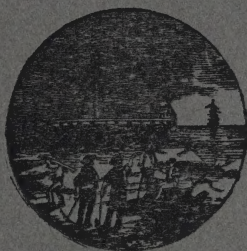

## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

---

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lancaster qualified to vote in Town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:—

1. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

2. To choose three Selectmen, a Treasurer, a Prosecuting Agent, one Trustee of trust funds for three years, and other necessary officers, for the ensuing year.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following purposes:—

First—To meet current expenses of the Town and apply on the principal and interest of the Town debt.

Second—For Highways and Bridges, Town Maintenance, State Aid Maintenance, Permanent Roads.

Third—For building and repairing Sidewalks and Sewers.

4. To direct how money raised for any of the above purposes be expended.

5. To see what action the Town will take in regard to an act for State Aid and for the expenditure of other public moneys in the permanent improvement of main highways throughout the State, passed Feb. 5, 1905, and amendments thereto, and raise money for the same.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the observance of Old Home Week, and direct how the same shall be expended.

7. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

Given under our hand and seal at Lancaster, this 22d day of February, 1919.

## SELECTMEN'S REPORT

---

The amount of money handled this year is larger by several thousand dollars than ever before, being \$79,900.66 as against \$76,497.43 last year. Of this amount \$33,738.64 was paid the school districts; \$5568.80 for State tax; \$5336.95 for County tax, being the largest items. The Savings Bank tax was \$6899.59 as against \$7563.05 last year, a loss of \$663.46.

The highway maintenance amount of expenditures are \$8336.27, exceeding the appropriation by \$1336.27, of which amount there was paid \$200.00 for gravel pit in East District; \$1439.70 for permanent roads, viz.: iron culvert pipe, stone roads, graveling roads, etc., and \$1333.20 for breaking roads from Feb. 1st to April, making the net cost of town repairs, \$4126.72. Up to Feb. 1st, this year, the expense of breaking roads has been so slight that no separate account has been kept. The winter of 1917-18 was a record one on road breaking costing the large sum of \$2730.19.

To the permanent roads item, as mentioned, (\$1439.70) should be added the sum of \$695.65, out of the former appropriation for the Mt. Prospect road, making a net sum of \$2134.43 in permanent roads, divided as follows: East District, \$764.07; South District, \$547.87; Village District, \$127.84 and the Mt. Prospect road, \$695.65.

New sidewalks of cement were laid the entire length of Hill Street and in front of the L. F. Moore store on Middle Street.

We have taken up or paid long time notes of \$2600.00 and have hired \$1000.00, making a decrease of \$1600.00 of outstanding notes. This shows a reduction of debt, however, of only \$287.81, although there is a balance of \$4919.02 in the Town Treasurer's hands, that being used to offset the liability of highway unexpended balances.

We give these statements and figures as supplementary to the following pages, as we thought it would more thoroughly explain the facts.
