

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD.

The School Board of Moultonboro submits the following report:

Realizing the fact that the expense of the schools is one of the largest in our town, we are pleased to be able to report that we are satisfied that progress has been made in every school. Every teacher has sought to bring their school up to a higher standard. The school in District No. 3 shows marked improvement in discipline as well as in studies.

The "Neck Road" school, No. 4, deserves special mention for the faithful work of the teacher and scholars. We would urge the parents to have the scholars regular in attendance through the entire school term. Absence not only deprives the scholar of the privilege of education, but causes the town to pay for that which it does not receive.

We would recommend that the school year be lengthened to at least thirty weeks.

SCHOOL BUILDINGS.

During the year, with the assistance of our townman, Mr. Herbert Dumaresq, the Middle Neck school house has been put in perfect repair, and is a credit to the district and town. The other school buildings in town, with the exception of No. 3, at the Corner, and No. 6, at Center Harbor Village, are in a fair condition. The above mentioned houses need repairing and we would suggest that the sum of \$500 be raised for that purpose, that all our school property may present a proper appearance and be more comfortable to the pupils in attendance.
