THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Nelson in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at town hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at 9 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-Large, Alternate Delegates-at-Large, District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise for building, repairing highways and bridges, or take action in relation thereto.
- 5. To see if town will vote to accept state aid for road construction.
- 6. To see if town will vote to accept state aid for road maintenance.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of library.

- 8. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Memorial Day.
- 9. To see if town will vote to raise money for Old Home Day.
- 10. To see what sum the town will raise for care of cemetery.
 - 11. To elect an agent to enforce liquor laws.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to give selectmen right to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will pay on tractor note.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to accept gift of Henry Melville and what use shall be made of same.
- 15. To see if the town will vote sum of money to procure large picture of Henry Melville.
- 16. To see if the town will take any action in regard to fire pump.
- 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
