To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wilmot in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Wilmot on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Town Highways.

4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Maintenance on the 4th N. H. Turnpike and raise and appropriate \$600.00 for this purpose.

5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Trunk Line Maintenance and raise and appropriate \$600.00 for this purpose.

6. To see if the Town will accept State Aid Construction on the 4th N. H. Turnpike and raise and appropriate \$597.00 for this purpose.

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for Old Home Day.

8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for Memorial purposes.

9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$25.00 to repair the retaining wall of Eagle Pond Cemetery so called.

12. To see what action the voters of the Town will take in regard to snow removal, and to see if they will raise and appropriate money for any equipment, which they may vote to purchase.

High School Attendance, 1930-31

The number of pupils attending high school is larger than last year due to the fact that there was only one senior last year and eight new ones entered as freshmen. Of the number now attending, seven are seniors.

The budget calls for \$1,719.20, which is an estimate of the amount needed for high school tuition next year.

At the last district meeting \$1,800 was raised to meet high school tuition and \$750 was raised to meet transportation costs. For the current year these two items call for \$2,197.02 and \$1,008 respectively for high

school tuition and transportation, \$650 ought to be raised at the coming meeting and be made immediately to meet the increased costs of these two items.

May I again urge the employment of a school nurse to look after the welfare of the children? The cost of medical inspection last year was \$78.00. A good share of this amount was paid by the school district. About

one dollar and a half per pupil is allowed for medical supervision in state aided district when a full time school nurse is employed.

For the amount paid last year each school received one visit from the doctor. A school nurse would average about a visit a month and in many instances follow up work would take place.

May I take this opportunity to thank the members of the board for its help during the past year.
