## SCHOOL REPORT.

---

The schools, with a few exceptions, have been very successful during the past year. Most of our teachers have had much experience. And it has become a fixed fact, with the school board, that it is better to hire those of known ability and faculty for teaching, even if we do have to pay them a little higher pay than we should some inexperienced person. For it is not every good man that is adapted or fit to be a minister of the gospel, nor is every well-educated person adapted for a successful teacher. We have chosen nearly all of our teachers from among our own town people, for we consider that the proper thing to do as long as we have those that we think are suitable for the schools that we want them in, and by so doing the money we pay them is not carried out of town. So, we say, patronize home laborers first.

We have not thought it best to condense any of the schools except the one near William Cate's, and the one near Samuel D. Hill's. Having the school a part of the year at the Cate, and part at the Hill, the scholars coming together from both localities, under one teacher. The town district may, at some future time, think it best to drop out one of these two school houses, and have the other moved near to where Levi Pearl lives, and put in good shape for school purposes. As a general thing we do not consider it a fair thing to do, or a proper one to have done, for us to want a school close to our own door, and then ask some other families to cart their children two or three miles through snows and blows, sunshine and rain, to get them to school; while all children are held equal under the law, and should have equal privileges as far as any way practicable.

The school house on Pleasant street is in a very poor condition, and in no way suitable for school purposes; and also

the Yellow school house needs putting in different shape very much ; and quite a number of the others will need more or less repairing. We leave these matters for your consideration and action.
