# Library Report.

---

The report of the Library, showing its work for the year, is herewith presented.

During the year 273 volumes have been purchased. A legacy of books and pictures has been received from Mrs. John Giddings. The Concord Public Library has given the poetical works of S. T. Coleridge, John Dryden, Thomas Hood and Thomas Moore. New Hampshire College has sent its last *Bulletin*, the Library of Congress its latest Report. Newfields Book Club has given magazines, and Mrs. Mary Crafts, one volume.

The number of books loaned the past twelve months was 4,350, an increase of 335 over the previous year, and 791 more than in 1908.

The average number of books charged to borrowers each week was 84; average number in circulation each week, 145.

Percentages of fiction called for 65; travels, 3; biography, history and science, 2 each; periodicals, 12; other classes, 14.

Pictures from the Library Art Club, many of them of great interest, have been on exhibition all the year.

Magazines subscribed for: *American Boy*, *American Magazine*, *Century Magazine*, *Country Life in America*, *Current Literature*, *Garden Magazine*, *Harper's Monthly*, *Harper's Weekly*, *Human Life*, *Judge*, *Ladies' Home Journal*, *Life*, *McClure's*, *National Geographic*, *St. Nicholas*, *World's Work*, *Youth's Companion*, and *Exeter News-Letter*.
