#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sandown, in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Sandown on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for highways.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for town poor.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the town in anticipation of taxes.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise such sums of money as will be necessary to pay interest charges for the ensuing year.
- 7. To act on any other town business that may come before said meeting.
