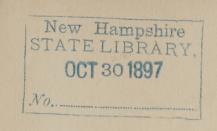
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AUDITORS' REPORT

AUDITORS' REPORT.

The undersigned, auditors, have to report that they have examined the accounts of the Treasurer and Selectmen for the year ending March 10, 1868, and find the amount received from all sources is \$22,627.65, and an equal amount accounted for, as shown by the following schedules, and summary of receipts and expenditures.

There was represented in the assets by the report of last year \$500 due from the State for soldiers' bounties, valued at \$375, of which there has been received \$178 during the current year. As to the value of the claim for a further amount the auditors have no means of judging.

There is also represented in the following schedules the indebtedness of the town on the first day of March, 1868, including interest, amounting to \$56,885.75, after deducting the estimated value of the assets, which is an increase of indebtedness over last year of \$4,469.14, which may be accounted for mainly by interest on the debt of last year, the amount expended for railroad surveys, and pauper bills of last year; there having been no money raised for paying interest on the debt, and these bills all being charges not properly belonging to the ordinary expenses of the current year.

There has been paid \$144.65 interest over and above the legal rate to sustain the debt of last year. There has been but two bills of highway surveyors returned the current year. The auditors think a settlement of highway surveyors' accounts should be insisted upon, the neglect of which was noticed in last year's report. All of which is respectfully submitted.
