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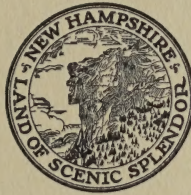

8. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$250 to have a doctor settle in vicinity.

9. To see if the town will vote to throw up the road from State highway to land owned by Miss ~~Heston~~ Haslam

10. To see if the town will vote to give five per cent. (5%) discount on all property taxes paid on or before July 31, 1932.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Chatham:

In the opinion of your superintendent the Chatham schools are in excellent condition and the district is fortunate in securing the services of the present corps of teachers. The salaries paid are approved by the state board of education and full allowance is given on this item of state aid.

The district receives also from the state \$1.50 per pupil for the services of the school nurse, and pays Conway \$45 a year in order that Miss Curren, who is the Conway nurse, may make several visits to the schools during the year. The superintendent believes this is much better than to have a physician just once for an annual examination, and it costs the district less on account of the increased state aid.

There has been some fluctuation in the number of pupils enrolled in your schools during the last few years as this table shows:

The amount to be assessed for the per capita tax next year is \$74, and the amount of the \$5 tax is \$1,263.04, the same as last year.
