REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

The school district has been fortunate during the last few years in having so few changes in its teachers, and for this reason school progress is less interrupted than it is when changes are frequent. This year Miss Osgood resigned at Green Hill, and we were fortunate in securing for this school Miss Edna Hill, a graduate of the New Haven Normal School and a teacher of experience.

The school board has made an arrangement with the Conway School District for the part-time services of a school nurse. For this, Chatham pays \$45 or approximately what the State Board of Education gives the district for health work. While this does not give Chatham any large part of the nurse's time, it does provide for a systematic inspection of the health of the school children during the year.

The total number of pupils in the schools this year is unusually small, but the quality of the work being done seems to be unusually good.
