This is to certify that I have examined the books and other financial records of the school board of Landaff, of which this is a true summary for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1931, and find them correctly cast and properly vouched.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Landaff:

I hereby submit my first report as Superintendent of Schools:

You have in your schools an excellent corps of teachers. Three of them taught in your schools last year and are continuing their previous efficient teaching. The opening of the Scotland School made it necessary to employ another teacher and Miss Helen Jesseman, a graduate of Plymouth Normal School in 1931, was hired for this school. She is doing good work.

Shortly before the schools opened last September it was learned that there would be at least eight or nine children living in the Scotland district who were old enough to attend school. The people living in that district were anxious to have the school reopened. Transportation of the pupils to the Center School did not seem very feasible and the School Board decided to reopen this school. The building had to be cleaned and shingled, and the plastering repaired. School opened two days late with thirteen pupils in attendance. This number included three tuition pupils from the Lisbon Town District who had previously attended at Sugar Hill. Later in the year a partition was placed across the school room so that the cost of heating would be reduced and a new stove was installed. This school is doing efficient work and the people living in this part of the town appreciate the opportunities offered their children.

In addition to the repairs on the Scotland School house the walls of the Blue School were steel sheathed and the wood work painted. This has greatly improved both the appearance and lighting of this building.

The total enrollment for last year was 61, the average attendance 47.3 and the percent of attendance 91.69. There were ten pupils attending Lisbon High School and one at Bath High School. There were also three pupils attending elementary school at Lisbon. This year there is a total registration of 68 pupils. There are nine pupils attending Lisbon High School and none in the elementary school.

Next year the Scotland School house should be painted on the inside and another window cut on the west side of the building. The other buildings are in good condition and need little in the way of repairs.

The opening of a fourth school has of course increased your expenditures, but the School Board has cut down the budget enough to absorb these increases and is recommending an appropriation of \$4,000 the same amount you have raised in the past for only three schools. I do not believe you can wisely reduce this amount unless you combine two of your schools and transport the pupils.

I certainly appreciate your cooperation in all matters pertaining to the welfare of your schools.
