

- 7. To see if the town will vote to discontinue Joe Binford road from Binford place to Sam Bryant place now owned by Henry Harvey.
- 8. To see if town will vote to discontinue road from Ernest Andrews house to state highway.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to have Selectmen distribute inventory blanks when taking inventory.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise \$100.00 for blister rust control.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The equalized valuation of Chatham is \$345,517, the same as last year, and the amount of the \$5 tax will be \$1,727.59. Next year's per capita tax will be \$90. Unless something unforseen occurs, this year should close with no deficit. The amount of state aid for next year will be known at the time of the March meeting. There is nothing unusual to report except that due to removals there are fewer pupils in school that last year. The schools however, are all doing good work and attendance has been excellent.

Seven pupils completed the work of the eighth grade last June and at the Eastman school interesting graduation exercises were held for a class of four.

In general the health of the pupils is excellent but the medical inspection discloses the need of dental attention in a large number of cases.
