State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at K. of P. hall at West Milan, in said town on Tuesday the 10th day of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for breaking roads winters of 1931 and 1932.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Trunk Line Maintenance.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid Maintenance.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day and appropriate the same to the Grand Army.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Public Library.
9. To choose by ballot one Trustee for Cemetery Trust Fund for three years.
10. To choose one Trustee for Public Library for three years.
11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for cemeteries.
12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town poor.
13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid Construction.
14. To see if the town will vote to begin building State Aid Construction road at the Dummer line on East side of the Androscoggin River.

15. To see if the town will vote to begin building State Aid Construction road over Milan Hill commencing at Milan Village.

16. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for white pine blister rust control.

17. To see if the town will vote to buy the tractor and plow they have on rental and appropriate money for the same.

18. To see if the town will vote to sell their old tractor for \$500.00, same to be applied on the purchase price of the new tractor.

19. To see if the town will vote to buy a small caterpillar tractor for summer use and appropriate money for the same.

20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to apply on town debt.

21. To see if the town will choose by ballot a man to run the town tractor and look after same for one year.

22. To transact any other business as may legally come before the meeting and appropriate money for the same.

23. To see if the town will choose by ballot a man to run the small caterpillar tractor and look after same for one year providing the town purchases the tractor.

24. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

25. To see if the town will vote to carry a separate account for truck and tractor, all money received on truck and tractor, less upkeep, shall be deposited in Savings Bank on interest, to be carried towards a new tractor, when the present one is worn out.

School Superintendent's Report

Milan, N. H., Feb. 1, 1931.

To the School Board of Milan:

I hereby submit the annual report of the Superintendent of Schools. This is the eleventh in the series of reports by superintendents for your town.

Teachers

The schools opened for the last fall term with a number of changes in the teaching force. Miss Marion Garland who had previously taught successfully for one year at Milan Hill was transferred to the Village Primary School; Miss Leta Thurston, a teacher of two years' experience and a graduate of the Gorham, Maine, Normal School was appointed at the Milan Grammar School; Miss Ethel Brown, also a teacher of two years' experience and a graduate of Gorham Normal was placed in the West Milan School; Miss Mabel Harmon, a graduate of Gorham Normal, to the Milan Hill School; Miss Lillian Jensen, a Gorham Normal graduate, to the Jewett School; and Miss Doris Tappan, a graduate of the Concord, N. H., Training School, to the Hodgdon Hill School.

These new teachers have quickly adapted themselves to the schools and have been earnest and faithful in their work.

Attendance

The attendance for the past year as seen in the table of statistics has been good. The Milan Hill School again has the highest percentage of attendance and the Milan Primary School the lowest.

The schools as a whole had a better percentage of attendance this year than in the previous year; the percentage being 94.25 for the last complete school year as compared to 93.02 for the previous year.

Health

Dr. N. B. Dresser of Berlin was appointed School Physician

by the School Board and conducted the medical inspection throughout the schools.

In order to secure the best results from medical inspection, it is necessary that some follow-up work be done for which a busy physician has hardly the time.

From personal experience, I know that excellent results are achieved in medical inspection and improvement in the health of the pupils in those school districts which combine to hire a regular school nurse to make the inspections and also take charge of the clinics and do the follow-up work.

Looking back to the time when I first became acquainted with your schools, it seems easy to see much improvement.

I believe that the children are today much better instructed than formerly and I am sure that your school buildings are in much better condition than at that time, although there is still opportunity for some improvements.

The Milan Village School should very soon be provided with new seats. Some time, in the not too distant future, there should be a better water supply for the entire year and a different arrangement for the toilets.

In closing I wish to take opportunity to thank the School Board for their interest and cooperation.
