

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#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wilmot in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Wilmot on Tuesday, the Twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Town Highways.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 for Old Home Day.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for Memorial Day.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and negotiate the extension or renewal of the notes securing such loans, when it is necessary.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$532.50, the State to contribute \$1,064.00 for State Aid Construction on the Fourth New Hampshire Turnpike.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to make any change in the number of Road Agents elected.

- 9. To see what sum the Town will vote to transfer from the unencumbered surplus for the possible purchase of highway equipment.
- 10. (Requested) To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Wilmot Volunteer Fire Department.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 12. (Requested) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of one per cent (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1946 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, together with other Towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
