

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dublin Qualified to Vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First. To choose all necessary Town Officers, Agents, Auditors and Committees for the ensuing year.

Second. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Third. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and for any other purposes as mentioned in the budget.

Fourth. To see if the town will vote to apply for State Aid for Highways for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for reconstruction on the Trunk Line Highway.

Sixth. To see if the town will vote to discontinue, or discontinue subject to gates and bars, certain highways within the town or pass any vote relating thereto.

Seventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department to construct one or more cisterns in the upper part of the village, or pass any vote relating thereto.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SUPERVISORY UNION NO. 47 OF THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TO THE SCHOOL BOARD OF DUBLIN, N. H.

Only twelve towns in the state expend less on the current costs for education than does Dublin, if the wealth of the various towns of the state is the basis of comparison.

The great wealth of the town, in connection with the needs of the pupils in the schools, lays a particularly heavy burden upon the school board.

the school board.

Children who are transported over as fine roads as modern science can offer, should find the best of education at the end

of the trip.

The School Board has adopted a complete system of pupil accounting, by which it can determine, three times during each school year, the actual conditions of educational practice in its schools. This system also makes possible the knowledge of where Dublin Schools exceed or fall short of grade standards for the country as a whole.

In view of the fact that many school boards are concerned far more over the financial conditions than over the proving that whatever money is expended has brought as large as possible a return to the town, this action on the part of Dublin's school board could well receive appreciative comment from all citizens who believe that children are more important than dollars, but that also the importance of expending each dollar for the best possible investment in schooling should be watched efficiently.

During the past year, four teachers have been employed. The enrollment of pupils was 80. The per cent of attendance was not high, being only 90.4. Only two pupils were neither absent nor tardy during the school year. Cases of tardiness markedly decreased from 214 in the previous year to 54 in the past year.

All 4 teachers are graduates of New Hampshire normal schools. We believe that the town recognizes and appreciates their services in the schools. Certainly, the records which the Board has observed made on standard ratings of the work of the children in the schools, are proof that loyal and intelligent service is being given.

Dublin is maintaining a program of building alterations and repair which will result in very superior school buildings. There is opportunity for the town to consider the possibility of offering to the children educational opportunities and physical surrounding that cannot be exceeded in worth those which any town

or city in New Hampshire can offer.

We believe that this is the goal towards which the School Board is working, and that it can arrive there without disturbing the tax rate and without establishing any faulty precedents for expenditure.

Roads and schools are the two forms of advertising which may be enjoyed by the citizens and at the same time attract those who desire the best for themselves and their children.

For the friendly spirit that is always shown supervision by the citizens of Dublin, whether officially or sympathetically shown by support of the schools and maintenance of interest in achievement of the individual pupils or grades, the superintendent of schools returns his hearty thanks, on behalf of the children.

With the submission of this report I take occasion to commend the present staff of teachers for their splendid efforts in preventative health work. There has been particular improvement in School District No. 2. We cannot appeal too strongly to the parents for co-operation with our department. In some cases the same defects have gone uncorrected for several years which of course is unjust to the children involved and to the town which pays for the examination. Your examiner will always be glad to explain any point which may not be understood and help in the correction or refer you to the proper authorities for your particular needs.

We hope to carry out a campaign against Diphtheria during the coming year both for the school children and those of preschool age.

During the past year tonsil clinics were held at the Peterborough Hospital and it is expected that this work will be continued during the coming summer. Expenses have been adjusted to meet the needs of all and it is to be hoped that more will embrace this splendid opportunity for needed corrections.
