Warrant for Town Meeting of 1914.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wolfeboro qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Brewster Memorial Hall, in said Town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a Town Clerk, three Selectmen, two Auditors, Treasurer and Collector of Taxes, and Prosecuting Liquor Agent for the ensuing year, and one Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.

ART. 2. To choose all other necessary Town officers and agents.

ART. 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the law passed at the January Session of the General Court 1905.

ART. 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways, bridges and sidewalks, in addition to that required by law.

ART. 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eleven Hundred and Fifty dollars to secure a like amount from the State for maintenance of the State Road in said Town.

ART. 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on its indebtedness.

ART. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay each Fireman legally returned, for the year 1914, in addition to that required by law.

ART. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Public Library, in addition to that required by law.

ART. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay James R. Newell Post, G. A. R., to defray expenses of Memorial Day, May 30, 1914.

ART. 10. To see if the Town will vote to aid and assist the Huggins Hospital, and to see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the same.

ART. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town expenses for the ensuing year, and for the suppression of the Gypsy Moth.

ART. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for concreting sidewalks.

ART. 13. To see if the Town will vote to build a gravel sidewalk on the north-east side of Pine street from Center street to house of E. R. Durgin, and raise and appropriate money for the same, agreeable to a petition signed by E. R. Durgin and others.

ART. 14. To see if the Town will vote to build Pine street extension as laid out by the Selectmen June 2, 1900, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

ART. 15. To see if the Town will vote to assist in building a Soldier's Monument and provide a suitable lot for the same, and if so what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for that purpose.

ART. 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money not to exceed the Highway appropriations to build and repair the highways in said Town in anticipation of the assessment of 1914 by vote or otherwise.

ART. 17. To see if the Town will vote to build a building on the grounds of the Huggins Hospital to be used for the care of contagious diseases or for any other purpose that the Town may see fit, and if so to see what sum of money the Town will vote to

raise and appropriate for that purpose, also to empower the Selectmen to make arrangements and contract with the Trustees of the Huggins Hospital for the care and treatment of any and all patients requiring treatment there.

ART. 18. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 5% from the taxes of those who settle their taxes on or before the first day of August, a discount of 4% from those who settle on or before the first day of September, a discount of 3% from those who settle on or before the first day of October, a discount of 2% from those who settle on or before the first day of November, a discount of 1% from those who settle on or before the first day of December, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

ART. 19. To see if the Town will vote to return to the Highway Agency System, if so to elect three Highway Agents for the Town.

ART. 20. To see if the Town will vote to redistrict the highways of the Town and to limit the number of districts.

ART. 21. To hear the report of any committee and take action thereon.

ART. 22. To transact any business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of the Librarian.

To the Board of Trustees of the Wolfeboro Town Library.

Gentlemen.—

The eighth annual report of the Librarian showing the work of the library for the year 1913, is herewith presented.

To the casual observer, the work of a library seems much the same from year to year. A librarian, however, must ever be alert to correct certain tendencies, strengthen the weak parts, and so far as possible keep in touch with the best working methods of the day.

The total circulation for the year has been 14,086 books. Of these 7,443 were fiction, 2,083 non-fiction, and 4,560 children's books.

The interest shown among the children has been particularly gratifying. Parents and teachers can assist much in this department by advising the young people in their selection of books.

We are sometimes asked in regard to the danger to children of contagion from the use of books in a public library. Whenever a family is placed under quarantine, the Librarian at once notifies the Board of Health if there are books from the library in the house. In cases where the Members of the Board are sure beyond a doubt that these have not been exposed to contagion they are returned to the library. If there is any question in the matter, the books are burned. There is no more danger to children from the use of books in a public library than from the use of public books in the grade schools.

Encouraging reports come from the Branch work at South Wolfeboro. There the fifty books sent each three months are to be increased to seventy-five to meet the demand. There are other parts of the town where as good work could be done, if someone would circulate the books. In some sections a neighborhood card might be issued on the same plan as the Teacher's card.

Perhaps the one thing that would most help the work outside of the village precinct is the issuing of a catalogue. It is said that libraries no longer print catalogues; but there is no reason why this should not be done if the character of the work demands it.

During the year a lot of worn out books have been sent to the County Farm, and a few given to the local W. C. T. U. for their work.

It seems necessary to speak a word in regard to the care of books loaned. All borrowers know how soon some of these become defaced and soiled. There is no reason why the books from a library should not receive the same care as those which are private property. If mothers would provide their children with bags such as are used for school purposes, it would at least do away with the damage done by weather.
