#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board of Madison:

I herewith submit my eleventh annual report as superintendent of schools, it being the nineteenth in the series of such reports.

Madison is to be congratulated on the success of its schools this year. The force of teachers is strong and pupils are giving good attendance. The Nickerson School did not have an instance of tardiness for the first eighteen weeks. This school had a record of 99% attendance for the first eighteen weeks.

**Repairs and Improvements** 

The property is in good repair and should be kept so by reasonable expenditure each year. It is much less expensive than to repair after long neglect. As soon as possible attention should be given to enlarging and beautifying school grounds.

During this year a new water supply was installed at the high school and small repairs done on sheds at Nickerson and Silver Lake.

In the coming year Nickerson should be painted outside and the yard wall built. Mason should be shingled and painted outside.

#### Medical Inspection

This department is under the care of Miss Ruth Langille who is pushing the work vigorously. This is important. Our boys and girls need strong bodies for the best accomplishment at school. A well attended dental clinic was held at the Town Hall and a throat clinic at Laconia Hospital. Health habits and methods of first aid are being stressed. Aid from the Silver Lake Woman's Club, the Mothers' Club, and the local Red Cross is much appreciated.

### High School

Graduates of our high school are still bringing credit to the town by their success in advanced schools. After completing the work in advanced schools, they are gaining success also in teaching and business positions. Madison High School is sending about 50% of its graduates to advanced work. This is a fine record.

We are fortunate this year in having a goodly number of tuition pupils. If we can hold the present fine standard of our school, others may desire to come. These pupils add to the size and real value of the school.

Of last June's graduates, one is in Plymouth Normal School, one in Keene Normal, one in New Hampshire University, one in Wentworth Institute.

Statistics

For the year ending June 30, 1931, our schools had an average attendance of 125, and average membership of 130, and a percent of 96.2.
