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



### **TOWN WARRANT**

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(SEAL) To the inhabitants of the Town of Sunapee in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs: You are hereby notified to meet at I. O. O. F. Hall in said Sunapee on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

Article 1. To elect a Town Clerk for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To hear the reports of the Selectmen, Town Treasurer, Water Commissioners, Auditors, Agents and Committees or other Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 3. To elect, one Selectman for Three Years, and all other necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to pay the outstanding debts and interest on its Notes and Bonds and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the Town

will raise to defray Town Charges for the year ensuing and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to repair Highways and Bridges for the year ensuing and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 7. To see if the Town will raise Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4500), (the State to give a like amount), to maintain its Trunk Line Highways and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 8. To see if the Town will raise One hundred fifty dollars, (\$150.00), (the State to give a like amount), to maintain its State Aid Highway and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 9. To see if the Town will raise Three thousand dollars, (\$3000.00), (the State to give a like amount), for Trunk Line Construction and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will raise Five thousand dollars, (\$5000.00), for permanent road construction, to be expended on the road leading from foot of Rogers Hill, so-called, towards Garnet Hill and the Lake Sunapee Yacht Club and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of the Lake Shore Road, so-called, (a public highway), at Georges Mills which extends from an iron pin driven into the ground near the Garage of Cecil Lean westerly to its junction with the Cooper Shop Road, so-called, provided said Lean will lay out and construct, at his own expense, subject to the approval of the Selectmen, a highway from said Garage northerly to the highway leading from Georges Mills to New London, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 12. To see what sum of money the Town

will raise for Electric Lights and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 13. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to maintain its Fire Department and passany vote relating thereto.

Article 14. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the maintenance of its Public Library and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 15. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of the District Nurse and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 16. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the care of its Cemeteries and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to co-operate with the Towns of Newbury and New London, to advertise Lake Sunapee, each Town to raise or appropriate the sum of Three hundred dollars, (\$300.00) for this purpose and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 18. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Sidewalk construction and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 19. To see if the Town will raise Four hundred dollars, (\$400.00), to co-operate with the State in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to buy a Motor-Driven Hook and Ladder Truck, raise money for the same and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to license junk dealers and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 22. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes and pass any vote relating thereto. Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to lay out and build a highway, over the same traveled road now used, leading off the State Highway from a point North of the Eliza Gregory place across the river to the home of Victor Gregory and to home of Eugene H. Rollins.

Article 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Given under our hands and seal, this twenty-fifth day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Sunapee School Board:

I am presenting this, my fifth annual report. The annual report of the Superintendent gives the only opportunity he has during the year of presenting to the people as a whole the school situation as he sees it. In this report I shall try to speak of the educational progress that has been made since the last report; what we should still hope to accomplish in the next year; and a statistical statement as a matter of record for future reference.

It has been a deliberate plan on my part since being with you as your Superintendent to bring our schools to a high state of proficiency both as regards equipment and by selecting high grade teachers. This task has been made all the easier, due to the fact that the Boards I have had to work with had the same desire with relation to these details so that today we have arrived at a point where we can feel that we are getting value received for the educational outlay. Our problem has become rather concentrated since all our Schools are now in three buildings.

Some of the tests that are being given in the Center School this year indicate that the work we are doing is above the average for school systems throughout the country. Another indication which is a check on this situation proving it to be valid is that pupils coming to our schools from other systems considered to be superior find our own schools entirely adequate to their needs. This should give satisfaction and pleasure in knowing that when we have been trying to build for superior educational advantages we have succeeded in creating them.

The problem of greatest moment before us is to obtain superior teachers, especially trained for the tasks for which they are employed. This will be rendered easy with the fine spirit of co-operation I have always received from the Board in building to such an ideal.

I am truly grateful for the fine support I have had from nearly every source in trying to make our Schools better for building worthy and intelligent citizens by our schools. Having provided superior opportunities, I think we shall see that well trained young people going out from our schools will bring great credit for the advantages provided and prove to be an asset to their town.
