# State of New Hampshire

---

To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Androscoggin Hall at Milan in said town on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for breaking roads winter of 1925 and 1926.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise for Trunk Line Construction, \$1,500.00.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise for Trunk Line Maintenance, \$2,140.00.
7. To see if the town will vote to raise for State Aid Maintenance, \$200.00.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day, and appropriate the same to the Grand Army.
9. To see if the town will vote to build a new bridge across Leavitt Stream and appropriate money for the same.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of books and supplies for the public library.
11. To choose by ballot one Trustee of Cemetery Trust Fund for three years.
12. To choose one Trustee for Public Library for three years.
13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair cemetery fences.
14. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road through Mrs. Andy Mullins' dooryard, a distance of about two hundred (200) feet, as soon as the new layout is built.
15. To see if the town will vote to take over the cemetery on Milan Hill.
16. To see if the town will vote to buy a tractor to be paid



on installments in three years, and appropriate money for the same.

17. To see if the town will vote to buy snow plow for tractor, to be paid on installments in three years, and appropriate money for the same.

# School Superintendent's Report

---

To the School Board and Citizens of Milan:

Herewith is presented the annual report of your Superintendent of Schools together with a table of school statistics for the last complete year ending July 1, 1924.

The work in your schools for the past year has been carried on much along the lines of previous years.

During the school year the superintendent has made a total of 152 visits of inspection and instruction to the several different schools of the town; an average of about 22 visits per school.

At the beginning of the year an outline of work adapted to the needs of the school was made from the state program and a copy placed in every school in order that the same definite amount of work might be the aim in each grade in every school.

The superintendent on subsequent visits has examined classes orally, helped with the formation of the program and made assurance that the work was being well completed. At various times during the year standard tests in different subjects have been given together with written tests by the superintendent covering the work in the outlined program.

The primary aim of the school to give the children as much education as possible, both physically and mentally, has at all times been kept in mind. The physical side has been looked after in some schools through supervised games and through the use of corrective exercises in the school for a short period each day. We have aimed to have a sound mind in a sound body.

Through the efforts of teachers and pupils a graphophone was obtained for the village grades, and with the use of suitable records this machine has been of great assistance in the giving of proper physical exercises.

At the close of the year in June, 18 pupils in the various schools completed the work of the eighth grade. Eleven of these pupils are now enrolled in the high schools and for the most part are doing a good grade of work in their new schools.

In closing this brief resume of my year's activities I would extend a cordial invitation to parents and other interested citizens to visit our schools more frequently and thus obtain a first hand impression of the work being done there. This actual visiting

should be the only fair way to judge the work of both teachers and pupils.
