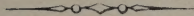

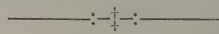

The Auditors recommend that the sum of \$3000 be paid into the Trust Fund.

We recommend that the Town raise, to defray Town expenses, \$2500; To pay interest on Bonded Debt, \$2000; For support of Schools, \$3500, and that \$800 of this sum be divided equally among the districts, and \$2000 for support of Highways, *provided*, the sum is raised in money; if otherwise, \$1000 in money and \$2000 in labor.

We find all bills paid by the Selectmen to have been itemised and receipted.
