LANCASTER TOWN WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lancaster qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:—

1. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
2. To choose three Selectmen, one for three years, one for two years, and one for one year, a Treasurer, a Prosecuting Agent, one Trustee of trust funds for three years, and other necessary officers for the ensuing year.

3. To bring in your ballots upon each of the questions submitted by the Convention to Revise the Constitution relative to the amendments proposed by said Convention at a session held on January 28, 1921.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following purposes:—

First—To meet current expenses of the Town and apply on the principal and interest of the Town debt.

Second—For Highways and Bridges, Town Maintenance, State Aid Maintenance, Permanent Roads.

Third—For building and repairing Sidewalks and Sewers.

5. To direct how money raised for any of the above purposes be expended.

6. To see what action the Town will take in regard to an act for State Aid and for the expenditure of other public moneys in the permanent improvement of main highways throughout the State, passed Feb. 5, 1905, and amendments thereto, and raise money for the same.

7. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to appoint tree wardens.

8. To see what action the Town will take relative to the support and maintenance of Hospital in said Town.

9. To see if the Town will vote to sell the small tract of land situated on Canal Street, in the village of said Town of Lancaster, and lying just westerly of land of Arthur McCaffrey and between land of said McCaffrey and land now or formerly owned by Thomas Cunningham.

10. To see what action the Town will take in regard to purchasing machinery.

11. To see what action the Town will take relative to lighting Centennial Park.

12. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

To the School Board of Lancaster Town:

I assumed the duties of Superintendent of Schools in this district on the 11th of last November, succeeding Mr. Eugene Tuttle, whose services ended with the month of October. I accepted the position and came here on very short notice and for several weeks was more or less handicapped by personal matters.

My inspection of the schools shows that the work has been well organized and planned for the year, and it is not my policy to make any marked changes in the arrangements made by my predecessor. In one or two cases we found changes necessary. I might say in a general way that the success of any and of all schools seems to bear a direct ratio to the ability and faithfulness of the teacher. The teacher is the effective factor in the school system. It will be wise policy to retain all teachers doing good work in the same school as long as practicable.

The problem of keeping open our rural schools is serious not only in this state but throughout the country. Owing to movements of population and diminution in taxable property, many towns in New Hampshire would not be able to maintain their schools without state aid. In addition to the financial question, it is increasingly difficult to find competent teachers who are willing to go into the more remote schools. Here is an opportunity for community co-operation because it has been demonstrated that if a community has a reputation for treating its teachers well, it will have less difficulty in securing a satisfactory teacher.

Teachers' salaries will remain near the present level and will probably not be greatly advanced next year. Some superior teachers may receive more and untrained, inexperienced teachers will not be able to command as much as they have received.

It is probable that in the future we shall have to depend upon our own constituency for our teachers. We cannot expect to bring them in from other states nor to any great extent from other parts of New Hampshire. It will be wise to look ahead and encourage our promising girls

to fit themselves for teaching and to come back to their home town for a service which is patriotic in the highest degree.

It is only fair to speak of the excellent work of the school nurse, Miss Ethel Johnson, and to bespeak the co-operation of all parents in the very important work of caring for the health of the children.
