## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the Inhabitants of the town of Colebrook qualified to vote in town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house, in said town, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote a town clerk.
2. To choose by ballot and major vote three selectmen.
3. To choose by ballot and major vote a trustee of trust funds for three years.
4. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.
5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for support of the poor.
6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairs of highways and bridges.
7. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$3,000 for the purpose of receiving \$12,000 Federal money for use on highway.
8. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the observance of Memorial Day.
9. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the Public Library.
10. To see what sum of money the town will raise for police service.
11. To see what sum of money the town will raise for town charges.
12. To see if the town will vote to build sewers on Main street from Spring St. to Bridge St., and on Parsons St., and to raise money for that purpose.

13. To see if the town will vote to continue the asphalt road from the crossing in front of Ben Drew's building south on Main street and to raise money for that purpose.

14. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the repair and building of sidewalks.

15. To see if the town will vote to have a town agent to conduct the sale of liquor after May 1st, 1918.

16. To see if the town will buy additional land for the village cemetery and to raise money for that purpose.

17. To see if the town will vote to let residents of the town put their dead in the tomb free of charge until suitable time to bury them.

18. To choose by Australian ballot two representatives to the Constitutional Convention.

19. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.

The following is the report of the Board of Health for the year 1917.

The town for the past year has been free from contagious diseases and health conditions remarkably good up to about the last of February when we found we had a case of small pox, two other cases have since developed, a pest house has been established, the patients are well cared for and are getting along well. Measures have been taken to prevent the spread of the disease and we hope that no more cases will develop.

The citizens have made all the improvements suggested in the matter of the removal of rubbish and the removal of objectional matter and the sanitary conditions are good.
