REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD.

Another year of school work has passed into history. Again it becomes the duty of the school board to submit its annual report. We think we can conscientiously say that good progress has been made in all the schools. Of course, there is always room for improvement; still, we maintain that taken as a whole, the schools are in better shape than they were one year ago. Good schools are the result of the union of several qualities. In the first place, it is not only necessary to have a teacher qualified so far as a general education is concerned, but it is also necessary that he or she be a good disciplinarian and be backed by the united efforts of scholars and parents.

In our report of one year ago, we recommended that a sum of money be raised by the town for the purpose of permanently repairing a part, at least, of the school buildings. We would still suggest that this be done at our next annual town election, as some of the school buildings are not in a condition of comfort during the cold months of school.
