STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Barnstead, in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said BARNSTEAD, on TUESDAY, the tenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects;

1st. To choose all necessary TOWN OFFICERS for the year ensuing.

2nd. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.

3rd. To hear the reports of AUDITORS, AGENTS, COMMITTEES and all other officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

4th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for TOWN LIBRARY.

5th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

6th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Parade Fire Company.

By request.

7th. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid and appropriate money for same.

8th. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate One thousand dollars if Everett Clark will give One thousand dollars to be expended on what is known as the New Road.

By request.

9th. To see if the town will vote to accept the bequest of Oscar Foss of ten shares of Concord and Montral railroad stock. The same to be held in trust by the town; the dividends so far as

may be needed to be expanded annually in the month of May before Memorial Day in keeping the lots of Oscar Foss, Eli Foss and Oliver H. P. Young and strangers lot in general good repair, also cutting the bushes and giving the walks and driveway a general cleaning; and the balance to go to the Town Treasury.

10th. To see if the town will vote to change from Chapter 29 law of 1893 to Chapter 29 laws of 1899 in regard to Road Agents.

11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for all other purposes.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

TO THE CITIZENS OF BARNSTEAD SCHOOL DISTRICT :

We hereby submit the following annual report.

Schools have been maintained for the year at the Parade, Center South Barnstead, North Barnstead, Pitman, Shackford's Corner, White Oakes, Beauty Hill and Bickford.

There was a spring term at Berry's but the scholars were conveyed to White Oakes for the fall term. In the winter the number was so small, with no means of conveyance, we employed Mrs. Lula Emerson, a teacher of experience, to teach them in her home.

We think our schools have been very profitable for the past year. Teachers have seem to be untiring in their efforts to accomplish as much as possible for those in their care, and after all that can be said, a school will be just about what the teacher makes it. If she has plenty of snap, energy, love for her pupils and her work, with a good share of common sense her school will prosper

Most of the parents we are glad to say are very anxious to have their children in school regularly, still there are some who should be more particular in these matters. Does not a great responsibility rest upon such parents?

Daniel Webster said "If we work upon marble it will perish, if we work upon brass time efface it, if we rear lofty temples they will crumble into dust, but if we engrave upon the tables of the minds of our children the principle of industry, honesty and virtue they will live and brighten to all eternity."

The education of the young is surely a noble work. Let

each endeavor to do his part wisely and well.

REPAIRS.

The house and shed at Dennets' have been shingled, and at Bickfords' the inside has been repaired and walls painted, while light repairs have been made at several other places.

The greatest improvement in any of our houses for years, has been made at South Barnstead, by public spirited citizens of that section.

Mr. Guy Clark gave a fire bell, others built a bell tower at quite a large expense, they also put new blinds on the house, and Mr. Sewell Clark of Lynn, Mass. a former school-boy here gave the weather vane.

The only expense to the district being a small sum for freight and paint.

In the school room is an organ presented by friends, an oak-framed glass front book case, and new clock, purchased by the teacher, Miss Daisy Davis and her pupils; also a new large and expensive U. S. Map, the gift of Mr. Lewis Hanson of Boston, Mass. a native of Barnstead.

All who have had a part in this good work are worthy of the highest praise and will receive it from all right thinking people.
