You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House, in said Town, on the twelfth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects :

- 1st. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2d. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations of the same.
- 3d. To hear the reports of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Road Agent, Overseer of the Poor, School Board, Liquor Agent, and Auditors, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 4th. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair highways and appropriate the same.
- 5th. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money to pay town debts, or take any action relating thereto.
- 6th. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate twenty-five dollars for the Veterans' Association of Greenfield for Memorial Day.
- 7th. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for schools, in addition to the amount required by law.
- 8th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for a Library Building in addition to what has been raised.
- 9th. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum that the Jones Farm brought, to pay to Library Treasurer.
- 10th. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to buy the liquor for the Liquor Agent and the town to have the profit if any.
- 11th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed twenty-five dollars, to letter the Arch at Greenvale Cemetery.
