THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Nelson in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at town hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at 9 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-Large, Alternate Delegates-at-Large, District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.
4. To see what sum of money the town will raise for building, repairing highways and bridges, or take action in relation thereto.
5. To see if town will vote to accept state aid for road construction.
6. To see if town will vote to accept state aid for road maintenance.
7. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of library.

8. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Memorial Day.

9. To see if town will vote to raise money for Old Home Day.

10. To see what sum the town will raise for care of cemetery.

11. To elect an agent to enforce liquor laws.

12. To see if the town will vote to give selectmen right to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

13. To see what sum of money the town will pay on tractor note.

14. To see if the town will vote to accept gift of Henry Melville and what use shall be made of same.

15. To see if the town will vote sum of money to procure large picture of Henry Melville.

16. To see if the town will take any action in regard to fire pump.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

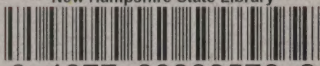
