## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

*To the School Board and Citizens of Barrington:*

It is a pleasure to me to report that your schools are doing good work under competent teachers. Although your town is large and some of the pupils have a long distance to travel, the average attendance has been good, and the interest in the work of the school is well sustained. The following is a list of the schools, teachers and number of pupils registered.

Waldron Hill—Miss Eda Clow,	26
Green Hill—Mrs. Mary Scruton,	9
Pond Hill—Miss Pearl A. Hardy,	12
Oak Hill—Mrs. Lyle Smith,	29
Winkley—Mrs. Edith M. Reed,	20

The Supervisory Union at its annual meeting decided to employ a trained nurse for the District and the Committee engaged Mrs. Anna E. Clow, of Wolfboro. During the fall term Mrs. Clow examined 88 pupils and found that 42 had defective teeth; 11 bad throats with enlarged or diseased tonsils, or adenoids; 9 had defective vision. There are 50 pupils who have never been vaccinated; a fertile field for small pox.

Mrs. Clow made 33 calls at the pupils' homes to consult the parents in regard to defects that could be remedied. She reports that excellent cooperation was given her by all of the teachers. Her work was interrupted by the sad accident which deprives her of her children, and she finds that she will be unable to go on with the work.

### REPAIRS

There are some repairs that will have to be made during the year in order to have the school houses habitable. The needs have been presented to the District in previous reports. In other matters except the

schools you have seen the necessity for improvements. We all believe in economy; but in the education of your children, real economy would seem to be giving them the best you can afford. However, you are the judges of what you can afford. The State has been generous in granting State Aid as you will see by the financial report. May we not all try to do a little more for the children in our schools?

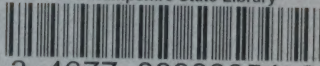






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
