

To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Town Hall, Park street, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the town charges for the ensuing year, and appropriate money for same.
3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
4. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.
5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
6. To see what amount the town will vote to raise for the retirement of town water bonds, or a sinking fund, and appropriate money therefor.
7. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriate money for police for the ensuing year.
8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of a trunk line road.
9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for trunk line aid.
10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling permanently built roads.
12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sewer and water commission.
13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for band concerts and common.
14. To see what amount the town will vote to raise for the retirement of Municipal Building Bonds and appropriate money therefor.
15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a permanent honor roll.
16. To see what amount the town will vote to raise and appro-

priate for the retirement of town notes.

17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the completion of the Municipal Building.

18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for district nurse.

19. To see what action the town will take in regard to installing a water and sewer commission at the Cascades and raise money or issue bonds for same.

20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate twenty-eight hundred dollars to curb a sidewalk not less than four feet wide and fill with cinders, from Hannaford's corner to Church street.

21. To see what action the town will take in regard to laying out a road from School street to Promenade street and raise and appropriate money therefor.

22. To hear reports of town officers, agents and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

# Report of Budget Committee

## *To the Voters of the Town of Gorham:*

The budget committee respectfully submits the following report and recommendations.

The first meeting of your committee was called January 7, and weekly meetings have been held, as well as some specials, eight in all.

Notice of these meetings was posted in the post office and on the bulletin board, and the public invited to attend.

Several of our citizens have attended our meetings, and presented their views on the needs of the town, and various projects for its betterment. While all matters presented to us are desirable, and would make for the betterment of the community, we are compelled by the question of expense to refrain from recommending them all.

We have endeavored to consider everything carefully and fairly, keeping in mind the needs of all parts of the town; the necessity of maintaining, and where possible, raising the present standards in all departments; the probable future needs and growth of the town; and, at the same time, the necessity of keeping our tax rate within reasonable limits.

The appropriations as recommended by your committee amount to \$4,439.25 more than last year, and whereas last year \$16,860.00 was available from funds in the treasury, so that only \$67.867.75 was raised by taxation; this year there are no funds on hand which can be diverted from other purposes, and whatever amounts are appropriated will have to be assessed.

This will make the tax rate somewhat larger than last year, but your committee can see no way to avoid it.

The committee voted to recommend that you make the following appropriations:

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**DETAILED EXPLANATION OF APPROPRIATIONS  
RECOMMENDED**

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**Town Charges---\$7,000.00**

This is the amount asked for by the selectmen, and out of this sum will be paid the interest on our bonded and floating debt.

**Highways and Bridges---\$3,300.00**

It will be necessary to paint all the iron bridges this year. The road from the top of Marble hill to the Shelburne line should be improved. There are two culverts to put in, and with the necessary work at the Cascades, and in other parts of the town and on our streets, the above amount is needed. We therefore recommend that it be raised and assessed.

**Trunk Line Maintenance---\$3,000.00**

If the town raises the above amount the state will add a like sum, making \$6,000.00 for repairing and maintaining the East Side trunk line.

**Trunk Line Aid--\$2,500.00**

To this amount the state will add \$2,500.00 making a total of \$5,000.00 available for use on the cross country state road from McLeods corner to the Randolph line.

**Street Lighting--\$2,300.00**

A few new lights must be installed, and an increase of \$200.00 over last year's appropriation is recommended.

**Police--\$1,400.00**

This amount provides for one policeman, as heretofore.

Several of our citizens have come before your committee with a plea for more police protection, advocating two regular policemen in Gorham village and one at the Cascades. This would be desirable in many ways, and we believe would do much to raise the standard of order and respect for law in the community, but in view of the fact that it would call for an additional appropriation of \$2,500.00 to \$3,000.00, and considering the unavoidable increase in our tax rate, your committee does not feel like making any definite recommendation in the matter. Instead, we bring it to the attention of the voters, in this way, for their consideration.

**Public Library--1,000.00**

Owing to the expense of moving to the new rooms in the municipal building, and the increase in patronage, we recommend the above appropriation.

**Sinking Fund--\$6,000.00**

According to law a certain amount must be provided for, each year, to retire our bonds when due. We therefore recommend the following sums be raised and assessed.

For water and sewer bonds. ....	\$ 3,500 00
For municipal building bonds .....	2,500 00

**Retiring Town Notes--\$3,000.00**

This is the portion of our floating debt which we are obliged by law to pay this year, and it must be raised and assessed.

**District Nurse--\$1,000**

This is the amount asked for by the District Nursing Association, and believing that the experiment has been an unqualified success, we recommend that it be raised and assessed.

**Municipal Building--\$3,500.00**

The building committee ask for this sum to complete their work on the building, and to repair or rebuild the sidewalk and steps around it as may be necessary.

**Water and Sewers---\$3,500.00**

An extension of the sewer at the upper village appears to be necessary this year, and with other short extensions and the ordinary repairs and expenses, it is estimated that the above amount will be required.

**Oiling Streets---\$300.00**

If our streets are oiled, this amount will be necessary in addition to what is done by the state, and we recommend that it be raised and assessed.

**Band Concerts and the Common---\$500.00**

We recommend that the above sum be raised and assessed for improving and caring for the common, and for band concerts.

**State Tax---\$6,520.00**

This estimate is based on last year's tax. It is a fixed charge, and must be raised and assessed.

**County Tax---\$6,250.00**

This is also based on last year's tax, and is another fixed charge which must be raised and assessed.

**Schools, Required by Law---\$6,496.42**

This is a legal requirement, and must be raised and assessed. We base the amount on last year's apportionment, and it is approximate.

**Permanent Honor Roll---\$500.00**

Believing that it is a duty we owe to our boys who have responded to the call of country and of humanity; who have left home and family and friends that they might help to bring peace and happiness to the world, and remembering that some of them have made the supreme sacrifice, and will not return to us. Believing also that every true American citizen is ready and anxious to do his share in providing this small tribute to them;

We recommend that a committee be appointed to procure and erect, in some prominent place in our village, a suitable permanent Roll of Honor, or memorial, bearing the names of all those who, from our town, have entered the service of America or the Allied Nations in this world war, and we also recommend that the sum of \$500.00 be raised and appropriated for the same.

**Water and Sewers at Cascades**

This is a matter which has been considered at the last two town meetings, and several surveys have been made by the water and sewer commission, but last year it was put over on account of the high cost of material and the scarcity of labor.

The need is imperative that something be done in this matter, and we recommend that action be taken at this March meeting, authorizing the water and sewer commission, or a special commission created for that purpose, to install or arrange for a suitable system of water and sewers at the Cascades; and that a bond issue be provided for, to meet the expense of such installation.

Our thanks are due to town officials in all departments, who have given us all the information and assistance possible, to aid us in arriving at our conclusions in the several matters before us.

## Gorham District Nursing Service

Gorham, N. H., Feb. 1, 1919.

The district nursing service has included bedside nursing care and different branches of hygiene.

During the first month of active work (July, 1918) all children five years of age and under, whose parents wished to co-operate, were weighed, measured and examined by the doctors and nurses of the town, under the auspices of The Woman's Club.

Hygiene has been taught in the schools and superficial examination of all pupils in the grades has been given by the nurse.

Some prenatal work has been done. This branch of the work is being developed in accordance with the ideas of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Co., and the Instructive District Nursing Association of Boston, Mass.

More intensive work with the children is hoped to be accomplished during the coming year.
