
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT 1996

To the inhabitants of the Town of Fitzwilliam, in the County of Cheshire, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs, you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Fitzwilliam on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next at seven (7:00) o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To bring in your votes for the election of one Selectman for three years; one Selectman for one year; one Moderator for two years; one Supervisor of the Checklist for six years; one Supervisor of the Checklist for five years; one Supervisor of the Checklist for four years; one Budget Committee Member for three years; two Budget Committee Member for two years; one Fireward for three years; two Planning Board Members for three years; two Planning Board members for two years; one Cemetery Commissioner for three years; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one Trustee of Library for three years and three Commissioners of Plante Memorial Park for one year.

ARTICLE 2 (BY BALLOT). Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #1 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance as follows:

Amend the definitions under Article IV, Section 127-15 to adopt the New Hampshire Model Floodplain Development Ordinance.





ARTICLE 3 (BY BALLOT). Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #2 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend article 127-42 changing Section F to Section G with Section F to provide the regulation for applicant's seeking a variance in connection with the Floodplain Overlay District.



ARTICLE 4 (BY BALLOT). Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #3 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance as follows:

Add to article VI Section 221-21, Section 5 with regard to requirements for subdivisions having land designated as "Special Flood Hazard Areas".



ARTICLE 5 (BY BALLOT). Shall we adopt an exemption for the totally and permanently disabled? The exemption, based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers shall be \$25,000. To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least five years and own and occupy the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by a spouse, they must have been married for at least five years. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income of not more than \$15,000 or, if married, a combined net income of not more than \$20,000; and own net assets not in excess of \$50,000 excluding the value of the person's residence.



ARTICLE 6 (BY BALLOT). Shall we modify the optional adjusted elderly exemptions from property tax? The optional exemptions, based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers shall be as follows: for a person 65 years of age up to 75 years, \$12,500; for a person 75 years of age up to 80 years, \$25,000; for a person 80 years of age or older, \$50,000. To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least five years; own the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by a spouse, they must have been married for at least five years. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income of not more than \$15,000 or, if married a combined net income of less than \$20,000; and own net assets not in excess of \$50,000, excluding the value of the person's residence.



Polls will open not later than 2:00 p.m. and close not earlier than 7:00 p.m., or such later time as shall be authorized by vote of the town.

ARTICLE 7. To hear and act upon the reports of Agents, Committees and Officers heretofore chosen.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the town will vote to appoint a committee to have charge of the Memorial Day exercises, or take any action thereon.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500 to install air conditioning in the offices of the Town Hall building, or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,000 to install a partial exhaust extraction system in the Public Safety Building (for the purpose of removing diesel exhaust fumes), or take any action thereon. (Not recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,550 to purchase SCBA (self contained breathing apparatus) for use by the Town Fire Department, and further provide that any income secured from the sale of units presently owned by the fire department shall be allocated to reduce the amount raised by taxes during the current year, or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended by the Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000 to acquire the land behind the Depot Fire Station (Map 29, Lot 17), from the Catholic Archdiocese, or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee; Not recommended by Board of Selectmen).

ARTICLE 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$110,000 to overlay (pave) roads. or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended \$85,000 by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 for scaling (oiling) of town roads, or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,000 for a new access to the Library building to enhance Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)compliance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for Community Development Block Grant Funds through the Cheshire County ADA Project and the New Hampshire Office of State Planning, and if said grant is approved, to authorize the Board of Selectmen to use any funds received from the grant as an offset against this appropriation.

(Recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended by the Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to support the operation of Meadowood County Area Fire Department, or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to construct a road to access the section of Pine Grove Cemetery surveyed in 1994 and to finance said appropriation by withdrawing \$5,000 from the Capital Reserve Fund created by ARTICLE #35 at the 1994 Annual Meeting, or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000 to create a Capital Reserve

Fund for the painting of the exterior of the Town Hall (excluding the steeple), or take any action, thereon. (Not recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund created under ARTICLE 17 at the Annual Meeting of 1995 for the reassessment of the town, or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended by the Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to add to the Capital Reserve Fund created by ARTICLE 15 of the Annual Meeting of 1995 for the purchase of a vehicle for the use of the police department, or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended \$7000 by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 to add to the Capital Reserve Fund created by ARTICLE 14 of the Annual Meeting of 1995 for the re-construction of the tennis courts, or take any action thereon. (Recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to add to the Capital Reserve Fund created by ARTICLE 11 of the Annual Meeting of 1969 for the purchase of a fire department vehicle, or take any action thereon. (Not recommended by Budget Committee; Recommended by Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 23 (BY PETITION). To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for the providing of meals to needy Fitzwilliam residents furnished and distributed by The Community Kitchen, Inc. The total cost of providing 2,709 meals to

Fitzwilliam residents during the twelve-month period of 1995 was \$1,219.00. All towns in the Monadnock region are being requested to provide funding to The Community Kitchen to help defray the costs of serving and distributing meals in 1996. (Not recommended by Budget Committee; Not recommended by Board of Selectmen).

ARTICLE 24. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and pass any vote in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 25. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to trade, sell or otherwise dispose of any unusable vehicles or equipment of any of the departments of the Town, or take any action thereon.

ARTICLE 26. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept, on behalf of the town, gifts, legacies, and devices made to the town in trust for any public purpose, as permitted by RSA 31:19, or take any action thereon.

ARTICLE 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept the dedication of any street shown on a subdivision plat by the Planning Board, provided that such street has been constructed in accordance with the approval of the subdivision plat by the Planning Board and has been constructed in accordance with applicable town specification as determined by the Board of Selectmen or their agent, or take any action thereon.

The evening meeting opened at 7pm by Moderator, William Prigge. Flag salute by the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts. Prayer by Rev. Lynda Tolton. Motion made and seconded to waiver the reading of the entire warrant at this time.

ARTICLE 2 - To hear and act upon the reports of Agents, Committees and Officers heretofore chosen. Susan Link made motion and it was seconded to accept the Town Report as written. Tom Parker spoke about the Industrial Development Committee. They have compiled a telephone directory and anyone wishing to have their business included should contact the committee. Mr. Blumn spoke about the "Adopt a Road" Program and encouraged people to help. John Tommila spoke about the Monadnock Regional formula that was voted on March 4, 1995 and the effect it would have on our taxes. Selectmen William Davis presented a gavel to Moderator, William Prigge for the twenty-five (25) years he has served as Town Moderator.

ARTICLE 3 - Voted to have the Selectmen appoint a committee to have charge of the Memorial Day exercises. Joan Knight made motion and it was seconded. She reported that Robin Haynes and Lola Grab had served last year. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 4 - William Davis made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16,000 for painting and repairing the Town Hall steeple and clock. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 5 - Edwin Mattson, Jr. made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$28,000 for the reconstruction of 2500 feet of Richmond Road (the Richmond Road to Bull Run), from the Edwin and Iris Grove property near Angier Road westerly to Route 119. This article was amended to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,800.00. Motion passed as amended.

ARTICLE 6 - Edwin Mattson, Jr. made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000 to overlay (pave) the entire length of Lower Troy Road, and the section of Templeton Turnpike from the Winchendon Road (Route 119) at the north end of the Common to the Fitzwilliam Community Church. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 7 - Edwin Mattson, Jr. made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000 for sealing (oiling) of town roads. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 8 - Edwin Mattson, Jr. made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$28,000 to construct a salt/sand shed on Town property behind the Highway Barn. John Tommila spoke on this article and said that he could do this project for \$17,000.00. Edwin Mattson made motion and it was seconded to amend this article to raise and appropriate the sum of \$17,000.00 to

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construct a salt/sand shed on Town property behind the Highway Barn. Article passed as amended.

ARTICLE 9 - Edwin Mattson, Jr. made motion and it was seconded to authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into a fouryear lease agreement for the purpose of acquiring a one-ton pickup with plow and hydraulics for the use of the highway department, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,600.00 to cover the first year's payment, and to dispose of the 1987 Ford automobile and 1984 Chevy one-ton pickup, with any proceeds from the sale of said vehicles being used to offset the 1995 lease payment. This article passed as amended.

Louise Germaine asked if Article 28 could be brought forward at this time to be acted on. The Moderator said that it was in order.

ARTICLE 28 - (By Petition) To see if the residents will vote to direct the Board of Selectmen to remove the current Road Agent from office for failure to perform the duties of his office in an acceptable manner. Voted to indefinitely postpone this article.

ARTICLE 10 - Joan Knight made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to support the operation of Meadowood County Area Fire Department. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 11 - William Davis made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000. to construct a road to access newly surveyed section of Pine Grove Cemetery and to finance said appropriation by withdrawing \$5,000. from the Capital Reserve Fund created by ARTICLE 35 at the 1994 Annual Town Meeting. This motion did not pass.

At this time Thomas Parker took over as Moderator for William Prigge. Voted to discuss both article 12 and 13 and then vote on them at the same time.

ARTICLE 12 - William Prigge made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27,900 for the purchase of 18 self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) units for the Fire Department, said appropriation to be paid by authorizing the Selectmen to borrow \$15,900 for one year on terms and conditions they deem to be in the best interest of the town, and the remaining \$12,000 to come from current tax revenues, further provided that any income secured from the sale of units presently owned by the Fire Department shall be allocated to reduce the amount raised by taxes during the current year. Ballot vote required, 2/3rds majority needed for passage. There were 206 ballots cast. The ballot vote resulted in 125 YES and 80 NO - 1 blank Ballot. The article failed to pass on 2/3rds majority.

ARTICLE 13 - William Prigge made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75,000 for the purchase of an ambulance for the Fire Department, said appropriation to be paid by authorizing the Selectmen to borrow \$25,000 for one year on terms and conditions they deem to be in the best interest of the town, and \$25,000 for two years on terms and conditions they deem to be in the best interest of the Town, and the balance of \$25,000 to come from current tax revenue. (Ballot vote required, 2/3rds majority needed for passage). There were 206 ballots cast. The ballot vote resulted in 116 YES and 90 NO. The article failed to pass on 2/3rds majority.

A motion was made and seconded at this time not to re-consider articles 12 & 13 at this meeting. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 14 - Wayne Kassotis made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000. to create a Capital Reserve Fund for the re-construction of the tennis courts. A poll of the house resulted in 71 YES and 55 NO. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 15 - Bruce Newton made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000. to create a Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of a vehicle for the use of the Police Department. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 16 - Susan Link made motion and it was seconded to indefinitely postpone this article to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000. to create a Capital Reserve Fund for the painting of the Town Hall. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 17 - Susan Link made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000. to create a Capital Reserve Fund for the reassessment of the town. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 18 - Joan Knight made motion and it was seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2010. for the support of Monadnock Family Services. Motion passes.

James Baldwin made motion and it was seconded to re-consider Article 11 at this time. Article was defeated at this time.

ARTICLE 19 - (By Petition) Wendy Carney made motion and it was seconded to see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000 to be disbursed to the Helping Hand, Inc. of Troy/Fitzwilliam (to continue to provide food, clothing and other humanitarian assistance to low income and disabled individuals and families from the Town of Fitzwilliam). A poll of the house vote resulted in 86 YES and 57 NO. Motion passes.

ARTICLE 20 - (By Petition) Lorie Lafond made a motion to amend the article and it was seconded. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 to contribute to the \$16,800 the P.T.O has already raised for a new recycled plastic playground at Emerson School. Motion passed as amended.

ARTICLE 21 - To hear the report of the Budget Committee and pass any vote in relation thereto. Susan Link made a motion and it was seconded to add \$5000.00 to the Direct Assistance budget, and \$10,000.00 for revaluation of property. Motion passed. Terry Nostrand made motion and it was seconded to add \$15,500. to the Fire Department budget for 10 self-contained breathing apparatus. A motion was made and seconded to have a ballot vote. The ballot vote resulted in 77 YES and 52 NO. Motion carried.

Thomas Parker of the budget committee made a motion and it was seconded to pass a budget of \$1,165,250.00. Voted in the affirmative. The following break down of expenses shows \$5000.00 more then the motion.

Motion passed.

ARTICLE 26 - (By Petition) William Davis made motion and it was seconded to authorize the Board of Selectmen to convey any interest that the town may have in and to a lot as the Woodbrook Camp and Tennis Condominium, shown on town tax maps as Map 42, Lot 01-32 to Tammy M. Bourgeois, for such amount as the Board deems to be in the best interest of the town. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 27 - (By Petition) William Davis made motion and it was seconded to authorize the Selectmen to convey any interest that the town may have in and to a lot on the Old Whitcomb Road shown on the tax maps as Map 7, Lot 27-1 to Todd M. Reed, for such amount as the Board deems to be in the best interest of the town. Motion passed.

BOARD OF SELECTMEN 1995 ANNUAL REPORT

The Board of Selectmen would like to thank all those residents who have shared their time and expertise and served on town committees and boards during 1995. We also recognize and thank our town employees who implement the services that the town requires. The efforts of these two groups along with local organizations who serve our residents enable us to maintain and improve our community. We encourage anyone with an interest in joining these efforts to serve on a board or attend open meetings to voice their ideas.

The Town of Fitzwilliam is in good shape financially. We have no long term debt and have finished the year within the appropriations that you approved at Town meeting 1995. (Otherwise we'd be on our way to jail!) We continue to be members of the NH Public Investment Pool which allows us quicker accessibility to town funds and earns us a favorable interest rate. We anticipate that we will end the year with a surplus and will use part of that to offset property taxes.

This year the Board directed a sales study that was undertaken by our assessor in order to bring our assessed valuations back into line. As you will note below, the Town's portion of the tax rate increased by \$1.19. A significant portion of this increase was due to the update and not to increased spending. Some residents saw a decrease in their tax bill while others saw an increase as the update tried to apportion taxes more fairly. The tax base is now \$119,895,275 with 71 acres put into current use in 1995. The percentage of equalization should be near 100%. The amount to be raised by taxes for 1995 was \$3,024,837 and the tax rate breaks down as follows:

During this past year long needed repairs were made to the Town Hall foundation. The Town Hall steeple was repainted and the face of the clock redone with gold leaf. We hope over the next several years to put some money aside to complete the painting of the exterior of Town Hall. We were also able to upgrade the electrical service in the building in order to accommodate the new technology and equipment used to transact business and keep records. We constructed a new salt shed at the Highway department and thanks to the combined efforts of John Tommila, John Holman and others we were able to stay within budget. The Board responded to a petition by town residents and held a special Town Meeting on August 25, 1995. Those attending voted to accept the gift of an ambulance and in the fall of 1995 the Town, through the Fitzwilliam Fire Department, began operating an ambulance service.

This year in our 1996 budget we have addressed ADA (American's with Disabilities Act) projects that will make town buildings accessible to all our residents. Our priority is the library building which, at present, is not handicap accessible. We have requested funds for an upgrade of the Town Hall lift and renovations of the restrooms at the Public Safety Building. Under the direction of our ADA coordinator, Nancy Carney, the town has applied for a grant from the New Hampshire Office of State Planning. If funded, it is a matching grant for 50% of the cost. We ask you to support these projects with your yes vote at Town meeting. The ADA legislation is aimed at helping our neighbors and perhaps ourselves at a future date since this is a minority that anyone can join.

Our major goal for 1996 will be the development of a Capital Improvement Plan(CIP) for the town. Working with the Planning Board and all department heads and supervisors we will develop a five year plan to help prioritize our development and spread the larger capital project dollars.

One rallying issue for the Town this year was the school funding formula. The change that was voted in at the March meeting would have raised our taxes drastically. Thanks to the hard work of John Tommila, Janice Anderson, Kelley Collins, our Administrative Assistant and many of you, we were able to disseminate information, hold a special meeting and vote to rescind the March vote. For the moment we have won, but we should remain vigilant in attending District meetings and hearings.

One final and sad note, 1995 saw the passing of three very important members of our community. Jesse Davis, who served as our State Representative and on several Town Boards; Wally Angier, a former selectman and most recently Supervisor of the Checklist and Bill Davis. a member of our board who brought humor and a practical eye to our meetings and our decisions. Every time the fire whistle blows during a meeting, we will forever have a vision of him jumping out of his chair and during budget talks we'll remember his "flustrations" about spending that dime. We will miss all for their wisdom and for their contributions to this community.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve the community. Please continue to let us know about any concerns and ideas that you might have, and we encourage you to become involved in your community in whatever way you can.

We have audited the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Fitzwilliam, New Hampshire as of and for the year ended December 31, 1995, and have issued our report thereon dated January 26, 1996.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the general purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement.

In planning and performing our audit of the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Fitzwilliam, New Hampshire for the year ended December 31, 1995, we considered its internal control structure in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the general purpose financial statements and not to provide assurance on the internal control structure.

The management of the Town of Fitzwilliam, New Hampshire is responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure. In fulfilling this responsibility, estimates and judgments by management are required to assess the expected benefits and related costs of internal control structure policies and procedures. The objectives of an internal control structure are to provide management with reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that assets are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly to permit the preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Because of inherent limitations in any internal control structure, errors or irregularities may nevertheless occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of the structure to future periods is subject to the risk that procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the effectiveness of the design and operation of policies and procedures may deteriorate.

For the purpose of this report, we have classified the significant internal control structure policies and procedures in the following categories:

Cash and investments Revenue and receivables Expenditures for goods and services and accounts payable Payroll and related liabilities For all of the internal control structure categories listed above, we obtained an understanding of the design of relevant policies and procedures and whether they have been placed in operation, and we assessed control risk.

Our consideration of the internal control structure would not necessarily disclose all matters in the internal control structure that might be material weaknesses under standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. A material weakness is a reportable condition in which the design or operation of one or more of the internal control structure elements does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that errors or irregularities in amounts that would be material in relation to the general purpose financial statements being audited may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions. We noted no matters involving the internal control structure and its operation that we consider to be material weaknesses as defined above.

This report is intended for the information of management and the Board of Selectmen. However, this report is a matter of public record and its distribution is not limited.

In the midst of the first half of the year, Officer Raymond Anair started his training at the police academy, which he successfully completed in July. The absence of this officer was noticeable while the other members divided the assignments and calls for service amongst them.

The discovery of a homicide victim in a small quarry in late May left some in the community stunned and in disbelief. Investigation headed by the New Hampshire State Police, using the Fitzwilliam police department as a command center, necessitated several man hours devoted to identifying the victim and those responsible for the crime. The efforts of the law enforcement community paid off with the arrest of eight individuals from the Greenfield, MA area.

Mid way through 1995, the region was connected to the emergency 911 system. Dialing 911 can now get you enhanced emergency response. Though there are still a few "bugs" to be worked out. I believe that emergency services will improve with the development of 911. Realizing that old habits are hard to break, calling 585-6565 or 352-1100 still works!

Interacting with the elementary school children remained a part of the police activity. I experienced great pleasure in assisting Chief Smith of Troy with the D.A.R.E. program this year. Your efforts to continuously support the D.A.R.E. program are very much appreciated. In the new year. I hope to be able to coordinate with the school and lecture on other safety topics such as the importance of seat belts and home safety.

Statistics this year show a decrease in burglaries and criminal trespass. I'd like to believe that this is due to the fact that there is more police presence and second, that the community overall, is taking steps to watch over one another and phone-in suspicious activity. We must continue with these efforts to protect our community

POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT (continued) from wrongful invasion. In order for our environment to remain safe and healthy, everyone must be willing to get involved and not "turn the other cheek".

Juvenile problems have been slowly on the rise and this year it was realized more than ever. Several local juveniles found themselves being introduced to the judicial system at various levels. Their crimes ranged from minor vandalism and petty theft to the most serious, a felony. Our kids need our attention and if possible we as a society need to focus some volunteer energy at gathering ideas to develop programs and activities that the kids would enjoy. There is strength in numbers. Many hands make light work. Are we willing?

Accident statistics were average for the year and though there were some that resulted in personal injury, there were no fatalities. There was however, an alarming increase in the number of drunk driving arrests over last year. The risks far outweigh the excuses. Those who drink and drive today, become the traffic statistic of tomorrow.

Through 1995 the police department delivered on its pledge for extended patrol coverage. Scheduling three full time officers in rotation now allows for adequate police presence in the Town. I continue to urge residents to call-in any suspicious activity they observe. Never feel that you are bothering us or feel that your call will not matter. Fitzwilliam police officers are eager to respond and investigate these calls for service.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank the Board of Selectmen, the Townspeople, and members of the other Town agencies for their assistance and support exhibited throughout the year.

Since taking the position of animal control officer May 1, 1995 it has been a busy and interesting year. During the ensuing months. I responded to 186 calls including; lost dogs and cats, plus cows and horses walking our town streets, snakes in kitchen cabinets, ferret attacks and possible rabid raccoons and coyotes. 1 am happy to report we had no animal testing positive for rabies in town this year. We had one moose and several deer plus four dogs killed on our roads in town.

Please remember after you register your dog to put the tags on its collar. Should your dog get lost it will make it much easier to return your dog to you, not the Humane Society.

Below is a list of the statistics from May 1 until the end of the year. My thanks to all who have helped me this past year.

Respectfully submitted, Warren S. Hall Animal Control Officer The Fitzwilliam Highway Department had a productive year. All major projects were completed. The town now has a new salt shed. Many thanks to John Tommila for overseeing the construction of this shed and for keeping the cost within budget.

Major ditching and culvert work was done to the following roads: Royalston, Old Troy, Cross, Tree Farm, Holman, Howeville and Dunton. The following roads were treated with sand or stone seal: Warren Hill, Dunton, Webber Lane, Tree Farm, Holman, and Howeville. I have requested \$20,000 in the 1996 budget for sealing of more roads.

All dirt roads were graded three times during the year. During the fall grading, 1000 tons of 1 1/2 gravel was applied to various roads. I have requested funds in the 1996 budget for another 500 tons of 1 1/2 gravel.

In the fall, 900 tons of asphalt grindings were put on a section of Templeton Turnpike from Sandy Hollow Road to the Lafave residence. A stone seal was put on top of the grindings. I have requested money in the 1996 budget to purchase more grindings in order to continue to upgrade our gravel roads.

I have also requested money in the 1996 budget to do the following projects:

-1 3/4" overlay of Royalston Rd. from Rte 119 to Holman Road

-Repair the intersection in Bowkerville at the junction of Upper Troy Rd, Rockwood Pond Rd, Bowkerville Rd. and South Street

-Reclaim and overlay .5 miles of Fullam Hill Rd. from Abel Rd, to the foot of the hill by the Longever residence.

-Leveling course of hot top on Jaffrey Rd.

-Replace culvert on Bowkerville Rd., by Meadowood Assembly Hall.

All equipment is in good mechanical shape so, at this time, I am not requesting funds for additional vehicles.

RECYLING REPORT FROM THE TRANSFER STATION - 1995

A total of 531 tons of waste came through the gates during the year. Forty-two percent of that amount was recycled and taken out of the mainstream of waste. The other fifty-eight percent was taken to a landfill or incinerator.

This year we enjoyed premium prices for our recyclables. The market fell in the fall and we do not expect to see the market as strong in 1996 as it was in 1995.

In 1996 we have to make some changes in the way we except demolition debris. The laws are changing and we will not be able to bury everything as we do now. We will have to start separating and bury some while some will have to go to a landfill. No treated lumber or painted lumber will be allowed in the burn pit. During the summer we will be adding a dumpster to handle the items we cannot bury or burn.

A reminder to everyone that we cannot except any hazardous material during the winter months, the company that takes our waste cannot have it freeze. During the summer months, there are times that we will have to close the burn pit and cannot accept any items. This occurs when the pit is full and weather conditions prohibit burning.

I would like to thank the staff at the Transfer Station and you, the Townspeople for making our recycling center a success.

FIREWARD'S REPORT - 1995 1995 CALLS

Fitzwilliam Fire Department responded to 202 calls for the period from December 1, 1994 through November 30, 1995. This was a decrease from the 1994 total of 229 calls and represented the first decrease in several years. There were 4 structure fires, 6 brush fires, 4 motor vehicle fires, and 13 Mutual Aid fire calls to other communities; there were 27 calls for various fire related matters such as automatic fire alarms, smoke investigations, electrical fires, oven fires, and illegal burns, among others.

The Department also responded to 104 medical emergencies, 20 motor vehicle accidents and 9 Mutual Aid medical calls.

PERSONNEL, TRAINING AND EDUCATION

The Department now has 34 active members. Of these 20 are active as both fire fighters and rescue personnel. Eight serve as fire fighters only and 6 serve as rescue only. Of the 28 fire fighters, 17 are New Hampshire certified fire fighters. Presently we have 24 members certified to provide medical care. Of these two are EMT-Is (intermediate) and 12 are EMT-Bs (basic). One of the EMT-Is is certified for medication administration. Along with our EMTs we have 4 advanced first aiders and 6 emergency responders. Eighteen of our personnel are certified on the Fibrillation Machine and 5 are certified for the Esophageal Obturator Airway (EOA).

Along with the monthly fire and rescue drills, during 1995, 3 members took the Fire Fighter One (Certified fire fighters) course, 7 took the EMT-B course, and 2 took the EMT-I course. In addition 2 members completed their recertification for EMT-B level. Currently 3 members are in training for the EMT Basic course at the Cheshire Medical Center.

Members also took courses at Meadowood during 1995 in Hazmat Awareness, LP Gas, SCBA, Incident Command, and Fire Ground Safety Officer. Extra EMS courses taken by members during 1995 included Cardiac Rhythm Interpretation, Critical Trauma Course, and EOA. During 1995, 30 of our members were either certified or recertified in CPR for the professional rescuer.

For the public, we have had Open Houses, Fire Prevention exercises and demonstrations at Emerson School, as well as offering CPR courses. Citizens are welcome at any time to tour our facilities, meet our members and look over our vehicles and equipment.

VEHICLES

Our inventory of fire vehicles did not change in 1995. The 1973 Mack Pumper, 1978 Ford Pumper, 1970 Mack Pumper and 1978 Mack Tanker continue to be in good to excellent condition. Although all of these vehicles are fairly old, we try to monitor maintenance closely to keep our problems to a minimum. However, due to the ages of these vehicles, the potential for problems is always increasing. Be that as it may, we believe it is more prudent to continue to make due with these well built and well maintained older units than to take a chance on an expensive new unit for so long as that is possible.

As a result of a Special Town Meeting vote in late August, the Town acquired an ambulance. This was financed by a trade-in on the 1977 Chevrolet Rescue Truck together with a generous donation from the Gap Mountain Lions Club and generous support from the Little Monadnock VFW Post 10289. With the cooperation and assistance of a great many people rearranging equipment, installing air tanks on one of the pumpers, and doing minor body work and repainting of the ambulance, it was placed in service on September 15. From that time to the end of the year it made 38 calls and has been of great help to the Town.

1996 BUDGET

The Firewards have presented a budget for the coming year which is comparable to last year's operating budget. It included the usual repair and maintenance items plus some ongoing requests for acquisition of equipment such as fire fighters' gear and paging devices. We believe that we are now in a position that our equipment purchased each year is keeping up with the needs of our personnel.

We are also continuing our strong commitment to our training budget. As noted in the PERSONNEL section most all of our members have certain levels of basic fire

fighting and rescue training. In addition many members have taken and are taking advanced courses as well as recertification for the levels they have already attained. The Board of Firewards appreciates the support of the Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen in keeping this portion of the budget intact. It certainly is for the benefit of the Town. The cost to the Town of having full time personnel with this type of training would be substantial.

AUXILIARY

We again offer our thanks to those individuals who serve so loyally in our Auxiliary both in their devotion to money raising projects such as the community calendar and for assistance at major incidents for the preparation and delivery of food to members.

We also thank all of those who advertise in and support the Fitzwilliam Community Calendar.

Conservation Commission Annual Report

This is the third year we have mentioned the natural resource inventory audit. As I write this report the inventory is going to press. There will be copies in the selectmen's office and the library for inspection and enjoyment. We would like to thank everyone who contributed to this challenging and time consuming venture.

The commission met in August with the president of the Friends of Pisgah, the group that is monitering the maintenance and use of the rail beds that the State purchased from Guilford Industries. The major maintenance work this year has been done by John Holman and the snowmobile group. The Conservation Commission has an interest in the rails to trails movement and will continue to encourage the use of them as bike, horseback and walking trails. Since federal money was used by the State to buy the rail beds, the federal law that prohibits all motorized vehicles except snowmobiles will prevail.

The Conservation Commission funded the Adopt-a-Mile program which was organized and implemented by Carey Bluhm. We also funded the trees that were distributed on Earth Day. This project was organized by Bruce McLaughlin.

The Commission is requested from time to time to do a site walk on property where there may be some impact of development on the wetlands.

The Business Visitation Program

As a result of meeting with the Department of Resource and Economic Development (DRED) of the State of N.H., a business visitation program was organized. Our goal is to promote the towns economic development while expanding and retaining existing businesses. Members of INCOM interviewed key personnel of 10 local businesses using a format provided by DRED. The survey results were analyzed by INCOM and by DRED and are available from INCOM.

The visitation program is an ongoing effort. If any businesses would like to participate they may contact the commission. The visitation allows businesses to be in touch with government officials and provides helpful information. The Video program

The commission has agreed to accept an offer for the services of a Fitzwilliam resident. Mr. Joseph Pagano. to prepare and produce a 15 minute video highlighting the features of Fitzwilliam.

The video will cover the four seasons and show quality of life, recreation, education, the arts, town government/administration, industry and incentives for location in town.

When completed the video will be made available to banks, real estate agencies and those capable of promoting our town. Copies will be in the town office for those who indicate an interest in locating to Fitzwilliam.

INCOM's progress has been rewarding. As we continue to work with the mandate provided at Town Meeting 1994, we are interested in the suggestions from town residents. The commission meets the second Monday of each month at 7 pm at the Town Hall. Meetings are open to the public and attendance from all citizens are welcome.

Circulation of materials remained constant in 1995 with a total of 18,452 items loaned. Added to the collection were 496 books, 44 videos, 31 audio books and 40 periodical subscriptions. Our ongoing weeding and inventory resulted in the discarding of 781 books to keep our collection at around 15,000 volumes. As our building was designed to hold 10,000 volumes, space continues to be at a premium.

Through our computer linkup to the New Hampshire Automated Information System, we were able to search for and borrow 242 books for patrons as well as to loan 126 books to libraries across the state. NHAIS provides us with access to more than 1,000,000 titles as well as WEBSTER, the NH State Government Online Information Center.

The inventory project is in the last stages now. Next year we look forward to barcoding our books and patrons, as we begin the retrospective conversion of our records that will allow us to automate our circulation as well as our catalogs. A new computer, rewiring and remodeling of the front desk area will also be necessary. We are hoping to use grant money to accomplish some of these goals.

In our ongoing building renovations we completed roof work this year as well as the installation of a new septic system. New landscaping was added through volunteer efforts. We particularly thank the Fitzwilliam Garden Club.

Though our much needed building repairs have resulted in a "healthier" building, our immediate goal must now be to focus on meeting the ADA requirements as best we can. In 1996 we have applied, through the town, for matching funds to add a handicapped entrance to the side of the building. In addition, we continue to provide shut-in service to any in the community who cannot make it into the building.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT 1995 (continued)

In 1995 we continued our history of diverse programming with 52 programs offered and 1342 people in attendance. Highlights of the year included Avian Adventures with the NH Audubon Society, a magic show with Michael Wald, seasonal storytellers, Starbird Puppet Theater and 32 weeks of preschool storytime.

Our summer reading club, Saddle Up a Good Book, was a resounding success. We registered 80 readers in grades 1 through 6 who read 517 books and 43,290 pages. Activities included Western crafts, horse care, a hoedown and The Little Red Wagon show. Preschoolers enjoyed storytime with guest storytellers and shared books with their families in their own read-to-me club.

The Friends of the Library continued to be a vital force at the library. In addition to programming and the summer reading club, a paperback carousel, audio books, videos and books in the health, travel and arts sections were purchased by the Friends. All of this was accomplished with funds from dues as well as the annual book sale. This year corporate sponsors to the Friends allowed us to enjoy several spectacular programs. Thanks to Kennedy Publishing, Tommila Brothers, Casey J's Restaurant and Clocks on the Common for their support.

In other news, Assistant Librarian Deborah Chipman took 2 Library Technique courses on reference and children's literature. In addition, Deb and I attended a 3 day course on effective reference training in order to better answer your information needs.

Finally, many thanks to all our wonderful volunteers, Judy Hancock, Olga Rankin, Harriet Underwood, the Friends and to all the others along the way who make this a special place to be.

The actual cost of all services provided in 1995 with all funding sources is projected to be \$135,157.00.

The total cost of services provided for a partial fee, or at no charge to residents in 1995 is projected to be \$3,326.70 for home care and \$1,404.00 for Meals-on-Wheels.

HOME HEALTH CARE REPORT (continued) For 1996, we recommend an appropriation of \$6,500 to continue home care services at the current level. We also recommend an appropriation of \$934 for the Meals-On-Wheels Program.

American's with Disabilities Act (ADA) Annual Report

The American's with Disabilities Act (ADA) was established by the Congress in 1990. The intent is to increase accessibility, employment opportunities and services to the millions of Americans who are disabled.

The Town of Fitzwilliam has been addressing the ADA and much progress has been made. The town has completed the self assessment and the transitional plan, addressing all facility and program needs of the town and the people.

This past year Fitzwilliam has participated in a pilot program with Southwestern Regional Planning Commission. The end result of this pilot program is being eligible for grant money to assist the town in improving its' accessibility. Three areas of need that the grant may help to fund have been identified as an accessible entrance to the library, renovating the bathrooms at the Public Safety Building to make them accessible and replacing the chair lift in the Town Hall with a platform lift.

The transitional plan is available for review in the Town Hall. Anyone who would be interested in serving on an advisory committee for the ADA should contact the Selectmen's office. Also, any individual who needs special accommodations for any town function or town service should notify the Selectmen's office in advance to ensure the accommodations can be done in a timely manner.


