**ANNUAL REPORTS
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To the Voters of Jaffrey

There are several questions connected with the election of Selectmen at the coming town meeting, upon which during past years we have taken a position, and upon which we believe any candidates who seek to oppose us at this meeting should make their position clear.

1. The Dean Case. Just now the progress in this case, owing to developments in the Rich-Boynton slander suit and the new interest of the Boston Herald, is most encouraging. Do any candidates in opposition to us purpose to drop this matter, or will they proceed along the lines we have now opened up?

2. The Bean & Symonds Co. Tax Abatement Case. Acting on the advice of the State Tax Commission, we last April assessed a tax against apart of the property of this Company previously wrongly exempted. The Bean & Symonds Co. has refused to pay this tax, and has brought suit against the town for abatement. Do any candidates who may oppose us for election intend to prosecute the defence of this case, or do they purpose to drop it, thus making it necessary for tax-payers to prosecute the matter further?

3. The Moving Picture Licenses. Do opposing candidates intend to continue the present policy of dividing licenses between responsible applicants, or do they intend to show partiality in future grants?

4. Are any opposing candidates the parties, or under obligation to the parties who in the past have taken a stand in opposition to the proper application of law, as shown by their attitude in the following matters:

(a.) Interfering with due process of law in protecting from prosecution the party guilty of breaking and entering the Nichols and Stratton cottages at Contoocook Lake, in connection with the Jaffrey Country Club.

(b.) Criticism of law officers in their successful efforts to clear up immoral conditions among High School students last year.

(c.) Bringing suit against police officers for successful efforts to enforce state laws regarding the attendance of minors at public gatherings.

(d.) Bringing suit against public officials for attempting to solve the Dean murder mystery.

At the time of making this statement we are not aware of the identity of any individuals who have filed, or intend to file against us; therefore it is clear we are not attempting to enter into controversy with any particular candidate; we are simply taking this means of urging voters to inform themselves as to the attitude of other candidates when compared with our record which is known to you all.

Criticism is being directed toward us for involving the town in expense in connection with some of the matters mentioned above. We take the position that if we had had the hearty co-operation of all citizens, instead of opposition in some quarters, much of this expense would have been saved; therefore we feel and that the responsibility for a large part of this expense is theirs not ours.

This statement is printed at our expense individually; it is not a charge against the town, and is circulated with the town reports as a matter of convenience.

ABSTRACT OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED AT THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING MARCH 9, 1920

Officers elected : Town Clerk, John G. Townsend ; first selectman, Peter E. Hogan ; second selectman, Edward C. Boynton ; third selectman, William F. Coolidge ; town treasurer, John G. Townsend ; overseer of poor, Glenn A. Hunt ; water commissioner for three years. Charles L. Rich ; chief engineer of fire department, Julius H. Parrott ; road agents or commissioners, Wilbur E. Webster, James H. Fitzgerald and George J. Cournoyer ; auditors, Frank H. Baldwin, Russel B. Henchman and George A. Adams ; trustee of trust funds for three years, John G. Townsend ; tax collector, Samuel H. Mower ; commissioner of Humiston Park for three years, Joseph E. Donahue. Voted that the remaining officers be appointed by the selectmen.

Voted to accept and adopt the town reports as printed, with the exception of the selectmen's estimate, same to be taken up later.

Voted to take up Articles 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 at this time.

Voted, under Art. 12, That the town accept the provisions of Chapter 117, Laws of 1917, on a section of the Contoocook Valley Road, and set aside from the amount raised for highway work, the sum of \$300.00 for this purpose.

Voted, under Art. 13, That the town instruct the selectmen to apply for State aid for permanent highways for the year 1920, raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,761.50 for same.

Voted, under Art. 14, That the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for trunk line construction.

Voted, under Art. 15, That the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,700.00 for State aid maintenance of state roads.

Voted, under Art. 16, That the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for trunk line maintenance.

Voted to accept the selectmen's estimate, as amended, and raise and appropriate same.

Voted that the selectmen be authorized to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary, in anticipation of taxes.

Voted that the pay of the firemen be the same as last year.

Voted to instruct the selectmen and chief of police to enforce the law relating to the use of explosives on the 4th of July.

Voted that Art. 7, (electric light contract) be left with the selectmen to adjust.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate \$600.00 to aid in the maintenance of a district nurse.

Voted to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for sprinkling streets, to be under the supervision of the highway commission.

Voted that the selectmen be instructed to release that part of the Slade land that has been sold for building purposes.

Voted to pass over Art. 11, (Fire alarms.)

Voted that the town allow John E. Baldwin to withdraw the amount he paid the town trust funds, if the same can be done legally.

Voted to pass over Art. 18. (Discontinuing Johnson road.)

Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to be made available until spent, to be used in co-operation with the State and Federal Government to control the white pine tree blaster.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate \$400.00 to purchase a new road machine, under the supervision of the highway commission.

The following resolution was passed : Resolved that it is the opinion of those present that it is best to discontinue the Carey Road and Bridge from the Rindge road to the Carey house, provided the town can secure \$500.00 from the railroad and the expense be not over \$1,000.00.

At 2 P. M. the ballot for Presidential Primary was publicly opened, the ballots counted and the Moderator made a public declaration of the whole number of tickets given in for each party and the names of each person voted for and the number of votes for each.

Voted to adjourn.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Jaffrey:

I herewith submit to you my third annual report, the twelfth under district supervision.

The enrollment of the Conant High School is 65 and the average attendance 62.33. The largest previous enrollment was 58 and the largest average attendance previous to the present year was 49.33.

Three out of four of last year's high school teaching force were retained, Miss Sheldrick succeeding Miss Hildreth as the head of the commercial department, Miss Osgerby was assigned to take charge of the English in both the junior and senior departments of the high school, and Miss Smith transferred from grade VII to grade VIII with work in the Domestic Arts classes.

Miss McGregor was transferred from the B division of grade VI to the A division and Miss Norton placed in charge of the B divisions of grade V and VI.

At the primary building the A divisions of the first four grades are taught by the same teachers as last year. As suggested last year a new room was fitted up in the Union Hall building for the B divisions of Grades III and IV and placed in charge of Miss Sarah L. Jennings who taught in District No. 4 during the past two years.

Miss Weeks succeeded Miss Wetherbee as teacher of the B divisions of grades I and II, Miss Belcher succeeded Miss Jennings at Dist. No. 4, and Miss Corliss succeeded Miss Walker in District No. 9.

Miss Grimes has continued her work as supervisor of music in both the village and rural schools.

Miss Hiller, as school nurse, has given close attention to the several schools and in addition to the regular duties of examining the pupils as required by the State department, has given close attention to all matters relating to the health of the pupils.

The Domestic Arts department has continued to serve noon lunches at the high school, and lunches are also being served at the primary building. Through the generosity of public spirited citizens a fund has been started to allow the serving of a more substantial lunch at a minimum expense. On account of the large number of pupils who are transported from the outside districts this plan has been keenly appreciated.

The matter of transportation is still one of the big problems of the district. The two Wayne cars purchased last year began running in the spring term and have taken care of the pupils on the two largest routes.

A substantial increase in salaries was granted last year and we were thus enabled to retain the greater number of our teachers. Few districts in the state were able to retain so many experienced teachers even with greater increases. This, I believe, shows that our teachers realize that their work has been appreciated.

In spite of the increases in salaries granted during the past two years our teachers are not paid any more than their training and services warrant. There should be, however, more of a difference between the salaries paid trained and experienced teachers and beginners. We should not have to pay new teachers another year as much as those who have served long and successfully. I believe that conditions will allow the adoption of a carefully graded salary scale very soon.

The attendance at our evening school has been much better than last year. Our manufacturers have shown an excellent spirit of co-operation in the matter of requiring pupils between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one to attend. Several pupils, who at the

opening session in October, were unable to read, have since passed a very creditable examination, and a fair number have been regular in attendance in the more advanced classes.

The work begun two years ago in relieving the congestion in the lower grades by forming two divisions in all grades through the sixth has already shown substantial results. The work of the first division in each grade has been well above the requirements, and the pupils who are unable to do the work of the regular grade have teachers who have the time to give them the attention that is needed. The standing of the seventh and eighth grades this year is such that we may expect a large increase in the enrollment of the high school during the next two years.

The work of the high school has received high commendation from the Deputy Commissioner of Education who has made two extended visits during the past year and has carefully gone over the work of the school.

These results have not been attained without earnest, faithful work on the part of our teachers, careful planning on the part of the superintendent, and the generous and hearty co-operation of the school board.

There should be no backward step. Our schools deserve the best we can give them. Your homes have an assessed value, but your children are priceless. The children of this town are the best asset of Jaffrey. To the development of this asset we should bend every energy.

In closing I wish to thank the citizens, teachers, pupils and members of school board for the loyal support given me during the past year.

3. To hear all reports and act thereon.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor, building and repairing highways and bridges, library, fire department, Memorial Day, street lights and all other town charges.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to aid in the support of a District Nurse.
