

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD

To the Citizens of Greenville:

We herewith submit the following report:

Nearly all the school districts in New Hampshire are served by school nurses. It seems desirable that Greenville should employ such a nurse to do follow-up work after the medical examination and we, as a Board, together with Dr. Pease, approve of this extension of health work. The yearly cost of a school nurse would be \$300, but as the Board feels that the decision should be left with the voters, this item is covered by a separate article in the Warrant.

In making up the Budget for the coming year the Board has presented as low a figure as seems consistent with securing the best results.

Children who remain at school at noon are indebted to the Red Cross for a hot lunch served each day during the winter term. This service is much appreciated by the pupils and their parents.

The interior of the school building is in excellent condition, but it will be necessary to paint the outside in another year.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Greenville:

I submit my ninth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

SCHOOL ORGANIZATION

There has been no change in the organization of the schools from the plan one year ago and the only change in personnel is that Mr. Lester Batchelder is looking after the manual training work in place of Mr. George Robbins.

The statistical tables show an increased enrollment, a slight increase in the per cent of attendance and the same satisfactory record of tardiness as last year.

SUPERVISION

In the past two years I have been able to increase the proportion of time devoted to school room supervision so that for the current year it amounts to 65% of my total time; 25% is devoted to office work which includes the tabulation and study of teachers' tests and standardized tests, and the remaining 10% is devoted to other activities including School Board meetings, conferences and visits outside the district.

The testing program is being conducted along the same lines as described in previous reports. In addition, I have this year begun a practice of making special reports to the parents as to their children's success in these standardized tests. The results of the Stanford Achievement Tests given in January are now being sent out to the parents, and the results of the reading tests in the Primary Grades will be sent out later on. These reports are intended to give to the

parents an opportunity of making the same comparison, between the standing of their children in these tests and the teacher's marks, that we have been making and using for the past three years or more. We are using standardized tests that are in general use throughout the country and have been perfected to such a degree as to furnish a very reliable measure of accomplishment in the grades for which the tests are standardized.

A general invitation is extended to parents to confer with the Superintendent and teachers, for there is much that we are able to tell in a conference that it is impossible to put into a written report.

MEDICAL INSPECTION

The annual medical inspection was made in October by Dr. Pease assisted by the nurse, Miss Morris, and the following results have been reported:

No record has been made of corrective work since the previous examination.

This medical inspection could be made effective and corrective work secured if the School District would see fit to provide an additional sum of money for the services of a school nurse. I hope this may be done in the near future.

THE BUDGET

The total sum recommended by the School Board to be raised by taxation is \$9,159 as compared with \$9,868.40 last year. The reduction of approximately \$700 is due chiefly to savings in the following items: Transportation of pupils \$240, High School Tuition \$600, with slight additions in the items of scholars' supplies, other expenses of instruction, janitors' supplies and insurance.

The interest and co-operation of the School Board and citizens is as greatly appreciated as it has continually been during my period of service in this district.
