





THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Westmoreland in the County of Cheshire, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at town hall, in said Westmoreland, on Tuesday, the twelfth (12) day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.

3. To see what sum of money in addition to what is required by law the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of highways and bridges.

4. To see if the town will vote to apply for state aid for state road maintenance and raise and appropriate money for the same.

5. To see if the town will vote to apply for state aid for trunk line maintenance and raise and appropriate money for the same.

6. To see if the town will vote to apply for state aid for state road construction and raise and appropriate money for the same. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$250.00 to change the course of Patridge brook away from the road at a point between the red Bridge and the house of William Smith.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$500.00 for snow removal.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$350.00 for a road machine.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for eradicating White Pine Blister Rust.

11. 'To see what disposition the town will vote to make of the income from the Jothan Lord fund.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the library.

13. To hear the report of the Forestry Committee and to take action thereon.

14. To see if the town will vote to accept a legacy of \$100.00, the income to be used for the perpetual care of the Albe J. Buffum lot in the South Village cemetery.

15. To see if the town will vote to accept the Martha A. Aldrich legacy of \$100.00, the income only to be used for the care and maintenance of the Frank W. Aldrich lot in the East Westmoreland cemetery.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

Have had no direct work to perform in the past year, but by request will submit the following:

"The annual Child Health Conference was held in the Town Hall September 20th. Dr. W. D. Taylor of Keene was the examining physician. Twenty-eight children of pre-school age attended. Such defects as orthopedic, hernia, enlarged tonsils and phimosis were found. The parents of these children were instructed in the care and correction of these defects. This work has a definite value in bringing to the minds of our people the need of a yearly examination for every member of the community, the work is under the direction of the State Board of Health, Division of Maternity, Infancy and Child hygiene. The division has informed us that it will give free diptheria protection to towns asking for this treatment for its children of pre-school age."

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Westmoreland:

I hereby submit my first annual report as Superintendent of schools.

On beginning my duties in the school system, I have been greatly aided by the efficient organization developed by Mr. Slade.

TEACHERS

I have found a fine spirit of co-operation from the School Board, parents and teachers.

The opening of school in the fall found three of last year's teachers still in the system. Mrs. Thompson was transferred from the Corner school to the advanced school at East Westmoreland. Miss Ethel Jordan teaches at the Corner school, and Miss Neta Sweet at the Westmoreland Primary school.

The summarized organization is as follows:

The large enrollment at East Westmoreland necessitated continuing the temporary room in the local hall. The school is conducted by Keene cadets, who work in relays of nine weeks each. The better attention which is thus given to the three lower grades, is a distinct advantage. The cadets furnished us have carried on the work in a very satisfactory manner.

BUILDINGS

The buildings in general are in good condition. During the summer chemical toilets were installed at the Corner school, a new chimney built, and floor laid.

At the Depot school land for a playground has been purchased from Mr. Russell Wellington. Clearing and grading the land, already begun, is to be finished in the spring. It is planned to enclose the lot with a suitable fence. The labor is contributed by the members of the local Parent-Teacher Association.

The interior of the school-house at East Westmoreland has been painted, and the surfaces of the desks refinished.

If the three year program for improvement of school buildings, as suggested by Superintendent Slade in last year's report, is to be continued, I believe the Depot school might well be the one to be considered this year. The most urgent needs are: painting the outside, refinishing the inside, shades, and chemical toilets.

New flagpoles are needed at the Village and Depot schools.

Electric lights in all the schools would greatly improve conditions. During the dark days, especially in winter, the strain on the eyes of the pupils, must eventually result in injury to many.

THE PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATIONS

The schools of Westmoreland are exceedingly fortunate in having the assistance and support of four live Parent-Teacher Associations. The spirit of these organizations is one of loyal service to the schools, and each school bears testimony to this service.

The sink and water cooler at East Westmoreland, the piano at the Depot school, piano and shades at the Corner school, and playground equipment at the Village school are but a few of the material helps, which have helped to make the schools more comfortable and homelike places for teacher and pupils.

The associations are also sponsoring and contributing prizes for a health contest among the four schools. A prize of twenty dollars is to be awarded at the end of the year to the school with the best health record.

I wish to acknowledge greatfully the kind cooperation which I have received from parents, School Board, and teachers.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

To Mr. L. O. Thompson, Supt. of Schools, Walpole, N. H.

Dear Sir:

I respectfully submit the following report as School Nurse from December 1927 to June, 1928:

104 pupils were examined.

34 pupils were underweight.

77 pupils were in need of dental work.

23 pupils were unvaccinated.

22 pupils showed defective vision-uncorrected.

8 pupils showed defective hearing.

5 pupils showed a slight degree of anaemia.

18 pupils showed some orthopedic defect.

33 pupils had enlarged or diseased tonsils.

16 pupils had enlarged glands.

69 visits were made, and health conditions talked over with parents.

A dental clinic was held May 16th, and 17th, 1928, with work done as follows:

The clinic rates as follows: Cleaning, 75c; extractions, 50c; silver and cement fillings, \$1.00; porcelain fillings, \$1.25.

The total bill for this work was eighty-six dollars and seventy-five cents (\$86.75), paid for by the parents of the children having work done. As this work was done for half the regular charges there was a saving of ninety-five dollars and twenty-five cents (\$95.25).

Seven pupils had their teeth cared for by their own dentist.

Three tonsil clinics were held, one at the Elliot Community hospital, Keene, N. H., three children were treated. Two at the Cheshire County hospital, twelve children were treated.

Five pupils had special eye examinations and defects corrected.

Three underweight clinics were held at which 34 pupils were examined by Dr. Robert Kerr of the New Hampshire Tuberculosis Association.

I wish to express the appreciation of the district to the Kurn Hattin Home, Westminster, Vt., for the loan of their dental chair. To Mrs. Dr. Warwick for assistance at the dental and tonsil clinics. Also to the local chapter of the Red Cross for financial assistance.

I wish to express my appreciation of the co-operation of the parents in the work accomplished in the past year.
