THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Washington qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on Tuesday, March 13th, at 10 A. M. to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect a Town Clerk, Treasurer, one Selectman for three years, Road Agent, Tax Collector, Auditor, Member of Trust Funds Committee for three years, Library Committee one member for three years, and all other necessary town officers.

Article 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of its highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum recommended by the State for the building of permanent highways.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial Day.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of Shedd Free Library.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to repair the road leading from the Blanchard Road to the home of Ralph Nantelle.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow in anticipation of taxes.

Article 9. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds, or pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 10. To see if the town will accept the sum of \$50.00 from the estate of Emma D. Chase and perpetually care for the James McKinley lot in the new Centre Cemetery.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to accept \$50.00 from Bertha Hill and perpetually care for the Walter C. Dutton lot in the new Centre Cemetery.

Article 12. To see whether beer or other lawful beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under laws of 1933, Chapter 99, Section 22.

Article 13. To transact any other business legally coming before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of the Washington, N. H. School District, the fifteenth annual report, of the Superintendent of Schools, being the report for the year 1932-1933, is herewith respectfully submitted.

Three schools were in session in Washington this year. Miss Althea Allen, who was graduated in June, 1932, from the Keene Normal School, was elected teacher of the East Washington School, coming highly recommended by those at the Normal School. Mrs. Mazie Lovejoy, a graduate of the Plymouth Normal School, with four years teaching experience, taught at the Dole School, and Mrs. Minnie V. Smith, with seven years' experience, receiving her Normal Training at the Castleton, Vt., Normal School, and at Keene, taught at the Center.

Although all teachers were new to Washington, we had a profitable year, the teachers were competent and willing, and the relations with the parents has been very pleasant. In addition to the regular teachers, Miss Ruth Whitcomb, a registered nurse, recommended to us by the State Department, was our school nurse, and did much constructive work, beneficial to the health of the children. She is school nurse in Deering and in some other towns not in this Union.

There is much misunderstanding concerning the matter of State Aid to Schools, so that a few words in explanation may not be out of place. In case a school board presents a budget of its proposed expenses for the coming year, to the State Department, the State will pay to the district in the form of State Aid, as much money as the district spends for elementary education, with the approval of the State Department, over and above a tax of \$5.00 per \$1,000 of the equalized valuation of the School District, if there is enough money to do so, otherwise each district gets its proportional

share of the amount appropriated. Note that the money considered is that spent for elementary education only, and that the amounts spent must meet with the approval of the State Board.

Below is a statement of the amounts approved by the State Department to run our schools of 38 pupils for this year:

The approved amount for teachers' salaries, \$1,958, was less than the amount actually paid, not because we paid too high salaries to our three teachers, but because the State Department did not approve opening the Dole School, with the Center School also in session. We paid an average salary of \$783.33, and one of my districts paid for teachers in exactly similar schools an average of \$795.55 with State approval. It will be noticed also that pay for only two janitors was approved. We spent in teachers' salaries alone \$2,350, which was more than the amount approved for all elementary school expenses. Our equalized valuation being \$572,629.00, our \$5.00 tax would amount to \$2,863.15. The total amount spent by Washington for its schools was \$3,892.08. I have been told several times that as that amount was more than the \$5.00 tax,

then we should have had State Aid, but that amount was not spent for elementary education alone, and did not meet, in its entirety, with approval. We actually spent \$2,859.73 for elementary education, which was less than \$2,863.15, the \$5.00 tax. So the question of approval didn't affect us this year, because if the total amount had been approved, we still would have spent for elementary school less than the amount required to make us eligible for State Aid.
