REPORT OF TOWN MEETING - MARCH 14, 1967

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Barrington in the County of Strafford in said State, the following action was taken on the Town Warrant on Tuesday, the 14th day of March 1967.

The meeting at the Barrington Grade School in Barrington was called to order by Moderator Leon C. Calef, at 10:00 A.M. and the polls were opened for voting on Article 1.

ART. 1. The following officers were elected:

95 votes cast 639 eligible voters

ARTICLES OF BUSINESS AT 7:30 P.M.

- ART. 2. It was voted that the Selectmen be empowered to appoint all other necessary Town Officers. Motion: E. Beal
- ART. 3. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,200.00 for the support of the Town Poor, Old Age Assistance, and other Town charges. Motion: R. White
- ART. 4. It was voted to raise and appropriate the County Tax. Motion: E. Caswell
- ART. 5. It was voted that the Town authorize the Selectmen to borrow up to the sum of \$50,000.00 in anticipation of taxes if necessary Motion: R. Spinney
- ART. 6. It was voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of

\$20,000.00 for maintenance of Town roads and bridges. Motion: E. Rowell

ART. 7. Mr. Sherman Baxter raised an objection on the use of Town Road Aid funds for any thing other than use on Hall Road. Selectman George Musler advised that the board of selectmen planned on using the bulk of Town Road Aid funds on Hall Rd.

It was voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,162.02 for Town Road Aid, the State share to be \$7,746.82. Motion: N. Arlin

ART. 8. It was voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be used in cooperation with State and Federal Funds for the Control of White Pine Blister Rust, within the confines of the Town. Motion: E. Caswell

ART. 9. A motion was made by E. R. Rowell that this article be voted inexpedient to legislate. After discussion on the floor this motion was withdrawn by Mr. Rowell.

It was then voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the Library Association. Motion: N. Berry

ART. 10. It was voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for the V.F.W. Memorial Day exercises. Motion: N. Arlin

ART. 11. It was voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 for participation in the Lakes Region Association. Motion: E. Caswell

It was suggested by the board of selectmen that the 1968 sponsor of the Lakes Region article furnish the board with folders or brochures issued by the Lakes Region Association for evaluation and discussion at Town Meeting in 1968.

ART. 12. It was voted by the Town as inexpedient to legislate. Motion: E. Caswell

ART. 13. It was voted that the Town authorize the Selectmen to sell any property owned by the Town, sales to be conducted by public auction by advertising in the Foster's Daily Democrat and the Rochester Courier at least twenty, (20) days prior to the sale, listing a description of the property, time, and place of sale, minimum bids and terms. Motion: E. Caswell

ART. 14. The Committee for Investigating New Sites for a town dump, Fred Timm, Irving Clark, Russell Fogg, Norman Berry, and Sumner Hayes; recommended that the town purchase from Mr. Melvin

Clark a tract of land seven and one half acres more or less situated on Smoke St. This recommendation came as a result of much time and effort on the part of the committee in seeking a most advantageous tract of land. Mr. George Musler described the lot as having 520 feet frontage and 650 feet depth, that the front two acres would have to be cleared, an 8' to 10' high fence would have to be erected on a portion of both sides and across the entire front of the lot. The Selectmen would also secure approval from the N.H. Department of Agriculture, the N.H. Department of Health and the N.H. State Water Resources Roard. This site was adjudged sufficient for the Town's needs for a period of fifteen years.

It was then voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the purchase of land on Smoke Street for use as the town Dump. Motion: N. Arlin

ART. 15. It was voted that the Town increase the yearly salary of the Town Treasurer from \$150.00 to \$175.00; and the Town Ballot Clerks from \$8.00 to \$12.00 per session. Motion: E. Caswell

ART. 16. It was voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be added to the Fire Truck Reserve Fund. Motion: G. Calef

ART. 17. It was voted that the Trustee of Trust Funds for the Town of Barrington consist of a board of three members. Motion: E. Rowell

ART. 18. It was voted by the Town that Mr. Raymond Spinney be Chairman of the Committee of five and that he appoint the four other members of the Committee. Said Committee to formulate plans for the proper observance of the Town's 250th anniversary in 1972; and to report its recommendations at the Town Meeting in 1968. Motion: R. Brooks

ART. 19. It was voted that the Town accept all items in the budget not covered by articles in the warrant, Motion: R. White

ART. 20. It was voted that the Town give a vote of thanks to the Selectmen for their work in preparing the excellent Town Report of 1966. Motion: R. White

It was voted to adjourn at 9:45 P.M. Motion: E. Caswell

TOWN OF BARRINGTON - TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Barrington in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Barrington Grade School in said Barrington on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next at Ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLES OF BUSINESS AT 7:30 P.M.

- ART. 1. To choose by ballot and major vote, one Selectman and one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years. Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes and two Auditors for one year.
- ART. 2. To see if the Town will vote by ballot to change from one year to three years, the term of office of the Town Clerk. Treasurer, and Tax Collector. (1967 Legislature, Chapter 243, (HB 253))
- ART. 3. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
- ART. 4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,800 for the support of the Town Poor, Old Age Assistance. Aid to the Disabled and other Town Charges.
- ART. 5. To raise and appropriate the County Tax.
- ART. 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow up to the sum of \$50,000.00 in anticipation of taxes, if necessary.
- ART. 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000.00 for maintenance of Town roads and bridges.
- ART. 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,282.72 for Town Road Aid, the State share to be \$8,551.48.
- ART. 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be used in cooperation with State and Federal Funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, within the confines of the Town.
- ART. 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the Library Association.
- ART. 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the V.F.W. Memorial Day Exercises.
- ART. 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$253.22 for participation in the Lakes Region Association.

- ART. 13. To see if the Town will accept as a Town road, that part of a road known to some as the Meadow Brook Road South, starting at a point on Meadow Brook Road already accepted by the Town at a previous Town Meeting, and extending in a generally Easterly direction, approximately 2/10 of a mile to a point where it meets and joins the Lee Hill Road.
- ART. 14. To see if the Town will vote to increase the salaries of the Supervisors of the Check Lists.
- ART. 15. To see if the Town will vote a sum of money and authorize the Selectmen to use same to secure the services of Legal Counsel to determine the rights and interests of the Town in the beach area now occupied by the Camp Fireside Association, adjacent to a road commonly known as the Pond Road and extending to the high water mark created by Ayres Lake, and to determine the legal width of that portion of the Pond Road, adjacent to said beach.
- ART. 16. To see if the Town will vote to abandon that section of the road, known to some as the Dr. Grigg Road, from its intersection with the Elmer Berry Road, in a general northerly direction, through the property now owned by one W. Rainbolt, to the present boundry of the land owned by said W. Rainbolt.

(This is a section of the so-called Dr. Grigg Road closed by a vote of the Town in the actions of the Town Meeting of March 11, 1952 under Article 13.)

- ART. 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money to be added to the Fire Truck Reserve Fund.
- ART. 18. To see what the Town will do regarding a petition submitted by 10 or more registered voters, requesting that all Dogs kept and maintained in the Town, be restrained by their owners whether on or off the owners property.
- ART. 19. To see what action the Town will take after hearing the report of the Committee for Proper Observance of the Town's 250th Anniversary.
- ART. 20. To see if the Town will accept all items in the budget not covered by articles in the Warrant.
- ART. 21. To transact any other business that may come before the meeting.

WHITE PINE BLISTER RUST CONTROL

In 1967, 145 towns and cities appropriated approximately \$18,666.70 to advance the control program in their communities. This sum, combined with state and federal cooperative funds, enabled us to cover 202,475 acres of control area. This splendid cooperation, an indication of the towns' continued confidence in the statewide control program, is most heartening.

Recognizing the towns' fiscal problems, the Division's appropriation requests are kept to minimum amounts necessary to maintain the present status of control.

The importance of the Blister Rust Control Program is evidenced by the prominent place white pine holds in our state economy - 1. approximately 70% of all lumber cut in New Hampshire is white pine; 2. 17% of our New Hampshire labor force is sustained by revenue derived from white pine timber sales, woods operations, the manufacture and sale of hundreds of white pine products. All of this was endangered by the advent of the destructive White Pine Blister Rust Disease.

New Hampshire faced a most difficult task, that of marshalling forces to combat the rust. It had the largest control area in the United States – 2,500,000 acres. To meet the situation, town, city, state and federal forces combined in a unique effort. All government agencies contributed funds to finance the project. The State was assigned the responsibility of directing the field work. These arrangements are still in force. The combined effort has been successful. Control of the disease has been established on 98.7% of the entire control area. Our problem is to hold the line and maintain the hardearned control status by periodic examination of control areas to determine the recurrence of currant and gooseberry bushes and, when found, destroy them. Continued cooperation on the part of towns and cities is essential to the achievement of this goal.

Conforming to our yearly custom, there has been prepared, and is attached herewith, a statement briefly summarizing accomplishments, and expenditures of town, state and federal funds.

In our financial statement, the amount reported as "Cooperative Aid" covers not only expenditures for actual ribes eradication, but

also state and federal funds spent in -1. detailed mapping and inspection of areas prior to actual control work, 2. research work that has reduced the size of the control area, and 3, research in control methods to reduce costs of control work. The mapping survey provides a permanent record which is of great value in planning future examinations and workings of white pine stands in your community.

Because details of control work can vary in communities, it is not possible to cover all in a brief statement. However, the supervisor of the control project in your town will, in the course of his planned public relations work, contact you and members of your Board in the near future to discuss the present status of the project and his future plans as it pertains to your community.

REPORT OF THE DOG OFFICER

Of interest to the citizens of the Town of Barrington, is the action taken by the last Legislature to strengthen the dog nuisance law (RSA 466:31).

Under this law, any person who considers a dog a nuisance or menace to persons and property may make a complaint to any law officer or Selectman. Such officers must investigate within three days.

If the complaint is sustained they must order the owner orkeeper of the dog to abate the nuisance by having a certified copy of the order delivered to him. The owner has 10 days to petition the district or municipal court for review. Meanwhile he must restrain his dog else face a fine up to \$25 and surrender custody of the dog to the Police for such disposition as the Court may order.

This is a state law and your town officers are obligated to enforce it.

Many persons may for reasons of their own, take advantage of the law and their neighbors, however we feel you are all reasonable people and will make an effort to control your pets.

This year, over 700 dogs from Barrington and the surrounding communities were vaccinated under the new Rabies Act (466:1).

We had one serious case of running dogs killing a large number of turkeys at Mr. W. Haley's. We tracked them until we lost all clues as to their whereabouts. Again we stress that you keep control over your dogs at all times.

23 Strays were picked up and taken to the veterinarian for disposal.

Two stray dogs were picked up and returned to their owners.

We assisted the State Fish & Game Dept. in tracking 8 dogs running deer.

And finally, we assisted the Town Clerk in collecting approximately 50 delinquent dog permits.

It will help if we follow these simple suggestions:

- 1. No burning of debris and waste between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. and then only with a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.
- 2. Take debris and waste to the town dump.
- 3. Maintain a clean, safe dump.
- 4. Keep matches away from young children.
- 5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.
- 6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.

New Legislative Acts associated with control of water pollution have to a great degree, put a crimp in new non-resident building. Chapter 147 (HB 111) requires the State Water Pollution Commission approval of all sanitary disposal systems within 1,000 feet of Public Water. This in effect takes control of placement of septic systems out of the control of the local government and during the initial period of State involvement, certain hardships have been created for those wishing to build. It is hoped that the State will have a better system in 1968 for processing applicants and that the Legislature in 1969 will make some realistic modifications to the Pollution Laws to make them bearable.

AUDITORS' REPORT

We have examined the accounts for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967 of all Town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds. Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

The two fundamental purposes of auditing are:

First: To determine whether all revenues to which the town is entitled have been collected and turned in to the Treasurer, or properly verified as outstanding accounts.

Second: To determine whether all expenditures have been properly authorized and are supported by appropriate invoices or payrolls.

With these two goals before us and following the instructions and suggestions set forth by the State Tax Commission, the vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks.

There were no discrepancies or irregularities in any account and the Town officers and bookkeeper are to be commended for the courtesy and cooperation extended to us.

ANNUAL SCHOOL MEETING - 1967

The inhabitants of the School district in the town of Barrington, N.H., qualified to vote in district affairs, met at the Barrington Grade School on March 13 for the Annual School Meeting which was called to order at 8:05 p.m. by the moderator, Raymond Spinney, who then read the warrant.

ARTICLE 1. It was voted that Raymond Spinney be nominated Moderator. (Motion: J. Richardson). It was further voted that nominations cease.

ARTICLE 2. It was voted that Mary Drew be nominated Clerk. (Motion: J. Varney) It was further voted that nominations cease.

ARTICLE 3. It was voted that Dwight Haley be nominated new School Board Member, (Motion: E. Caswell). It was further voted that nominations cease.

ARTICLE 4. It was voted that Beverly Caswell be nominated Treasurer. (Motions: J. Varney). It was further voted that nominations cease. It was then voted that the Clerk cast one ballot for the slate of officers as nominated.

ARTICLE 5. This article is to be acted on later in Article 8.

ARTICLE 6. It was voted that the Auditors' Report on Page 56 of the Town Report (1966) be accepted. (Motion: F. Timm).

ARTICLE 7. It was voted that Irene Calef and Dorothy Berry be appointed Auditors for the coming year. It was further voted that the School Board be authorized to choose a Truant Officer or any other officer that may be needed during the coming year. (Motions: F. Timm)

A motion was made that the Teachers' Salary item be voted on by ballot. It was then moved, seconded, and carried that we have a standing vote. Result: The full amount of \$67,560.00 was voted for teachers' salaries. Ayes: 53, Nays: 22.

The Selectmen request the School Board to see if it can make its fiscal year coincide with the town's. (Note: A letter from the State Board of Education to Mrs. Norman Berry, dated March 27, 1967, on file with the School Clerk, reads in part: "194:15 School Year. The fiscal year for all school districts shall end June thirtieth in each year."

It was moved by N. Arlin that we give the School Board a vote of thanks. Applause.

It was voted that we adjourn. (Motion: E. Caswell). Meeting adjourned at 11:45 p.m.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to adopt as the checklist for school meetings the checklist of the town.
- 10. To see if the district will vote to elect or appoint a Building Committee.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) to be used by the Building Committee for preliminary planning for additional school

facilities.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Considerable work has been done by two separate committees in exploring the AREA concept with Dover and Rochester. In order to ensure secondary education for the children of Barrington, it should continue these studies until some formal agreement has been reached amicable to all concerned.

The last 5 years have shown an emergence of a new militancy on the part of school teachers in the United States. Our daily newspapers feature front page headlines reporting teacher strikes or sanctions across the nation.

Direct negotiations in education with school boards is becoming more and more popular in New Hampshire. By collective negotiation is meant a process whereby the teachers choose an organization to represent them. This organization meets together with the school board. The two together and jointly set and determine the salaries and working conditions of the teachers in that school district. This is a bilateral decision making process as opposed to a unilateral decision making process. The agreements that are reached in negotiations are put in a form of a written document signed by both parties. The New Hampshire Association of School Administrators has adopted a legal form to be used in New Hampshire.

The reason for the above description of collective negotiation is to make the general public aware of what they may face in the future, for example that as of this writing, some of the immediate goals of the NHEA are as follows: a base starting salary of \$5,600, improved working conditions, increased sick leave, partial payment of group, life and health insurance, a signed professional negotiations agreement, etc.

In closing we would like to express our appreciation for the cooperation from the School Board, teachers, children, and citizens of the community given to this office in the past year. We will need your continued cooperation for the best interest of the boys and girls in your schools.

REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

To the Superintendent of Schools:

The current school year began September 1967 with a record enrollment of 305 pupils. As other school districts, Barrington is experiencing rapid growth in its school age population. While rapid growth is desirable in many respects, it poses new problems which require new solutions. Physical education, remedial reading, special education and guidance are areas which would be of considerable benefit to the pupils. The future of the seventh and eighth grades is, at this time, undecided. It would seem that the solution would be either entrance into an AREA School Compact or expansion of the present school faculties.

Pressing as these problems are, my first year as your principal has been encouraging. Fortunately we have added to our audio-visual equipment which expands and makes more graphic the educational experience of the pupils. Such equipment has little value unless handled by a competent faculty which we possess. The receptive attitude of these teachers, school boatd members, and interested townspeople toward accepting the need for change in our school system has been gratifying.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

To the Superintendent of Schools:

The school health services in Barrington, Epsom, Northwood, Nottingham and Strafford included a routine health inspection of each child by the nurse. The parents were informed whenever defects were found, and most of these children were seen or treated by their family physician. The success of the health program depends largely upon such cooperation as the parents of these communities have shown.

In addition to the above, various clinics were arranged for the benefit of the children. Measles vaccine was given to 78 children in Barrington and to 49 in Strafford. Epsom joined with Chichester in having a measles clinic and a combined total of 22 children received this protection.

A series of three immunization clinics was held in both Northwood and Nottingham. In Northwood, 42 measles vaccinations, 18 smallpox vaccinations, 105 triple toxoid boosters and 24 oral polio immunizations were given; while in Nottingham 142 children received triple toxoid, 22 were vaccinated for smallpox, 55 for measles, and 134 for polio (both series and boosters).

Dental clinics were held in three towns — Barrington, Epsom, and Northwood. The former participated in the Matching Funds Program only. Dental repair work was provided for 11 children. Epsom and Northwood also had this program and a total of 35 children was treated. These two towns also have a continuing dental program for cleaning the teeth and applying topical fluoride solution which is very beneficial in reducing dental decay. 199 children took advantage of this program in Epsom and 144 in Northwood.

Regarding clinics, it should be remembered that all immunization clinics are co-sponsored by the N.H. Bureau of Public Health and a local organization. The dental clinics are also co-sponsored by the N.H. Bureau of Dental Public Health and one or more local sponsors. The local groups deserve a special word of commendation, since a great deal of time and effort is essential to the smooth operation of any clinic.

Through the N.H. Tuberculosis Association, the Heaf test for tuberculosis was administered to 239 students and faculty members at Epsom Central School, and 6 people received X-ray examinations. It is planned in the future to administer the Heaf test annually to children in first grade only. This will be done in all five towns in the fall of 1968.

During the school year of 1966-67, the N.H. Sight Conservation Program provided vision examinations and glasses for 3 students, and the Concord chapter of the Lions Club took care of an equal number.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of you who helped in making the school health service so successful.
