





The two schools have been in session 31 weeks each.

The school at East Hebron was taught the entire year
by Mrs. Lola G. Cooledge.

The spring term at the village was taught by Miss Harriet Wheet of Alexandria and the fall and winter terms by Miss Abby Smith of Plymouth.
