The Selectmen are pleased to dedicate the 2006 Town Report for the Town of Milton to Ms. Isabelle Eldridge.

Isabelle was a lifelong resident of Milton. She graduated from Nute High School in 1937 and spent her life serving the community in one way or another. Perhaps she is most remembered as the Town Clerk, a position she held for 23 years, however, she was the School Clerk for 24 years prior to that.

Having grown up on a farm on Teneriffe Mountain, she would often fondly recall those years and entertain people with stories of that time in her life. She would recall times of picking blueberries and along with her mother, taking the crates by wagon to the train station to go south to neighboring communities.

Isabelle was a lifelong member of the Nute Church and was very proud of the growth of the congregation there in the past years. She also was a member of the Milton Women's Club, the Historical Society and the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Although she lived in Milton all her life, she did travel to Canada and Europe as evidenced by her large collection of souvenir plates, spoons and clocks.

Isabelle always attended the town meetings and usually had an opinion on some matter which she would share with the rest of the townspeople there. She had strong beliefs and principals and she had no trouble in expressing them.

The Town of Milton has lost a source of wealth of knowledge not only about our little community, but about perhaps simpler times in this nation and world. If she were here, Isabelle would tell all of us to share our knowledge and our history with others so that it will be remembered for generations to come.

Isabelle Eldridge was dedicated to the people of the town and the Selectmen are pleased to dedicate this Town Report to her.

Boston Post Cane

The Boston Post Cane was originally made available at the turn of the century to 431 towns, (no cities) by the former Boston Post newspaper with the idea that New England's selectmen would ceremoniously award them to their eldest citizen. (Originally it was to only go to the oldest male!) The idea was used as an advertising gimmick by then Post Editor Edward A. Grozier. Grozier hired a leading cane manufacturer in New York to make 431 canes that he directed be crafted out of African imported wood with a gilded tip of 14 carat gold and varnished with the finest French varnish.

The original Milton cane was lost some years ago, however a beautiful replica was created so that this tradition could be started again. It seemed fitting that the this would be given to Emma Ramsey in November of 2004 for her 99th birthday.

About Milton

Milton is a small town with spectacular scenery of the Milton Three Ponds and abounding with historical buildings and sites. Most of the town's population wraps around the water's edge enjoying the quiet tranquility of the large fresh water ponds fed by the Salmon Falls River. Growth also climbs the surrounding foothills and Teneriffe Mountain creating winding roads through old forests and farmlands with great outlook spots along the way.

Incorporated in 1802, Milton was originally the 'North Parish' of Rochester. Milton is a rural town situated in southeastern New Hampshire, with a population of over 4,000. The major transportation system providing access within Strafford County and to connecting routes is the Spaulding Turnpike, a divided expressway running north to south through the town. It connects with Interstate 95 at Portsmouth, in close proximity to Pease International Tradeport. US route 4, an east-west highway, provides access to Concord and Manchester and NH route 125 is a north to south local road, connecting many of the smaller towns plus has a section over Plummer Ridge that is a natural and scenic state highway.

Small convenience stores and gas stations provide patrons and visitors with local news and friendly conversations. Other shopping needs are primarily met in neighboring Rochester, as are hospital facilities. The Spaulding Highway access in Milton makes access to Dover and Portsmouth very convenient for additional shopping, malls, hospitals and other medical services.

Milton's municipal government consists of: an elected three member Board of Selectmen; Budget Committee; Planning Board; Zoning Board of Adjustment; five member School Board; and numerous other appointed boards and committees. The Town has an excellent on-call Fire and Ambulance Department, along with a well staffed Police Department and summer marine patrol. The Selectmen are ready to assist new business ventures in securing land in the Town's Industrial Park.

Recreational opportunities abound. The Winter Carnival held in February, is a weekend-long event with festivities like snowmobile races and ice cutting held amidst a spectacular winter backdrop on the ice and in the snow with indoor activities for all ages. The annual 4th of July celebration in Milton Mills offers events for all, including a parade. In the winter ice fishing, ice racing and ice-skating abounds. The warmer weather lures fishermen, boaters, and swimmers. Residents and visitors often come and relax at the Town Beach. Other recreational amenities include two baseball fields, and two picnic areas. Seasonal camping is enjoyed at the local campground on Northeast Pond, and the New Hampshire Farm Museum offers a nostalgic look at old-time farming with special programs throughout the year.

To all who are new to Milton - Welcome to our fine community.

DELIBERATIVE (First) SESSION

The Annual Town Meeting (articles of business in the Town Warrant) was held on February 04, 2006 at the Nute High School Auditorium. The meeting was called to order at 1:05 pm by Moderator Leo E Lessard. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all. Moderator Lessard asked for a moment of silence in memory of all those who had passed away in the last twelve months. Moderator Lessard introduced those sitting at the head tables: Selectman Steve Gagne and this would be Selectman Gagne's last meeting, Tom Gray and John Hescock, Selectmen, Town Administrator, Christopher Rose, Town Attorney, Walter Mitchell, Town Clerk, Carol L Martin, Budget Committee members, Pam Arnold, Lu Snyder and Lisa Stewart (Larry Brown was excused) and Supervisors of the Checklist, Rosemary Jeffries, Karen Brown and Bob Ferris. Next, Bette White made a presentation of the last three pewter Christmas Ornaments – First to Nute Library. Accepting this was Victor Joos. Second to the Milton Free Public Library and this was accepted by Bette White. Third to the New Town Office and accepting this was Town Administrator, Christopher Rose. Selectman Gagne wished to thank everyone and announced that this years Town Report was dedicated to Tim Corbett. Accepting a Town Report was Mrs. Cherie Corbett. The "Ground Rules" to be used today were explained by Moderator Lessard.

Moderator Lessard read the warrant (first session and second session) and explained that Article 2, Zoning Amendments, could not be changed and would be addressed after the regular articles were acted on.

Article 2

Zoning Articles – to be addressed after the regular articles are acted

Article 3

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$2,778,750. Should this article be defeated, the operating budget shall be \$2,688,461 which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. Note: Warrant Article 3 (operating budget) does not include warrant articles. Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 3, seconded by Pam Arnold. Motion carried.

Article 4

Selectman Gagne made the motion to raise and appropriate \$100,000 for deposit in the Capital Reserve Fund already established for the purchase of Highway Vehicles, as shown on the Capital Improvement Plan, and to fund this appropriation by authorizing the transfer of that amount from the unexpended fund balance (surplus) as of December 31, 2005, seconded by Pam Arnold. This is a special warrant article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article).

Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 4. Motion carried.

Article 5

Selectman Gagne made the motion to raise and appropriate \$100,000 for deposit in the Capital Reserve Fund already established for the purchase and maintenance of Fire Department Equipment and Apparatus, and to fund this appropriation by authorizing the transfer of that amount from the unexpended fund balance (surplus) as of December 31, 2005, seconded by Pam Arnold. This is a special warrant article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 5. Motion carried.

Article 6

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$290,000 for Highway Road Construction, of which at least \$25,000 will be used for overlaying roads. This appropriation will be non-lapsing for 2 years or until the project is complete, which ever comes first. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 6. Motion carried.

Article 7

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 to be placed in the Industrial Park Capital Reserve Fund. This amount is equivalent to the amount of income from the Town's Industrial Park rent for the communications tower and from the sale of park lots during 2005. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 7, seconded by Pam Arnold. Motion carried.

Article 8

The motion to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the Milton Police Department Building for the purpose of construction or renovation of a building as a police station for the Town of Milton, as shown in the Capital Improvement Plan, including the use of the fund as matching funds for grants that may become available, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$285,000 for deposit in that account, and to fund this appropriation by authorizing the transfer of that amount from the unexpended fund balance (surplus) as of December 31, 2005, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from that fund was made by Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried. To be placed on the ballot as written.

Chief McGowan announced that the Police Department would be having an open house on voting day, March 14. All are invited.

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 8. Motion carried.

Article 9

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 for deposit in the Milton/Maine Bridges Capital Reserve Account already established. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 9. Motion carried.

Article 10

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40,000 for deposit in the Ambulance Vehicles and Equipment and/or Fire Department Vehicles Capital Reserve Fund, and to fund this appropriation by authorizing the transfer of that sum from the Ambulance and Fire Equipment Special Revenue Fund. This is a special warrant article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 10. Motion carried.

Article 11

The motion to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the Milton Fire Department Vehicles for the purpose of repairs and improvements to the fire vehicles, including the use of the fund as matching funds for grants that may become available, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 for deposit in that account and to authorize the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from that fund was made by Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 11, seconded by Pam Arnold. Motion carried.

Article 12

Nancy Johnson, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to be placed in the Milton Free Public Library Capital Reserve Fund already established, as shown in the Capital Improvement Plan. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 12. Motion carried

Article 13

The motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$26,000 for the purpose of purchasing a police department vehicle as shown on the town's Capital Improvement Plan was made by Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

The motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 13 was made by Selectman Gagne and seconded by Pam Arnold. Motion carried.

Moderator Lessard made an announcement that Candidates Night would be Wednesday, March 8 at 7 pm at the Emma Ramsey Center. All are invited.

Article 14

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to adopt the provisions of RSA 31:95-c to restrict 100% of revenues from Police Detail to expenditures for the purpose of paying all related costs for such police details. Such revenues and expenditures shall be accounted for in a special revenue fund to be known as the Police Detail Special Revenue Fund, separate from the general fund. Any surplus in said fund shall not be deemed part of the general fund accumulated surplus and shall be expended only after a vote by the legislative body to appropriate a specific amount from said fund for a specific purpose related to the purpose of the fund or source of the revenue. Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 14. Motion carried.

Article 15

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to adopt the provisions of RSA 31:95-c to restrict 100% of revenues from revenues generated at the Town's transfer station (such as from the sale of recyclables, i.e. aluminum, glass, metals, paper, and any other revenue generating material) to expenditures for the purpose of paying for upgrades and improvements to the equipment and property at the Town's Transfer Station. Such revenues and expenditures shall be accounted for in a special revenue fund to be known as the Milton Transfer Station Special Revenue Fund, separate from the general fund. Any surplus in said fund shall not be deemed part of the general fund accumulated surplus and shall be expended only after a vote by the legislative body to appropriate a specific amount from said fund for a specific purpose related to the purpose of the fund or source of the revenue. Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 15. Motion carried. .

Article 16

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 for the development of an impact fee ordinance for the Town of Milton, and to fund this appropriation by authorizing the transfer of that amount from the unexpended fund balance (surplus) as of December 31, 2005. This appropriation will be non-lapsing for 2 years or until the project is complete, which ever comes first. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 16. Motion carried.

Article 17

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to change the classification of Branch Hill Road beginning at the southerly end of the wetland to the Wakefield border to a point at the southerly end of Map 8, Lot 19, from a Class A Trail (RSA 231-A) to a Class VI road closed "subject to gates and bars". (This would be revising the decision of the 2004 Town Meeting to change this section of road from a Class VI road to a Class A trail). Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Selectman Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 17. Motion carried.

There was some discussion on the Zoning Articles. However, they cannot be changed.

Motion to adjourn was made by Selectman Gagne and seconded by Bob Srnec. Moderator Lessard declared the meeting adjourned at 3 pm.

Selectmen's Report 2006

The year 2006 was a very busy and challenging one. We have addressed a variety of issues ranging from road issues to dealing with the EPA on the Applebee Road landfill. The May flood presented its own unique challenges, causing many road washouts, property damage, and the loss of the bridge on Allen Hastings Way. This created a certain amount of uncertainty on planned road projects, as some of the funds for those projects were used to reopen and repair roads damaged by the flooding. Thanks to the hard work, meticulous documentation and record keeping by the Public Works, Fire and Police Departments, a vast majority of those funds were recovered from FEMA.

We have had some personnel changes this year as well. After interviewing several applicants we hired a new full time "Building Inspector/Code Enforcement Officer", and a new full time "Land Use Clerk" We are very happy to report that both of these individuals are doing extremely well, and are a great asset to the town of Milton.

This Board of Selectmen has also embarked on two new endeavors this year as well. The first being the creation of a new committee, the "Cost of Community Services Committee". The charge of this committee is to find a way to help stabilize the cost of services within the community, through a balanced approach to Land Preservation, Commercial/Industrial, and Residential Development. The second being, working on Team Building, with the assistance of a professional from Primex. As a result of the team building efforts we have been having regular department head meetings, where all department heads sit in a round table discussion and exchange ideas and concerns.

We were able to complete some of the planned road projects. The new police station is well under way, and should be completed soon. The lots in the industrial park are continuing to sell and it is nearly full. The old town office has been sold, and now houses a commercial electrical firm. The new Impact Fee ordinance has been written and is on the ballot for voter approval.

Throughout the year we have kept a very close eye on the bottom line of the budget. Thanks to the hard work and frugal efforts of all department heads, we were able to finish out the year with a very strong financial standing. We have spent many long hours and a lot of hard work to present a responsible fair budget for the upcoming year as well.





This year we had our share of challenges. The Mother's Day floods really set us back as far as work we had planned for this year. I think everyone involved with the disaster did a great job. It showed that we can all pull together when times get tough. I would like to thank all the citizens who came out to volunteer during this time. You are truly citizens of the year. I would also like to thank all the contractors who made themselves available during this time to help get the roads passable for emergency vehicles. Grounds and buildings crew for the great job they do keeping the Town looking great and the lighting of the trees for the holidays. All Land Enterprises for their help decorating the Milton Mills tree.

Public Works Department 2006 Solid Waste Report

The Solid Waste Department has had tough year. We have had two increases in disposal fees this year that were not expected. The budget was set for \$ 59.00 per ton and starting January 1, 2007 our rate for trash will be \$75.00 per ton. The difference is \$16.00 per ton. This is a \$12,000 increase in just trash disposal fees. We brought in approximately 700 tons of household trash in 2006.

Our Bulky fees are going to be about \$80.00 per ton up \$8.00 from 2006. We brought in approximately 400 tons of bulky waste; this increase will be about \$3,200 over last year.

We now have to separate dropoff locations for electronics and cell phones, this is an added cost. Disposal fees next year will increase approximately \$30,000.00 if we average the same tonnage as 2006.

I have taken some of the small items, such as bags and stickers, out of the budget and sell them to the public at cost, to try to help lower the cost of the solid waste station. The money received for these items purchase them for the next year. The money received for bulky items help with disposal fees and items needed at the transfer station, and maintenance of the equipment.

My plan for 2007 is to move the trash compactors up back and get everything in one location. I welcome any suggestion or ideas you may have to make this service better or more economic.

Thank you for your support and I look forward to serving you in 2007.

Milton Police Department 2006

This has been an exciting and eventful year for your police department. Most of all the planning and current construction of our new facility has us all looking forward to our future. We want to thank all of you for supporting us in accomplishing this major undertaking. We also must thank the board of selectman and all the local contractors that are working on this project. As most of you realize completing this project within the \$285,000.00 budget would be difficult. However we have managed to do this with the help of Paey Construction, Forest Well and Pump, Crown Point Survey, J&S Electric and most of all Frizzells Construction for doing this project for little to no profit. I can't believe we could have done this without their generosity. That's why it pays to do business with our local businesses. I hope you will keep this in mind if you require services. We also have been at full staff most of the year and filled our new position just prior to the end of the year. We should be fully staffed after our newest officer completes his training late next spring.

Our calls for service have increased in not only volume but more serious crimes as well. We have seen a rise in serious crimes this year we have dealt with a couple child abuse and neglect cases as well as more crimes involving weapons. We have also seen an increase in Juvenile crime again. We have good reason to believe that we have gang activity in town and plan on focusing our efforts this year on stopping that. We currently have applied for a grant for an additional position that will be a Juvenile service officer. This grant pays for the position for four years. This will be a great way to add to our agency at minimal cost to the taxpayers. As always we have continued to focus on traffic problems, crimes against property and domestic violence. As always we will continue to find ways to reduce the burden on our taxpayers. Grants are the best way to do this and we spend as much time as possible reviewing grant programs that we can apply for. Over the last few years we have benefited from several grants such as upgrading radio equipment and the 'car 54' project. This two grants alone gave us over \$100,000 in equipment. Without any impact on your tax bill.

Most of all I need to thank our employees for doing their jobs to the best of their abilities. We should all be proud of how many long term employees we now have in our department. This is a direct effect of being able to bring their wages to a more realistic rate then they were three years ago.

Your continued support will help us keep Milton a great place to live and raise a family!

As you can see, we are still doing a lot of runs with the ever changing responsibilities of the Fire Service. The Mothers Day Flood was actually an Emergency Management event. As the Emergency Management Director, it is my responsibility to look out for the safety of all residents and do what is in the best interest of all involved to reduce and control hazards. I am sure that some who had to sacrifice are not happy that the dam was not released. We could not do a control release of the dam. The water had come up faster than boards could be pulled. We had trained in the event of a major flooding event and knew that the Milton Dam would hold back whatever we threw at it. Plans are in affect for dam failures located above us. These were extremely helpful in the preparation of the rise of water. Brooks turned into rivers, streams turned into ponds and rivers turned into lakes. We received 16 inches of rain in a short period of time. If we did a full release of the Milton Dam, we would have lost homes in Milton and the ripple effect down stream would have been catastrophic. I hope this helps for all to understand what we were up against. Thank You for all of the kind letters of support and the generosity of the residents of Milton for the food and offers of help.

This year there is a bond for a new Fire Station. We established a committee of Fire personnel and Milton residents to come up with a plan that would serve the town for years to come and alleviate the over crowding and safety of the existing equipment. The State Fire Marshall did an inspection of the station two years ago and found numerous safety violations. Part of the building was immediately closed due to the lack of exits and a list was given to bring it up to code. It is not feasible to do the biggest part of the code violations. Adding fire doors where it is impossible to open them without major building renovations is probably the biggest obstacle. The original building was constructed in the early 1800's and it has been added onto at least 4 times. I understand that taxes are high but we will not be able to occupy this building after the March meeting without the code violations repaired. Please help us to help you.

This year we replaced the 1960 Ladder Truck with a 1985 Model that we received on a bid process from Somersworth. The total cost when fully stocked will be around \$30,000. The truck was refurbished with numerous volunteer hours by members of the department to save, you the taxpayers money. Since it went in service, it has responded to three Chimney Fires and numerous other calls.

A special Thank you Dan Thibaudeau and 6T Laundry for the donation of the commercial washing machine for the washing of Fire and Ambulance gear, thus saving the community thousands of dollars. We appreciate it.

A special Thank you to all the members who sacrifice a lot of time from their families to serve the Townspeople of Milton.

The town has hired the firm of Wil Corcoran and Associates to act as the Town's contract Assessor and provide the day to day assessment services for the town. They review all new homes, changes in buildings, and divisions of land throughout the year and assist the Board of Selectmen in carrying out their statutory assessing duties.

The Assessing Office continues to update the tax maps, property cards, blind exemptions, elderly exemptions and veterans tax credits on an annual basis.

The purpose of the assessing office is to be sure that when property taxes are levied that they treat everyone fairly. To do this they work to make sure that our information is as accurate as possible. Taxpayers are advised to review the tax maps and their assessment cards for accuracy and advise the Assessing Office of any discrepancies.

Recreation 2006 Report

The Recreation Department has gone through some changes this year starting with a new Recreation Director. Christine Collins started as the Director for Milton Recreation at the end of March.

The Recreation Department offers many programs and events, but the biggest and most successful program is Camp Three Ponds Summer Youth Camp for ages 5-11 and is held at Milton Town Beach. The camp averages about 70 participants and is 8 weeks long. We revamped the program to be more exciting and entertaining for the children with Red Carpet Day, Fear Factor Day, Weekly field trips, and plenty of relay races. The camp expanded by adding CIT's (Counselors in Training) to the program. This program was geared for 12 and up and helped give the older children something to participate in. Plans for 2007 include a Teen Adventure Camp (ages 12-16), CIT Program (Ages 15-16), and of course Camp Three Ponds (Ages 5-11).

The Town Beach area and Lockhart Field were utilized a lot this year. This included school and recreational baseball, school softball, Seacoast Men's Senior Baseball League, business and church outings, fishing derbies, non-profit group gatherings, birthday parties...The beach gatehouse documented 168 sold beach passes as well as payment for 2535 children, 4093 adults and 283 boat launches.

Special Events in 2006 included:

Spring:

An Easter Egg Hunt was held at the Town Beach Field for 3 different age groups. It was a wet and extremely windy day, but we had around 25 children participate.

Summer:

A Hershey Track Team was established this year. Jess Cutter and Christine Collins coached a team of around 8 participants that competed in Rochester. We are hoping that in 2007 there will bring even more participants to compete for Milton.

Arts' n the Park program offered musicians, storytellers, and magicians on Wednesday mornings that were greatly enjoyed by beach visitors and summer camp participants.

Summer Kick-Off and Town Wide Yard Sale were enjoyed by all. We had a great day. The ATV Raffle was postponed until Winter Carnival 2007 because of low raffle ticket sales.

Fall:

Our Soccer program was filled with 75 participants and included ages 3-12. The age group 3-5 had 16 participants and was enjoyed by an age group that is often left out of programming. Any other ideas you have to offer programs for this age group is greatly appreciated.

A co-sponsored Halloween Café was held at the Emma Ramsey Community Center with Nute Library. There were soup, sandwiches, punch, kitty litter cake, and snacks offered, along with activities for the children to participate in and door prizes were drawn every 15 minutes. Around 100 children registered for the Costume Contest where trophies were awarded to the best costume and most original in three different age categories.

Winter:

14th Annual Winter Carnival with snowmobile racing, fishing derby, ice skating, human sled dog race, food and lots of community spirit.

Our Basketball Program had 63 participants and opened to grades K-6th.

A Coaches Clinic was offered to all the basketball coaches from NHCoachSmart. All Coaches will now be required to take this Clinic in order to coach for Milton Recreation.

Daily Events in 2006 included:

Senior Bingo every Tuesday (60-73 participants), Sunday Senior Bingo (20-30 participants). Senior Meal once a month through Nute Parent Teacher Student Group, Breakfast Bingo and Meals through Strafford Nutrition Program at least once a month (30-40 participants), Holiday party for seniors with Nute Elementary School Students visiting, singing and giving gifts.

Tai Chi Classes every Wednesday

Pilates/Yoga and Low impact aerobics every Thursday and Friday

Movie Night once a month

Milton Recreation is always looking to start new programs. Anything you as resident would like to see, please contact Milton Recreation. Your input is always welcomed and with your help we can offer quality, well attended programs. We have had to cancel some programs in the past due to poor attendance. My goal for 2007 is that fewer programs are cancelled and more are created. All new and ongoing programs are advertised in the Town Newsletter, The Gazette, and also on the Town of Milton website under Recreation. Check out these valuable resources so you know what is going on in your Town.

The Recreation Commission and Recreation Director wish to thank those who have helped to make recreational programming and offerings successful. It is through the generous commitment of time from volunteers that makes most of these things possible. Thank you!

The Library trustees for the year 2006 were: Les Elder (Chair), Justin Mayrand (Treasurer), and Jennifer Palmatier (Secretary). The Library Director was Megan Sprague, and the two assistants are: Mariette McHale and Genevieve Palmatier. Amy Cornwell continues to be our most active volunteer, as this was her third year of service.

Friends of the Milton Free Public Library Chair was Susann Foster Brown while Bette White was the treasurer. Kathy Chatt maintained the website while trustee, Justin Mayrand acted as the library's technical service volunteer.

Circulation and patronage remained consistent with the year 2006. There were 2437 visits to the library overall. There were 2599 checkouts in all. The library received the Children's Literacy Foundation grant, supplemented by the Friends. This means that in addition to the library's material additions from its budget, over \$1300.00 worth of high quality, hard cover children's books were added. Meetings and groups continued to convene at the library, including an Alcoholics Anonymous meeting for men and home school group with children and moms. In addition to this grant and patron donations, the library purchased 482 new items with its budget. Materials include: books, CDs, DVDs, and Video Tapes.

The library would like to extend a special thank you for its generous monetary donations received throughout the year during our Friends' yearly mailing, the Milton Community Reads Program, and donations received during Election Day. The library would also like to thank the DiMambro family for their donations during the Treasure Trove program. And most emphatically, the library would like to thank Deadre D'Addeo for her amazing work during the children's summer reading program, as well as her continued efforts with children's programming though the year.

The following information denotes the library's rich history as well as the amazing history of the library building itself. The following information was compiled by an assortment of people who work together volunteering at the library and can be found on our website: www.miltonfreepubliclibrary.org. The following writing has been taken directly from this place:

Early Settlement of Milton and Milton Mills

Milton is in the north eastern section of Strafford County and consists of 27,000 acres. Milton was originally known as the Northeast Parish (part of Rochester). Milton was incorporated June 11, 1802. Many of the original settlers in Milton came from local area towns such as, Dover, Madbury, Rochester.

Milton Mills, which is part of Milton, is located six miles north of Milton and two miles east of Route 125 on the Salmon Falls River. It was once called Shapleigh Mills. Milton Mills was an industrial town which had several saw mills, a crude woolen mill, and a distillery where whiskey was manufactured from potatoes. The woolen mill was later purchased and transformed into a lathe and turning mill. In 1847, the mill was purchased by John Townsend and used for the manufacturing of fine flannel. In 1872, Henry H. Townsend built The Miltonia Mills on the Salmon Falls River and specialized in the manufacturing of fine wool blankets. The blankets were used by Admiral Peary when he discovered the North Pole, and also by Admiral Richard Byrd on his exploration of the Antarctic. The Miltonia Mills operated until 1950 when it went bankrupt and was purchased by Green Tannery.

A block printing business was built by Edward Brierly in 1850. It later became a felt mill and a shoe factory. The shoe factory operated into the 1920's but failed during the Depression.

In the late 1800's Milton Mills had four shoe factories, two woolen mills, one felt mill, one carriage shop, many saw mills, a hotel, a tin smith shop, about five general stores, an ice cream parlor, a fruit store, a grain store and a drug store. (Source: Biographical History of the Town of Milton, 1976 and MFPL website) The Little Red School House was built during this industrial period of Milton Mills. Educating first through high school, the building was an integral part of the community. Today, as the Milton Free Public Library, it remains a significant part of the village.



The Milton Free Public Library is affectionately known as the "Little Red School House" by the residents of Milton and Milton Mills.

The Little Red School House has always been a source of pride in Milton Mills. While part of Milton, Milton Mills is and always has been a village with a different sense of community than Milton. As in the past with its early industry and social life, Milton Mills is a village in which everything is just a short walk away. Within a small vicinity one can find: a general store, a guitar shop, a bridal dress store, Branch Hill Farm, a post office, the Milton Free Public Library, a park next to the Salmon Falls River dam built by Samuel Palmer around 1784, and many home occupations. The Little Red School House remains a unique feature of Milton Mills; with its unique architecture of the "Second Empire" style, its bell tower and its central location.

Below is a timeline of important events in the history of this building.

- 1875** - The school was built for grade and high school students in Milton Mills.
- 1902** - The school became the local grade school. The high school students went to Nute High School in Milton.
- 1958** - After Christmas vacation, grade school students and furniture was moved to the Milton Grade School. As a result there was a special town meeting. The parents of the grade school students did not want the school closed and their children bused to Milton. As a result, the Milton Mills grade school remained open.
- 1975** - Centennial celebrations were held for the school. The school got a face lift, and was painted red for the first time. At this point in time, the grade school only held grades first through third.
- 1988** - The Town of Milton again tried to close the grade school. Again there was a special town meeting and the grade school remained open.
- 1991** - The grade school closed.
- 1992** - The schoolhouse was opened as The Milton Free Public Library.
- 2001** - The NH Division of Historical Resources recommended the library building be eligible for the state and national Historic Registers.
The foundation was stabilized and the building received a coat of paint and a new furnace.
- 2005** - Repairs were made for water damage from a burst pipe (winter 2003). The second story support was strengthened and the first floor got a new tin ceiling.

Conservation Commission 2006

New Hampshire State statute RSA 36A clearly mandates the purposes and powers of our State's Conservation Commissions. The following are the mandates the law gives to the Commission: "Protect and encourage the proper use of local resources: protect watershed areas; conduct research on the use of local land and water areas; seek to coordinate local conservation groups; establish an index of open space and wetlands areas with information as to their proper and best use (Natural Resource Inventory)."

Conservation Planning: Milton's Master Plan states several policy goals directly related to conservation planning. Policy Goal #3 states: *"Protect Milton's significant open space areas and natural resources by promoting sustainable development, supporting and utilizing tools for land protection, and raising public awareness of conservation practices."*

The following are some of the pro-active planning initiatives the Conservation Commission has undertaken to fulfill the conservation policy goals as stated in Milton's Master Plan:

Cost of Community Service Study: With the Selectmen's approval, the Conservation Commission applied for and received a grant to have a Cost of Community Service Study (CCSS) performed for Milton by Innovative Natural Resource Solutions in 2005. The results show that residential development costs Milton more in services than the taxes it generates. Commercial/Industrial development and Open Space bring in positive tax revenue. The Conservation Commission presented the CCSS findings to the Planning Board and Selectmen, resulting in a CCSS committee appointed by the Selectmen.

The CCSS committee meets regularly, and is busy developing planning initiatives for the best fiscal interests of our town based on these economic facts. Many of these initiatives are designed to protect priority open space areas in the town. The CCSS has also proposed three conservation related ordinances to the Planning Board: The Conservation Overlay District and The Transfer of Development Rights Ordinance.

Moose Mountains' Regional Greenways (MMRG) awarded New Hampshire's Estuaries Grant (NHEP): Milton as one of MMRG's towns will receive further conservation planning assistance from MMRG with funding provided by NHEP. Moose Mountains Regional Greenways' Director of Land Conservation, Cynthia Belowski met with the Conservation Commission to ask for our support for a grant application to the New Hampshire Estuaries Project. MMRG was recently notified that it is the recipient of grant money for outreach and education to implement the Coastal Watershed Plan, with special emphasis given to Milton, Middleton, and Farmington. MMRG's staff will be working with Milton's Conservation Commission to identify local conservation priorities and will help develop action steps.

Natural Resource Outreach Coalition (NROC): The Conservation Commission has invited NROC to present to the Conservation Commission and the Cost of Community Service Study Committee their program for conservation based land use planning.

Strafford Regional Planning Commission:

Projects or initiatives conducted for Milton include the following:

Developed Hazard Mitigation Maps and prepared Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Created maps for Sand & Gravel Extraction Overlay District, Groundwater Protection District and Shoreland Protection Zone.

Prepared a draft Co-occurrence map.

Provided a draft documents of a conservation overlay district, a wildlife district and conservation subdivision regulation.

2006 Conservation Projects:

Milton's Conservation Fund: The Conservation Fund has enabled the Conservation Commission to assist landowners of strategic natural resource areas in Milton in pursuing voluntary land protection projects. These conservation projects fulfill Milton's Master Plan objectives to protect Milton's strategic water resources, forestlands, wildlife habitat, and farmland with the multiple benefits of ensuring clean air and water, recreational opportunities, and preserving Milton's scenic beauty and the unique rural character of its communities. Milton's Conservation Commission is working with several landowners in Milton to help them place easements on their property, and has utilized the Conservation Fund to help pay for the many expenses associated with placing land in conservation easements. Milton's Conservation Fund balance is \$67,645.49.

Mary Current donated to Milton's Conservation Commission a 17 acre easement on her horse farm on Mason Rd. Milton Conservation Commission voted to utilize \$1,614 from the Conservation Fund to help defray some of the legal expenses associated with putting her land in a conservation easement. The 17 acres of fields and forests are contiguous with other conservation land.

Preserving Teneriffe Mountain – Efforts are ongoing to place the 105 acre farm owned by Steve Panish under conservation easement. This farm includes the top of Teneriffe and 30 acres of blueberry fields, as well as 65 acres of forest. The CC and BOS voted to approve \$25,000 from the Conservation Fund as part of the match required by the Farm and Ranchland Protection Program, which is funding part of the project. An additional \$27,000 remains to be raised. Preserving Teneriffe is defined as a conservation priority in the Milton Master Plan. Much of the Panish property is also identified as a core focus area of the Land Conservation Plan for Coastal Watersheds.

Other Initiatives:

Met with Selectmen to recommend revisions and updates on Milton's complaint form and process.

Met with Selectmen to recommend revisions and updates to Milton's building permit application.

Advised Planning Board to ensure that developers abide by the New Hampshire Timber Harvesting Laws, especially those pertaining to **Land Conversion/Development Harvesting** as cited in the *Guide to Timber Harvesting Laws* Publication as a condition for acceptance of applications.

Cemetery Trustee Report 2006

We have completed work on our By-Laws and continue to work closely with the Milton Mills Cemetery Association to determine an arrangement which will fulfill the requirement in RSA 289 for the Town of Milton to provide a cemetery for its residents. In addition, we have developed procedures to follow when coordinating burials within Milton graveyards. This past year we have coordinated three burials at the Prospect Hill Cemetery.

As in previous years, the Trustees of the Trust Fund invested monies left for perpetual care for persons buried in seventeen cemeteries. This past year the Trust Fund gave \$1465.09 to the town for this care. Some of these gravesites also have money designated for flowers, for Memorial Day, which are ordered and placed on the graves by the Cemetery Trustees.

We are aware of 94 cemeteries in the local Milton area. Two of them, Hayes and the Milton Mills Cemetery are privately owned and maintained. One, Prospect Hill, is actually located just across the river from Milton in Lebanon, Maine; but is maintained by the Town of Milton, per a warrant article approved by Milton voters several years ago. Recently, we were advised of another old cemetery which is located near the Shortridge Academy on Governor's Road. Although much data has been collected on our cemeteries, information on some of these old cemeteries is limited. If anyone has knowledge or records of any cemeteries in our area please contact us and help us ensure that the records we have are as accurate as possible. We have been able to record a GPS location on all but two of these cemeteries.

During the year the Public Works Dept maintains about half of these cemeteries. Maintenance primarily consists of mowing, weedwacking, raking, and leafblowing. To assist in this effort we are establishing an adopt-a-cemetery program. The administrative framework is pretty well in place, so we are ready to proceed with the program. We are charged with the duties of maintaining the official voter Checklist for the Town of Milton. A working knowledge of the Elections laws for federal, state, town and school district is essential to performing our duties with professionalism. We pride ourselves in maintaining our professional knowledge to carry out our duties and to be able to advise others of theirs.

The year of 2006 has been an extremely busy one for your Supervisors of the Checklist! The scope of our duties has considerably expanded, due to the implementation of the federal *Help America Vote Act (HAVA)* by the State of New Hampshire. Karen and Rosemary attended training to be certified by the state to enable us to enter information into the statewide database. Although the majority of the information does not appear on the public Checklist, we are now required to input far more complex data for each registered voter, which is considerably more time consuming. Our preliminary data project was converted into the state's system, however, we have the ongoing project of entering the additional data that is required. We have much work ahead of us and we are working towards compliance with *HAVA*.

Our State General Elections on November 7th brought in 99 new registrants to the polling area, who registered and voted on that day. This shows us that the population of Milton is dramatically increasing, because we have a relatively small percentage of people who are deleted, due to their registering to vote in another town or being deceased. In "polling" other cities and towns, it was determined that Milton's new registrations for that day far exceeded that of neighboring polling districts! Wow!

We welcomed Lea Dill, who was elected as a Supervisor in March. Bob Ferris continues to serve as our Pro-Tem to assist us in accommodating the schedules of our full-time jobs and other commitments.

Vote! It's an honor, a privilege and your right! Vote!

CHANCES would like to take this opportunity and thank the Town of Milton for generously supporting our agency in 2006. We sincerely appreciate your support and enjoyed working with the youth and families of Milton. We look forward to continuing our collaborative efforts and providing services to the families of Milton.

Our Mission:

CHANCES is dedicated to providing opportunities for youngsters who have broken the law to be responsible for their actions without becoming further involved in the judicial system and to further court sanctions of those who have become involved with the judicial system. The goal of the program is to significantly increase the juvenile offenders awareness of his/her inappropriate actions and reduce further incidents of delinquency.

We operate from a balanced and restorative justice philosophy, based in reparation of harm to victims and community, teaching competency skills through psycho educational programming and community service and reducing, possibly obliterating recidivism.

Our Mission is accomplished by the following services:

CHANCES provides prevention and intervention through psycho educational programs. Our Programs include Conflict Resolution, Skills for Managing Anger, The Challenge Course for Drug and Alcohol prevention, the Insight Program for Drug and Alcohol intervention, The Y.E.S. Shoplifters program, A Fire Setters Intervention Program, Tobacco Education, Staying Connected With Your Teen (Parenting Teens Wisely) Boys and Girls Life Skills Education, Homework Support, and monitored Community Service sites for youth to give back and be invested in their town. Trained Family Mediators provide mediation services for families, which allow families to open the lines of communication and creates positive changes for all members of a Household. We have found our family mediation services to be highly effective.

CHANCES collaborates and shares resources with other organizations in the community to educate, increase cooperation provide support and services to assure the success of youth and families and increase community safety.

In 2006, CHANCES provided services to 22 youth and their families in Milton. 28% of the referrals came from the police department, 18% from the school, 2% from physicians, 34% from the court, 2% from DC YF, 12% from parents and 4% from other agencies. Financially, our program is cost effective (Our cost per child in 2006 was less than \$650.00. Additional Savings were realized to Milton providing direct referrals from police as \$1,725.00 per 20 juveniles).

To date, CHANCES has a **93% success** rate or a 7% recidivism rate. This translates to 20.4 out of the 22 juveniles were served in 2006 will not re-offend or commit a crime in your community.

Rochester/Rural District VNA & Hospice 2006

Rochester District VNA (Your VNA) continues to serve as your home health agency providing skilled nursing, rehabilitative therapies, medical social work, licensed nursing assistants and supportive services on an intermittent basis throughout your community. We are proud to provide you with highly skilled and well trained clinicians.

Home health care in southern New Hampshire has seen significant reductions in our Medicare reimbursement in 2006 with additional reductions scheduled for 2007. This is the result of our being removed from the Boston wage market and the fact that home care received no market basket adjustment in 2006. Our town funding assists in covering about 20% of the losses we incur providing Medicaid, HCBC, and support services. The remaining 80% of the deficit was historically covered by our Medicare surplus. That surplus is now essentially non-existent.

As a result of these reductions, we are refocusing our services on those clients needing the skilled services of a certified and licensed agency. This will reduce certain services that can be provided less expensively by other non-licensed agencies. We continue to invest in the education of our staff, ensuring each and everyone is prepared with the skills necessary to provide you or your family with the care required by the complicated health issues we now see in the home. We continue to provide support services through Title XX and Strafford County funding along with privately paid services.

Telehealth has been slow to take hold, but we are making progress and see this as an important way to improve outcomes for our patients and as a way to prudently reduce the total number of visits. We are well established in the use of the electronic chart achieving the following important results: improved clinical efficiency and accuracy of documentation, flow of data to appropriate disciplines at the time most needed, ease of viewing historical data, improved coordination of care, decreased man hours with less manual paper processes and a reduction of errors. We have been able to reduce office staff as we have improved in utilization of our technology, thus saving dollars.

Our biggest and most critical challenge is being dependent on the government for 85% of our revenue. We are unable to set charges for services. We are dependent of what the government pays regardless of the cost to provide the care. As such, your continued support of Rochester District Visiting Nurse Association (Your VNA) is crucial for us to meet the many health needs in your community.

Strafford Regional Planning Commission 2006

Strafford Regional Planning Commission (SRPC), a political subdivision of the State of New Hampshire, serves in an advisory role to the Town of Milton and seventeen other member communities. We provide professional planning services to help officials, boards and citizens to manage growth and facilitate regional collaborative efforts.

SRPC's professional staff offers a range of planning services in transportation, land use, conservation, economic development, downtown revitalization and geographic information systems (GIS) mapping and analysis. These services are available in customized modes to meet the diverse needs of the volunteers who are the foundation of communities. Our member communities also have access to additional SRPC educational resources including our website, newsletter, "HOW TO" guides, workshops, forums and personalized training.

SRPC conducted the following projects and initiatives for Milton in 2006:

- Collected and compiled traffic count data for Milton roads.
- Developed Hazard Mitigation maps for the Town of Milton
- Developed base maps for a school in Milton.
- Developed shoreland protection, groundwater protection and gravel extraction maps for the Town of Milton.
- Provided professional assistance to land use boards and committees in Town, including a customized model conservation subdivision.
- Provided Land Use Clerk training for new employee.
- Contracted with Town to develop Impact Fee Ordinance.

SRPC also provided the following services to Milton and other municipalities in 2006 including:

- Completed a regional land conservation plan with our partners that will help community leaders to identify local conservation priorities and understand how they fit into a regional context.
- Secured local match to federal coastal and transportation funds for local and regional planning and construction projects.
- Mapped census and GIS data.
- Distributed NH Land Use planning books.
- Maintained websites for SRPC and the Seacoast Metropolitan (Transportation) Planning Organization.

Cost of Community Services Study Committee 2006 Report

The Cost of Community Services Study Committee (CCSSC) was formed in May 2006. The Selectmen created the committee to work in response to a recommendation of the Cost of Community Services Study completed in September 2005. The original charge to the committee follows:

“The Milton Cost of Community Services Study Committee will produce recommendations for promoting balanced growth among residential, commercial / industrial, and open space/conservation land uses in order to more closely balance the Town’s revenues and expenses so the Town’s property tax burden becomes more stabilized. These recommendations will include policies, programs, and processes and mechanisms based upon analyzed data.”

We have held more than a fifteen working meetings and contributed well over 240 collective volunteer hours to the project to date. We have additional recommendations that tie into work being done by the Planning Board and Conservation Commission and will offer our work on those items as well. The Committee has set our priorities for action for the Town Vote in early 2007 as described below:

(zoning revision) - Article VI: Low Density Zone -- change from 1 1/2 to 2 acres and frontage from 150 ft. to 200 ft.
(new zoning) - Conservation District - Ordinance
(new zoning) - Transfer of Development Rights - Ordinance

Our committee meetings are regularly held on a Wednesday each month at the Ramsey Center and are open to the public; the notes distributed widely via email and posted on the town web site. We believe that our recommended changes (so far!) can help:

Reduce municipal costs.
Protect and enhance property owners’ equity.
Stabilize the town’s revenues/expenses.
Protect critical environments and establish a regulatory process for review and advice as covered under RSA 483:B (shorelands) and 474:55 (wetlands) where none had existed previously.

The committee membership is Bruce Woodruff, Tom Gray, Emery Booska, Cynthia Wyatt, Cherie Corbett, Charlie Karcher, Steve Frisselle, Brian DiMambro, Roger Burkhart, Ellen Lankhorst, Larry Brown, and Susann Brown. Other members from the community have attended from time to time and offered valuable input. Our work is ongoing. We look forward to working with the other Boards and Commissions to promote progressive, positive change for our town and its residents.

Northern Strafford County Health and Safety Council 2006 Report

The Town of Milton and the Northern Strafford County Health and Safety Council (NSCHSC) celebrated its third year of public health partnership in 2006.

Milton Town Administrator, Mr. Christopher Rose continued his service as the Milton representative to governing board. Mr. Rose is very knowledgeable in municipal government and policy. He is a wonderful asset. The organization looks forward to strengthening our working relationship with Mr. Rose and other residents of Milton in 2007.

2006 was a busy year for the organization in the areas of planning and programs. In January, the organization completed a strategic planning process which formalized our mission, vision and objectives of the organization. Our new mission: *To improve and protect the public health and well being of residents in the region through the facilitation of diverse organizations, institutions, and community residents that collaborate in the enhancement of clinical and community based systems.* The following is a summary of 2006 programs:

Emergency Preparedness and Planning

Awarded \$88,000 Homeland Security Grant for Local Emergency Operation Plan workshops and regional table top exercise. Milton officials from Fire, Police, School, and Administrative offices participated in a planning workshop and the table top exercise. All Milton overtime and resources used for the training were reimbursable under the grant.

Awarded \$11,000 to draft Cities Readiness Initiative Plan for region. Money will develop mass vaccination plan which will assist Milton residents should a disaster occur that requires broad vaccination or prophylaxis distribution.

Coordinated Regional All Health Hazard Planning Committee and Subcommittees to develop regional public health response plan for avian flu pandemic and other public health emergencies. Awarded \$26,000 Pandemic Planning grant for regional work. Milton is an active participant in this process.

Awarded \$15,000 Citizen Corps Grant to develop regional Northern Strafford County Regional Citizens Reserve Corps. Milton residents are encouraged to contact the NSCHSC at 335-0168 to become a trained volunteer.

Developed and distributed 18,000 pocket guides and flyers for emergency preparedness. Over 2,000 guides were distributed to town hall, library, and police and fire stations.

Completed and distributed Emergency Preparedness Resource guide to local emergency responders and officials.

Provided National Incident Management (NIMS) training to region.

Increased working relationships among home health, Community Health Center, mental health, and education communities for emergency planning.

Public Health Programs

Connected the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services and town leaders for arsenic exposure study in Milton.

Funded revised social services guide for Strafford County (10,000 copies).

Conducted area health assessment and sponsored data summit to examine health of region. Data resource book was distributed to area agencies. Awarded \$6,000 from United Way of the Greater Seacoast and Frisbie Memorial Hospital for development and distribution.

Began Lead Action Coalition to examine lead level exposures in the region and the public health risk for children.

Planning and priority setting for health improvement

Conducted strategic planning in January to develop mission, vision, objectives.

Municipal and Health Provider partners signed a Memorandum Of Understanding for coordinated planning which included shared goals of local government, health care and NSCHSC.

Awarded \$75,000 for ongoing support of NSCHSC.

Milton Wastewater Department 2006 Report

The Wastewater facility treated 20,776,000 gallons of sewage at an average daily flow of 56,920 gallons. We continue to operate around 50% of plant capacity allowing for future growth within the community.

The carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand (CBOD) removal efficiency averaged 94.6% and the total suspended solids (TSS) removal efficiency averaged 95.0% for the year. The minimum acceptable removal efficiency for those two effluent test parameters is 85%. The annual whole effluent toxicity (WET) test passed with no indication of the plant effluent having any toxic effect on the Salmon Falls River. These parameters show that the plant continues to perform exceptionally well and discharges a good quality effluent.

We continue to add a chemical called alum to the raw sewage from April thru Sept. to reduce the amount of total phosphorus being discharged to the river. We have done this for five years with good results. Reducing total phosphorus (TP) is important because it is a vital nutrient for algae growth which causes dissolved oxygen deficiencies in the river. The plant effluent TP averaged 4.63 mgll prior to alum addition and 2.07 mgll with the addition. This represents a 55% reduction to the river.

All plant equipment is operational and in good working condition.

The Board of Sewer Commissioners expended \$21,374.43 from the Maintenance Reserve Fund for the following: A new effluent flow meter, repairs on effluent pump and clean out of town sewer lines.

We applied for a new EPA discharge permit in 2005 and have not heard back regarding the new five-year permit. At this time we don't know if there will be any new effluent limits.

Commissioner Bob Taatjes retired from the Board of Sewer Commissioners in Dec. 2006 after many years of dedicated service. He was instrumental in getting the plant approved, funded and built in 1987. And has continued to help manage the plant since then.

The Trustees are responsible for handling the investments and disbursements of Trusts left to the Town. We are also responsible for the handling of monies voted by the Town to be put in Capital Reserve Accounts. There are some funds of the Water and Sewer Departments that are also handled by the Trustees.

We are still very pleased with our Account with the Citizens Bank called the Concentration Account Program, or CAP Account. The Interest rates have been fairly stable this past year, but we have been advised that they may slowly go down in 2007.

The usual flowers at the two Welcome Signs, the Public Safety Building, the Emma Ramsey Building, the Entrance to the Beach, (outside and inside the gate), the Veterans Memorial Park and the Triangle were again purchased with the interest from the Lockhart Trust Fund. We are looking for organizations or group of people to do the planting of annuals and, of course, doing the weeding next spring and summer. Another purpose of the Lockhart Fund is to provide for the welfare of animals and as usual we supported this cause.

In the year 2006 the interest from the Common School Fund was turned over to the Milton School District. We asked again that some of the interest be given to the Nute High School Music Department and this was honored.

In 2006 the interest from the Cemetery Perpetual Care Trust Fund for individual or family lots was given as usual to the Milton Mills Cemetery Association and the Town of Milton.

The following report contains more detailed information for the year ending 2006. The NH State Reports - MS10 and MS9 will be filed with the State by March 1st, 2007

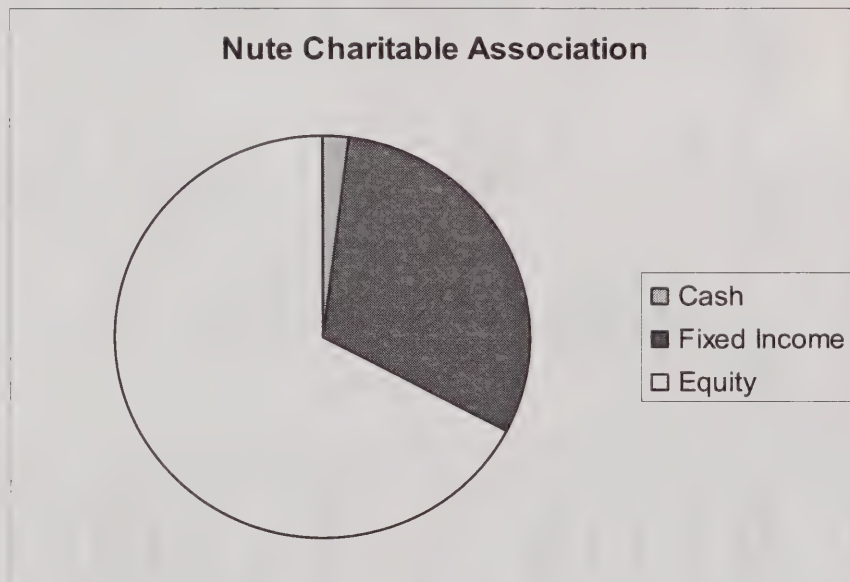
Nute Charitable Association 2006

In the past the Nute Charitable Association was regularly included within the town's Annual Report. It is our hope to have a regular report included in the future.

This year this is a brief report to provide an update on the finances of the organization.

As of November 30, 2006 the fund has a portfolio value of \$ 749,679.37.

Below is a chart showing how their funds are invested.



Tax Collector 2006

This year has been an eye opener for most of us because of the increase in our taxes, as was stated in a letter sent to the Foster's back in December. Since the letter was published in the Foster's, I have become increasingly aware that this person cannot be alone in understanding how our tax rate is achieved. Our tax rate is set by the State of New Hampshire Department of Revenue, based on the work of the Budget Committee, which operates on the budgets requested by the School Board and the Selectmen. For the past several years, the Budget Committee has consistently funded both Town and School at levels below the requested amounts. In 2005 the Town's tax rate had actually decreased from 2004, not accounting for inflation or increased fuel expenses.

In addition, the tax rate is set by the State only in October or November of each year. This means that there is no way for the Town to legally increase or decrease your tax rate into your June tax bill. Therefore what you vote on in March does not get figured into the tax rate until your December bill. So, what you vote on, along with any town/school revenue, are the only two factors in your tax rate. This is the reason that the increases or decreases only show on your December bill. We would all prefer the State to figure our tax rates at a different time of year; between the holidays, the necessity for paying for fuel, and the (usual) tax increases, the December tax bill is always a tough one.

Because Milton is an SB2 town, our deliberative sessions are a very crucial part of your tax bill. It is at these deliberative sessions (one for the school and one for the town) that you as the taxpayer get to voice your concerns and opinions. This is where you get to change dollar amounts on everything that is brought before you in March. I can't stress enough how important it is for the citizens of Milton to become involved in town politics. Right now there are three Boards that are in control of your tax rate. Those boards include the Selectmen, the School Board members, and the Budget Committee. I urge every taxpayer to be more active in what we pay for.

I hope this will help many people understand how the tax rate is accomplished.

Please note that there are always extended hours the week **before** tax bills are due. If my hours are not convenient for you, you may mail your payment in or drop it off in the lock box located outside the office.

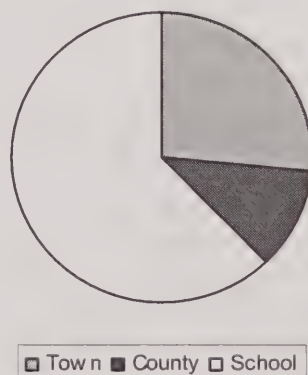

Capital Improvement Plan 2006

The Selectmen and the town departments are continuing to work with the Capital Improvement Plan. The plan, which is listed on the next page, is designed to layout for the residents of the town, and for the staff what large expenditures are expected over the next seven years.

The plan was approved by the voters in 2004. every year the plan is reviewed and updated taking into account items that have been completed and adding the seventh years listing.

In 2005 the voters approved setting some money aside for the funding of the Capital Improvement Plan. There was also a request for a bond to pay for the items listed in the first few years but that fell just a few votes short of the 60% needed to pass. Since that time we have been told that the state laws do not allow the town to proceed with funding for the plan with single questions but rather a number of warrant articles need to be listed so that the voters can approve some and not others. This is why there are a number of questions on the warrant for things like highway trucks, fire vehicles, and building improvements.

The funding that was approved in the past is still being held in a fund for items listed on the Capital Improvement Plan and the Selectmen have committed to only use that money for things that are listed on the plan. Funds were used for some improvements at the Emma Ramsey Center and for the construction of the salt shed. The selectmen plan to be very careful with the funds and only use them for the items that were required.

There is still a strong belief in the benefits of the Capital Improvement Plan in the future. The plan will be reviewed and updated on a regular basis and information on the plan will continue to be made available to the residents of the town.

The first session will consist of explanation, discussion and debate of each of the following warrant articles, and will also afford voters who are present the opportunity to propose, debate and adopt amendments to warrant articles, except those articles whose wording is prescribed by state law.

Second Session

The second session of the annual town meeting, to elect town officers by official ballot and to vote on all warrant articles as they may have been amended at the first session, will be held on Tuesday, March 13, 2007 at the Emma Ramsey Center. Polls for voting by official ballot will open at 8:00am and close at 7:00pm.

To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Zoning Articles

Amendment #1

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #1, as proposed by the Planning Board, to the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Milton as follows: Amend the Ordinance to revise a section: **Article IX. Cluster Development** to read as follows: **Article IX. Conservation Subdivision; and replace existing ordinance text with proposed ordinance text:** The regulations contained in the Article establish open space conservation/cluster or planned unit development with mandatory conservation easements and amend zoning ordinances to provide for greater open space by allowing higher densities in clustered or planned unit development designs.

(3/5 ballot vote required for approval.)

To see if the Town will vote to change a portion of Piggott Hill Road, beginning at the Paey Pit Road, (approximately 1,840 feet from Alan Hastings Road), and then southwesterly for 2,160 feet from a Class VI road to a Class V (Town maintained) road, and change a Ellis Drive from a Class VI road to a Class V (Town maintained) road.

Article 19

To see if the Town will vote to change a portion of McKeagney Road, from the corner of Cross Road to the area where the improved section of the road ends (past #204), from a Class VI road to a Class V (Town maintained) road.

Article 20 (by Petition)

To see if the town will go on record in support of effective actions by the President and the Congress to address the issue of climate change which is increasingly harmful to the environment and economy of New Hampshire and the future well being of the people of Milton.

These actions include:

Establishment of a national program requiring reductions of U.S. greenhouse gas emissions while protecting the U.S. economy.

Creation of a Major national research initiative to foster rapid development of sustainable energy technologies thereby stimulating new jobs and investment.

In addition, the Town of Milton encourages New Hampshire citizens to work for emission reductions within their communities, and we ask our Selectmen to consider the appointment of a voluntary energy committee to recommend local steps to save energy and reduce emissions.

The record of the vote on this article shall be transmitted to the New Hampshire Congressional Delegation, to the President of the United States, and to declared candidates for those offices.

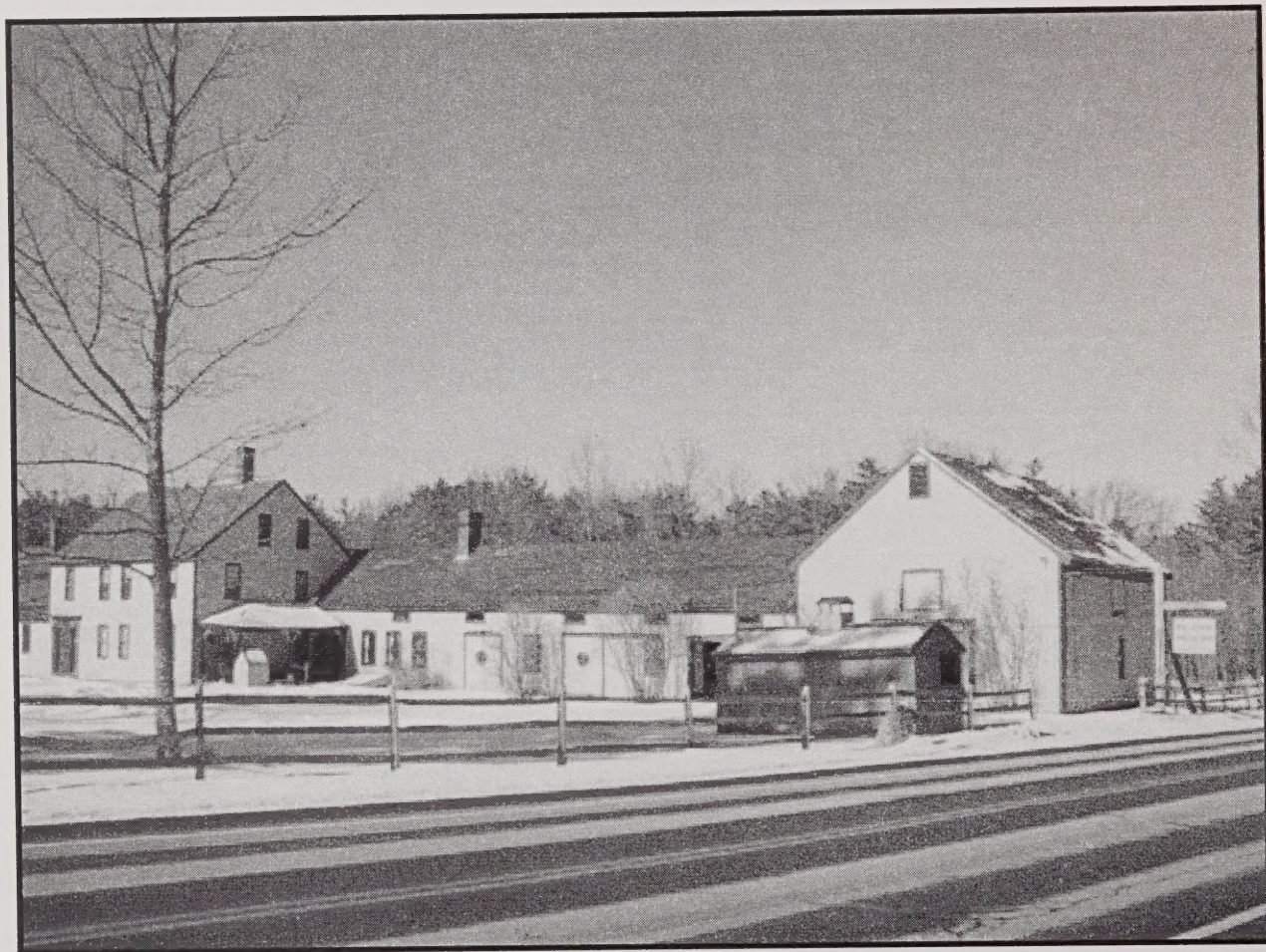
