Town Report.

#### ARTICLE XII

A motion to raise \$1,100.00 to revalue the town by Independent Appraisers was lost by ballot . Yes - 14, No - 52.

#### ARTICLE XIII

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Voted to accept the Caleb N. Wright cemetery trust fund.

#### ARTICLE XIV

Voted that the town will ratify, approve and confirm the action of our Fire Department in joining our town to the Southwestern N. H. District Fire Mutual Aid System in 1958 and in agreeing that our Fire Department may give and receive outside aid as provided in R S A 154 as amended.

#### ARTICLE XV

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$330.00 to improve drainage in the town cemetery.

#### ARTICLE XVI

Voted by ballot, Yes - 38, No 28, that the town will require a permit from the selectmen hereafter to erect or locate any structure in town.

#### ARTICLE XVII

Voted that no Trailer or Mobile Home be allowed to remain in the Town of Sullivan, for more than seven days without obtaining a permit from the Selectmen.

#### ARTICLE XVIII

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Voted that this meeting be dissolved.

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

## WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sullivan on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at 7:30 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money, including that sum required by law, as may be judged necessary, for Summer Maintenance of highways and bridges, and for any construction of the same, for the ensuing year.

4. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the Winter Maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

5. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the General Expenses of the Highway Department.

6. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$360.79 for Town Road Aid in order to receive the full State share of \$2,405.29.

7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the purchase of highway equipment, such sum to be transferred to the capital reserve fund at the end of the fiscal year if not required during said year.

8. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary to provide and maintain adequate public library service or to supplement funds otherwise provided.

9. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the support of the Fire Company and the purchase and maintenance of equipment.

10. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

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11. To confirm or repeal the action taken at the last Town Meeting providing that a permit issued by the Selectmen will be required hereafter in order to erect or locate any structure in town.

12. To confirm or repeal the action taken at the last Town Meeting providing that a permit issued by the Selectmen will be required hereafter in order for a trailer or mobile home to remain in the Town of Sullivan for more than seven days, and if the action is confirmed, to amend the action so that "trailer" will read "house trailer".

13. To authorize the prepayment of taxes and to authorize the collector of taxes to accept payments in prepayment of taxes in sums of not less than ten dollars or in any sum divisible by ten dollars in accordance with the provision of R. S. A. 80:52-a.

14. To discontinue a section of Town Highway commencing at a point opposite the house now belonging to Armand J. and Edna M. Dube and continuing as laid out, to the end of the road at a point in the vicinity of the house now belonging to Waino Holopainan.

15. To elect a delegate to the New Hampshire State Constitutional Convention, the polls for that purpose being open between one and nine of the clock in the afternoon.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before the said Meeting and to vote on any motions which may be made of a purely advisory nature in regard to the conduct of Town Affairs for the ensuing year.

For the purpose of voting on the Sweepstakes Ballot, the polls will be open during the same hours as set forth in Article 14.
