To the Inhabitants of the Town of Deerfield, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Deerfield on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for town construction of highways and raise and appropriate money for the same.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay on notes held by Amoskeag National Bank.

5. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

6. To see what action the town will vote to take regarding the price paid for labor on town work.

7. To see if the town will vote to give a discount on taxes paid before certain dates and fix said dates and discounts.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Memorial Day.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay on the note owed by Deerfield Vol. Fire Department.

10. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.

11. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally, as permitted by local option law.

12. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money to buy snow fence.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Deerfield:

My fifth annual report deals briefly with enrollment and per pupil cost in elementary schools, reduction in district's liability for high school and academy tuition, physical welfare activities, and recent reorganization.

The total enrollment in the Deerfield schools has been slightly below that of the previous year. However, the average membership of eighty-one pupils remained the same. The elementary cost per pupil of \$80.70 was slightly less than that of the previous year, and nearly eight dollars less than the cost three years ago.

This year thirty pupils have been enrolled in high schools and academies. Here again economy has been effected by a per pupil reduction of \$11.53 in the district's liability for tuition. The legal liability is determined by the average cost of instruction during the previous year in the public high schools of the state. This sum fell from \$89.79 to \$78.26 per pupil. The number of your secondary school pupils now on honor rolls in scholastic and competitive activities reflects credit upon the homes and schools of Deerfield.

Foremost among the aids to physical welfare are the services of your School Nurse, whose activities have received most valuable support from state and federal relief agencies. I regret that her co-operation in allocating state and federal assistance does not appear in the report of the School Nurse.

No single feature of state and federal relief has a greater bearing on the health of growing children than the daily milk ration. Through the initiative of our Governor federal funds were procured and free milk service was inaugurated in March, 1933, and is being extended through the present school year. New Hampshire's public and parochial schools are using daily over 15,000 bottles of milk. Such federal activity is no more a form of charity than is the free allotment of paper and pencils in our schools. Both are distributed in accordance with the child's physical or educational needs.

The reorganization of the Center and Parade schools, recommended in my report of last year, is being given a thorough trial. These are now rated by the state as graded schools having four primary grades at the Parade and the grammar grades at the Center. Without increasing the cost of transportation this provides instruction by consecutive instead of alternate grades, longer periods of supervised sudy, and school management and playground activities adapted to the respective grades.

The playground activities at the Parade School were this year filmed by the State Department of Education and displayed at the rural institutes in a moving picture showing outstanding activities of similar schools throughout the state.

In conclusion, it is to be noted that, while reductions in expenditures have been made, your staff of teachers has been retained and the efficiency of your schools increased. It has been a pleasure to work with you in the achievement of these ends.
