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### Friends of the Dalton Town Hall

Greetings from the Friends of the Dalton Town Hall. For well over a decade now the 501c3 non profit group known as the Friends of the Dalton Town Hall has been maintaining and assuming the costs of keeping the building open and tax free, leaving it available for many different sorts of events. We have accomplished this mainly by fundraising through our Ham and Bean dinners in the fall and winter, and our Chicken BBQ, silent auction and flea market in the summer.

The Old Town Hall has a kitchen for warming food and bathroom facilities upstairs and downstairs. It works well for things like kids birthday parties, meeting places, etc. Due to the proximity to the church it could also work well for wedding or funeral receptions.

The Dalton Historical Society is headquartered downstairs in the Town Hall with a great display of town artifacts, pictures, albums, books, and many other items of interest. The building has served the town in many ways over the years such as being a school, home to the town offices, police dept. and library just to name a few. It has provided a meeting place for town meeting, pot luck dinners, card parties, coffee hour after church, etc. It has also provided a place through the years for groups to meet such as the Boy Scouts, 4-H, Grange, summer rec. program, and many, many other groups and organizations in town. Because of the buildings long service to the Town of Dalton we are pleased to let everyone know that the Town Hall was recently added to the New Hampshire list of historic places. We received a very nice plaque commemorating this and we currently have it on display in the main room in the hall.



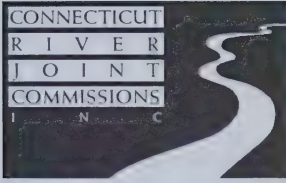

### ***CRJC Riverbend Subcommittee Annual Report - 2018***

The Riverbend Subcommittee of the Connecticut River Joint Commissions (CRJC) consists of two volunteers nominated by each of the following municipalities: Guildhall, Lunenburg, Concord, Waterford, Barnet, Ryegate and Newbury in Vermont; and Lancaster, Dalton, Littleton, Monroe, Bath and Haverhill in New Hampshire.

The Subcommittee provides a local voice to help steward the resources on or affecting a portion of the Connecticut River, particularly on topics related to the maintenance of good water quality and wildlife habitat. The Subcommittee is one of five that make up the Connecticut River Joint Commissions since 1989. Specific responsibilities include providing advice to NHDES, VTANR and municipalities on matters pertaining to the river; reviewing and commenting on proposed permits and plans; and maintaining a corridor management plan.

The Subcommittee stayed updated on a number of issues including the ongoing dam management and relicensing through FERC, conservation projects by the Ammonoosuc Conservation Trust, and the potential opening of a River History Museum in Barnet. The Subcommittee reviewed and commented on a series of permits from across the region and on a range of issues such as manure pits, water drainage, bridge replacement and river bank development. The Subcommittee hosted a presentation on Aquatic Invasive Species. Members discussed ways to outreach to new members and are revamping outreach documents. Finally, the members have distributed the CRJC Homeowner's Guide for Water Quality Protection and the CRJC Shoreline Buffer Fact Sheet to central town locations (e.g. Public Library or Town Office).

There are currently openings on the Subcommittee in several communities. There is one representative in Lancaster, Monroe, Bath, Concord, Barnet, Ryegate and Newbury. There is no representation from Guildhall, Lunenburg and Waterford. ### Town Specific Annual Report 2018 - Dalton

North Country Home Health & Hospice Agency provides quality services that include home health, hospice, nursing, rehabilitation, social services, homemaking and long-term care in 48 towns, covering all of Coos County and northern Grafton County. **In 2018, for the Town of Dalton, we provided 1404 visits with services to 35 clients (8 of which were Hospice and the remaining were Home Health and Long-Term Care clients).** We are committed to our community in that we provide community health clinics and screenings such as blood pressure checks and foot care clinics, health education programs, and a bereavement support group.

Hospice Care focuses on quality of life and provides support to the patient and their caregivers in achieving their goals and wishes. Our compassionate team, made up of physicians, nurses, social workers, home health aides, spiritual counselors, therapists and volunteers, work with the patient to achieve their goal. Services provided to the patient and their caregivers include: management of pain and symptoms, assisting patients with the emotional, spiritual and psychosocial aspects of dying, and provides needed medications, medical equipment and medical supplies. Also included is family/caregiver education on the provision of care and short-term inpatient treatment for management of symptoms that cannot be managed in the home environment or is needed for caregiver respite. Bereavement counseling for surviving family members and friends is also provided. An individual electing hospice care is not giving up on living, rather, making the decision to focus on quality of life. Hospice care provides a high level of quality medical care with a different focus from the traditional medical model.

Home Health Care is critical to serving the growing health care needs of this community. Our skilled clinical team can monitor health problems and provide disease management within the comfort of the home setting, which helps prevent more costly health care such as hospitalization and long term institutional care.

North Country Home Health & Hospice Agency and our Board of Directors are extremely grateful to the Town of Dalton for its support of our agency. This allows us to fulfill our mission to provide services to all individuals regardless of their ability to pay. North Country Home Health & Hospice Agency is committed to providing services in Dalton to support clients and their families to remain in the comfort of their homes, in a safe and supportive environment, and to improve overall health outcomes in the community.
