To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bridgewater in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Bridgewater on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Selectman for three years and one for one year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for fire protection and equipment.
- 4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of Class V Highways and Bridges (Town roads).
- 5. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of the law in regard to State Aid Construction of the River Road and raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of \$823.50 for said purpose: or will vote to accept State Aid for the construction of Class V Roads and raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of \$306.16 for said purpose.
- 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Oiling the Whittemore Point Road so-called and to elect an agent to expend same.

- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55.00 for the support of the Lakes Region Association.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$26.00 for the support of the Newfound Region Association.
- 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Winter Roads.
- 10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Snow Removal Equipment Fund.
- 11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for town poor.
- 12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Blister Rust Control.
- 14. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for observance of Old Home Day.
- 15. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to decorate the Soldiers' graves for Memorial Day.
- 16. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to shingle the Town House.
- 17. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to complete the so-called Huckins Hill road.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and deliver inventory blank when assessing.

19. To transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Bridgewater:

The number of pupils registered in the two schools of Bridgewater for 1937-1938 was less than for the year preceding, there being 36 for 1937-1938 and 44 for 1936-1937. The percent of attendance for the year just passed was 95.1 and this was slightly in excess of 1936-1937. The average daily absence for the two years under comparison shows an improvement in that two years ago 1.8 pupils were not in school each day while last year .9 pupils were out daily. Forty-six citizens made visits to the schools, and the school board and superintendent made 14 and 46 calls respectively.

The enrollment for the present year shows a drop over the preceding year. Twenty-nine pupils are to be found in the two schools: nine on Bridgewater Hill and nineteen in the River Road school. The five children attending the elementary schools of Bristol bring the total up to thirty-four. Four of these will leave the eighth grade in June: three at the River Road school and one in the Bristol school.

Eighteen pupils are to be found in the high schools in nearby towns. Five of these are seniors and will not be in school next year. It is important that parents co-operate with the board in urging regular attendance that the progress from grade to grade be not hindered.

Miss Ethel M. Howe, a graduate of Keene Normal School, was engaged to teach on Bridgewater Hill, and Mrs. Smith, is again at the River Road school.

The schools are running very smoothly, the finances of the district are sound, and the board's activity in the maintenance of the schools is to be commended.
