

-SELECTMEN'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Chatham:

The equalized valuation of Chatham for the next two years is \$240,529.00 and the amount of the \$5 tax to qualify for state aid is \$1,202.65. The state-aid payment next December will be \$2,634.43. Very little reduction was made in the amount requested by the school board and apparently the present salary schedule for teachers is within the limits approved by the state board of education. In other wods the salaries paid are not above the state-wide average paid for equal training and experience.

The per capita tax to be assessed next year is \$72.00. The tax to be raised next year should of course be the amount required to balance the budget presented by the school board but it must not be less than \$1,202.65. It might be more and the exact amount can be determined at the annual meeting.
