STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lancaster qualified to vote in the Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:—

1. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
2. To choose one Selectman for three years, a Treasurer, a Prosecuting Agent, one Trustee of trust funds for three years, and other necessary officers for the ensuing year.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following purposes:—

First—To meet current expenses of the Town and apply on the principal and interest of the Town debt.

Second—For Highways and Bridges, Town Maintenance, State Aid Maintenance, Permanent Roads.

Third—For building and repairing Sidewalks and Sewers.

4. To direct how money raised for any of the above purposes be expended.

5. To see what action the Town will take in regard to purchasing machinery.

6. To see what action the Town will take in regard to an act for State Aid and for the expenditure of other public moneys in the permanent improvement of main highways throughout the State, passed Feb. 5, 1905, and amendments thereto, and raise money for the same.

7. To see what action the Town will take relative to the maintenance of Hospital in said Town.

8. To see what action the Town will take in assisting the support of a Health Nurse.

9. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the old highway leading from the E. D. Stockwell Farm so called (now owned by Mrs. Kate E. Stockwood) to the Northumberland Trunk Line road near farm owned by A. Newman.

10. To see what action the Town will take for the prevention of the White Pine Blister Rust.

11. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

12. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the alteration and amendment to the constitution proposed by the convention to revise the constitution shall be approved.

The medical examination was made by Dr. H. W. Cleasby, assisted by the district nurse, Miss Ethel Johnson. Number of pupils examined, 125; teachers examined, 2; defects remedied since last year, 69.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

To the School Board of the Town of Lancaster:

This year we raised a school tax of \$13,778.16 to meet the requirements of our budget. We shall probably be able to keep within the limits of this appropriation for current expenses. We had at the beginning of the year a debt of \$800 which was a deficit from last year. This has been paid without interference with our proposed budget expenditures as we have received \$677 from the state equalization fund and we had cash on hand of \$165.85.

In last year's report we explained to the voters the plan of distribution of state aid. School districts are arranged in a list and those which expend for school purposes more money per thousand dollars of valuation are preferred. Lancaster is low on the list and the appropriation is expended before Lancaster is reached. What we get is a part of the five per cent reserved for distribution at the discretion of the state board. The

legislature of two years ago made the provisions and limited the appropriation. What the present legislature will do, we don't know.

The amount of state aid for next year, however, will be small. It will be advisable to appropriate the total as shown by your budget of school expense plus a definite sum for repairs. We shall not have any deficit this year and will have none in the future if budgets are carefully planned and appropriations voted in accordance.

I urge that a fair sum be appropriated for repairs. Considerations of economy as well as regard for child welfare demand that we do not halt in our program of making our school houses suitable places for children. Practically all of our school houses need painting. No. 10 is in urgent need of general repairs and No. 8 must have its toilets rebuilt.

We are maintaining ten schools for about 135 pupils. An efficiency expert would point out the waste involved and the saving which could be effected by consolidation. The school board has been willing to make any changes which would reduce the cost of school maintenance. The cost of school transportation, however, is usually not much less than the expense of keeping a school open, and we have not wished to close any school without the general approval of the school district. There are very great advantages in consolidation and some very practical difficulties. The district would need to own and operate its own closed barges if consolidation became a settled policy.

I acknowledge receipt from the James McIntire Estate of a considerable number of books for addition to the school libraries.

I hope that funds can be found to support a district nurse. The work that has been done in the schools by the district nurse ought to be carried on.

I wish to thank the teachers for the loyalty and faithful service.

REPORT OF LIBRARIAN.

The Lancaster Public Library enters upon its fifteenth year in the Weeks' Memorial building March 21st, 1923.

The number of books given out during the year is 17,138, an increase over the 16,575 books given out last year. Of this number 1849 were non-fiction. Money taken for cards and fines amounted to \$170.43. 1288 cards were issued to borrowers.

The Library has increased its usefulness in lending books to the guests of many hotels in the vicinity of Lancaster, as it has a reputation of having the best standard fiction both ancient and modern.

The two outstanding events of the year in the Public Library's activities, were first the annual meeting of the N. H. Library Association, which met within the walls September 13-15. It was made possible for Lancaster to take part in this educational movement through the co-operation of the Library board of trustees and the two librarians.

The second event was Children's Book Week from November 11th to the 19th. Book Week is now a well known National Institution. During the week, Miss Ellen Davis observed the story hours by telling stories of a classical nature to about 230 school children. Through the Library extension of the Unity Club a gift of \$25.00 was given to the Library for the purchase of books for children.
