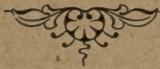

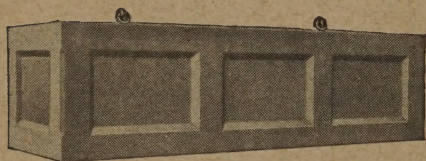

The Superintendent of Public Instruction eliminates from consideration all schools where the pupils have been registered in other schools. Under this elimination this school was not considered during its first term. The two following terms every scholar in the school has a position on the Roll of Honor.

SCHOOL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1898-9.

During the past year there have been 158 pupils in our schools according to the enumeration of our truant officer, Mr. George F. Patten, showing a change of only two from last year's enumeration by the same painstaking officer. Of these 82 are boys and 76 girls.

The statistical table is less full of detailed information than in years previous to last year owing to the elimination by the State Superintendent from the teachers registers of certain required reports, such as the number of scholars in particular classes.

The Roll of Honor, showing the list of perfect attendance, indicates much, as does the publishing the names of scholars who have attended 95 per cent of the term. Allowing a scholar an honor position if present 95 per cent of the time, according to a vote of the district a couple of years ago on recommendation of Mr. J. Lane Fitts, has proven a new incentive to scholars who know they must inevitably be absent some.

That this ambition of such scholars may be reached and their names seen where they are so proud to know they have earned a position all parents should strive. And that parents are striving to enable their scholars to be on the roll or on the list is evidenced by the fact that one school has the pride producing, state challenging distinction of having no tardiness, no dismissal, and only one half day absence mark on the teachers register during two consecutive terms. Such condition in a school where all the scholars are of tender years is the work of teacher and parents rather than of School Board and truant officer; is the work of a teacher who interests that she may instruct, and of parents who co-operate fervently with the teacher by seeing that she has pupils on hand every hour and minute of every school day. Without such co-operation the best teacher is forced often to do herself and pupils an injustice. While there is no school in town where the parents possess any monopoly of fervor for the education of their children, there are schools in town where parents take a more apparent interest in having their children at school all the time regardless of wind, work or weather.

There have been 32 weeks of school the past year, two more

than in recent years. This was because the Board used its money to practically the limit. The expenses have accordingly been greater than in the immediate past. They have also been greater because the same quality of all things money has to be expended for has been higher.

We feel, however, that we have not paid out any money heedlessly or unwisely. Several of our teachers who have been with us for a long time have been valuable because a school in which they were "perfectly adapted" had been found for them after trying them out, as must always be the case when a teacher comes new to the school no matter how well she may have filled some foreign position. It is the unqualified judgment of this Board that it is a vital loss for the school which has to use time getting in step with the methods of a new teacher.

Repairs have been made on all the school houses where schools were being taught so far as necessary to keep them in reasonable condition. The school house at High street has been extensively reconstructed inside, new flooring and new seats at an expense of about \$170.00 being the most important and expensive work done there. The work was necessary and the house is now one of the most pleasant and inviting of the nine being used for school purposes. Repairs have been made on the Chester Road school house at an expense of about \$30. This house was tending toward a condition of collapse that made the work done absolutely imperative. Flags have been kept at all the school houses as required by law, but many of the flags for use on the flag poles had become so used up that a new supply was ordered early in the year. For some reason the committee is not responsible for the supply has not been forwarded.

New geographies and new arithmetics have been placed in the schools during the year, both of which were selected after much consideration of the various standard authors.

On the whole we believe the past year's work in the different schools has many claims to the gratefulness of parents and citizens.

None of the schools have been interrupted by any spreading sickness. None of them have been kept upset by any unusual stress of weather that canceled the daily work on their calendar. None of them have been found in the hands of incompetent teachers. None of them, with one exception, has had to go through a very severe set back on account of the inevitable and unavoidable change of teachers. None of them have

had to submit to any shortening of the school year. None of them have been under the tutorage of inexperienced teachers who, judged by their preparative training did not give every promise of being equal to the school they were to teach. None of them have been in the hands of experienced teachers who could not go to other places at once for the same or larger wages than they received here. None of them have been in the hands of teachers who did not know every two weeks during their work just what all the schools were doing, and what the School Board desired and advised in regard to each and all the schools. None of them closed their year's work in a condition that would do discredit to any interested party if a public examination had been held at the town hall and the scholars had presented themselves free from stage fright.

None of them are in a condition where it is the opinion of the Board that their work will have to be done over again before they can be allowed to advance in the grade in which they have been working. None of them when judged by the standard they are entitled to be tested from, but can be and is pointed to with pride by the undersigned.
