TOWN MEETING WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the TOWN OF LANDAFF, in the COUNTY of GRAFTON, in said STATE, qualified to vote on Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the TOWN HALL in said LANDAFF on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, polls to be open from 5 p.m. to 10 p.m. and at eight of the clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for T.R.A. roads and raise and appropriate \$389.53 for the same. The State's share is \$2,596.86.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$506.94 for the White Mt. Region Association.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$377.00 for the North Country Home Health Agency, Inc.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$377.50 for the White Mountain Mental Health Center.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$265.00 for the North Country Council.
- 9. To see if the Town will appropriate \$2,500.00 to make the second payment on the Town maps to John E. O'Donnell and Associates and authorize withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for this purpose.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new sander and appropriate \$1,100.00 for this purpose.
- 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to pay on December 31 the balance, if any, of the money appropriated for fires to the Volunteer Fire Department.

- 12. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$2,000.00 to resurface Pearl Lake Road from McGuires to Bronsons. The total cost of this project is estimated at \$4,368.00.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to reopen the road from Route 112 to the home of Emri Bassett.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$1,000.00 to be added to the Equipment Fund.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE LANDAFF VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

In 1978 the department responded to two Mutual Aid calls, three chimney fires and two brush fires. It also participated in a Mutual Aid drill.

We continue to hold meetings on the 1st and 3rd Mondays of each month.

We had a successful Auction and Raffle, thanks to the generosity of you, the people.

Our Fire Chief attends the Twin State Mutual Aid Fire Association monthly meetings. I would like to say a few words about the Mutual Aid Association. There are 17 departments at this time in the Association. The Fire Chiefs are the voting members, but all firemen are entitled to attend and participate. Fire Mutual Aid is truly neighbor helping neighbor. Twin State has been doing this for more than 20 years.

On November 12, 1978, after 3 or more years of planning and hard work, done mostly by volunteer firemen, a fire dispatch began operating. This is on a 6 months trial basis and is operating out of the Grafton County Sheriff's Department. At the present time no fire phones are answered; they are used to call Mutual Aid. At the end of the trial period a decision will be made whether to continue this operation or not. It makes for a much faster response.

Twin State has some other benefits, such as a compressor for filling air tanks, training film library, fire training schools and Mutual Aid drills, all for better fire fighting ability. Mutual Aid has been very valuable and I think it will be more so in the years to come.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF AND FOREST FIRE WARDEN

For more than 80 years, a cooperative effort between the State of New Hampshire and local forest fire authorities has created a forest fire prevention and suppression program that is recognized as superior throughout the United States.

Since the first forest fire laws were written in 1895, the state and local community governments have worked together to prevent and combat forest fires.

Today, 249 forest fire wardens and more than 1,800 deputy wardens are appointed every three years by the State Forester to work with the members of the State Forest Fire staff in this effort. State funds are used to pay one-half the cost of forest fire suppression costs incurred by local forest fire organizations, within pay rates established by the Governor and Council. State funds matched by local funds are used to purchase hand tools to suppress forest fires, to train local forest fire crews and in forest fire prevention work.

All outside burning, when the ground is not covered with snow, is permitted only after obtaining a written fire permit from your local Forest Fire Warden. Penalty for burning without a permit when one is required is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine up to \$1,000 or a jail term of up to one year or both.

REMEMBER, ONLY YOU CAN PREVENT FOREST FIRES!

SCHOOL NURSE REPORT - 1978

BLUE SCHOOL - LANDAFF

The school health program was carried out as usual. Physical examinations were given by Dr. McGregor, the school doctor. Parents were notified of any problems found.

Audio and visual screenings were done on all students by me and notices of any problems were sent to parents. I was unable to weigh the students as their scales are broken.

Eleven students again are participating in the plaque control program sponsored by the State Department of Dental Health. This program has been very successful in the past.

The preschool vision and hearing clinic was held in October. Several children have been seen at the State-sponsored clinics: Cardiac and Crippled Children.

Upon completion of the immunization survey last year, it was found that many students were not fully immunized in accordance with State standards. Landaff children were transported to Lisbon for the immunization clinics. The following immunizations were administered by Dr. Mc Gregor: measles-4, mumps-3, polio boosters-6, diptheria and tetanus boosters-6, combined measles, mumps and rubella-2, combined measles and rubella-1, tine tests-2. Records of the immunizations were sent home.

I completed a 4-credit course from the University of New Hampshire this year and have attended several school nurse workshops and meetings.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS ANNUAL REPORT

As Superintendent of Schools, it is with pleasure that I submit my annual report to the Board of Education and the citizens of the Landaff School District.

During the past year 1978-79, there were 19 resident students attending the Blue School. Our tuition rates, which are established annually by the Board of Education for this school year is: \$1,325.00.

The Union-wide enrollments for this school year are 2238.

Major changes in our administrative staff took place this Fall when Mr. Glenn Stillings, former Assistant Superintendent, accepted the position of Principal at Lisbon Regional School District and Mr. Robert Davies became Assistant Superintendent. We know Mr. Stillings as a successful administrator and are confident he will continue as a principal.

Mr. Davies worked several years in New Jersey as an elementary principal and recently completed two years on the superintendent level in Oregon. His extensive and successful elementary administrative experience will strengthen services to our districts in this critical area.

Since October, 1978, the Assistant Superintendent's office has been directly responsible to the Superintendent for:

- consulting and advising district school boards in teacherboard negotiations, as requested.
- recruiting and interviewing new teachers and recommending their employment to local school boards.
- coordinating and directing Staff Development and re-certification of all professional staff in the Supervisory Union.
- developing and coordinating a federal grant (Title IV), unionwide for a three year period, concerned with reading improvement and improved school library facilities.
- observing and consulting with building principals, particularly at the elementary school level.
- assisting the Superintendent of Schools in preparation for school board meetings.
- acting as the building administrator for Blue School in the Landaff School District.
- developing, directing and coordinating "Right to Read" Programs in the Supervisory Union with liaison between White Mountains Supervisory Union #35 and the State Department of Education.
- fulfilling other assignments as directed by the Superintendent of schools.

Salary and employment policies have now been finalized in five of the six districts served by this office. The Assistant Superintendent's office provides direct or indirect assistance to the local school boards only if asked. It is not our posture to press this service upon any local district. We have, however, served each district to a greater or lesser degree--depending upon the local district's requests.

From October, 1978 through January, 1979 this office has reviewed over 200 applications and conducted over 30 screening interviews and reference checks in recommending candidates to school boards for their decision on eight teaching vacancies in four or our districts.

In November, December and January this office has led a committee of school librarians and teacher representatives in the development of a Federal Title IV-B Grant application for over \$7,000 a year for the next three years. These funds, if granted, will be used to improve school library facilities and emphasize reading improvement in grades one through ten.

The Assistant Superintendent's office has reviewed the certification status of each professional employee in your Supervisory Union. He also reviews these twice a year with the Office of Teacher Standards and Certification, New Hampshire Department of Education. Wherever a question or concern was evident, the individual teacher has been contacted and records updated. The Assistant Superintendent, with the Staff Development Chairman and former Chairman, have honored requests from four schools to present an explanation to teachers of the revised Staff Development Program Handbook "Growing Together". Currently in New Hampshire, each teacher must complete twenty-five re-certification units showing professional growth every three years. If this is not done, the teacher is not re-certified.

Each school has been visited and observed at least two times between October, 1978 and January, 1979 with observations communicated to the building principals. Also, the building principal's teacher observations are reviewed by the Assistant Superintendent who also may act as a hearing officer in certain grievance procedures.

The "Right to Read" program is a concerted public effort to reach all non-readers, problem readers, as well as better readers, encouraging people of all ages to read more and better. For example, we have some native American adults in our area, as well as alien citizens, who would profit greatly and quickly from an intensive basic reading program. Hopefully, the Right to Read program will take on greater emphasis in coming months.

In general, the Assistant Superintendent's office performs these and other functions as a continuing service for your White Mountains Supervisory Union #35. The staff consists of one administrator and one secretary. These services would require approximately two and one-half administrators, with as much clerical time, if they were performed by local districts or combinations of local districts within the Supervisory Union.

Multiple Handicapped Unit

Last year the Developmental Center for multiple handicapped children of our districts was forced to close because of severe changes in federal law. The total responsibility for the education of these children was thrust upon their home districts. With the full financial support of our districts, including those who did not have multihandicapped youngsters, we opened our new White Mountains Consortium-Multiple Handicap Unit at Lakeway Elementary School on time this September with eleven students. The students are well adjusted to their new school and staff. Their individual progress reports are

very encouraging.

This Fall we were able to negotiate an educational grant with the State Department of Education which has taken over the major annual costs of this program. Thus the funds set aside by the districts have been returned to their budgets.

Psychological Services

One of our concerns over the past few years has been the everincreasing cost of mandated psychological services. State and Federal laws now require that certain of our children have psychological services. This is especially true when we work with certain of our handicapped students. In the past, most of these costs have been borne through Title I and/or the districts themselves.

Some Unions near us have budgeted for full or part-time psychologists. We have not had to follow this course as we recently had approved a federal grant which will take care of our psychological service needs for at least the next two years without any direct increase to our districts. Dr. Richard Sanders is now serving as district psychologist for our nine elementary and secondary buildings.

Accountability

Last year several members of the New Hampshire Legislature were determined to pass bills that would force statewide educational accountability upon each school district in New Hampshire, to determine publicly whether or not our children receive an appropriate basic education for the taxpayer's educational dollar.

The State Department of Education forestalled the passage of these bills by promising to develop its own "accountability" plan authorized by educational laws that are already on the books. The department also asked for three years (1978-81) to put its plan into action. The Commissioner of Education feared the local control of education would be greatly deminished by a statewide legislative educational accountability program. Apparently he was successful, because no accountability plans were passed into law during the past biannium.

A resulting plan from the State Board of Education calls for individual districts to develop their own accountability plans along guidelines mandated by the State.

The Boards of Education that comprise Supervisory Union #35 have had mixed reactions to the State Board of Education. All of our districts have always been accountable to their taxpayers in many ways. Achievement testing, public hearings, advisory committees, weekly newspaper accounts of educational activities, forums, publicly-adopted educational curriculum, budget hearings, and annual meetings are all steps we have taken to keep our school public up-to-date on individual district educational programs.

Now in order to fully comply with the mandated requirements, each of the districts will have to rework the present curriculum, establish new committees and/or expand present ones, again publish goals and objectives, and re-evaluate already-adopted proven testing procedures.

The Boards of Education of Supervisory Union #35, naturally, have mixed feelings about the State mandated accountability program. Bethlehem, Lafayette and Profile districts are considering a joint accountability plan provided there are no new costs to the districts, and there is proof it will make their present instructional programs more cohesive and still serve individual district needs. Lisbon Regional School District was the first of our districts to submit a written plan to the State Department of Education and at this writing has approved continued work on the plan. This work includes joint effort with Landaff School District. Littleton District has said "NO" to the State plan proposed and continues to support its own district accountability plan. They will consider any state curriculum or test as to its usefulness to Littleton, but further than that they will not go at this time.

Handbook II (Revised Budget Procedure)

We have been advised that a new budget format will be mandated by the State of New Hamsphire for the 1980-81 school year. This procedural change is described in Handbook II (Revised) and has already been adopted by the majority of the state governments in the United States.

Its primary purposes are to provide more information for the taxpayer and to coordinate state budget reporting systems compatible with those used by the federal government.

In order to do this, an entirely new budget coding system has been developed. Our present three-and four-digit budget code numbers will be extended to eight-and ten-digit budget code numbers. Some examples of these proposed budget code changes are:

NOW 1980-1981

Code 210 (salaries) ------ 1100-110-1-12 Code 535 (contracted services)--2550-510-1-13 Code 1267 (physical education)--110-741-2-13-66

Also, all of our administrative and clerical staffs who are directly involved in budget preparation will have to attend workshops this Spring in preparation for the 1980-81 budget format change-over. (It seems odd to be writing about a 1980-81 new budget development program in January 1979 when the 1978-79 budget year has not been completed and the 1979-80 budgets have not been adopted).

Even though our budgets will be 30% longer, we feel confident that we can handle this change-over because of the computer facilities the districts own at the Supervisory Union office. Without this sophisticated equipment, the implementation of a major budget change (Handbook II Revised) would certainly become a monumental new expense. It is our belief that the new budget system, when it is fully functional and understood, will prove to be an asset to our district taxpayers.

Each year a frustrated taxpayer laments, "What do we need a Supervisory Union Office for?" Unless you have worked very closely with the union office as our board members do, it is difficult to describe all the services that our Supervisory Union provides, directly or indirectly, to our six school districts.

In 1973 the White Mountains Supervisory Union published the following to describe its activities - #1-29.

- 1. Federal aid to education
- 2. State financial aid to school districts
- Educational Foundations financial aid and assistance (much travel is involved for each of the above to secure funds)
- 4. Sale of bonds and investments
- 5. Development of operational budgets
- 6. Establishing transportation routes and issuing contracts
- 7. Development of school calendars
- 8. School census
- 9. Employment of professional and non-professional staff; issuing contracts; development of salary schedules and policies
- 10. All correspondence, reports, etc., for the School Boards
- 11. All federal and state applications and reports
- 12. Development of curriculum
- 13. Organization of district meetings according to the laws of the State of New Hamsphire
- Purchasing of all materials and supplies, payment of invoices, etc.
- 15. All bidding procedures for supplies, materials, fuel, etc.
- 16. Evaluation of staff and facilities according to the laws of the State of New Hampshire
- 17. Legal responsibilities of the district as determined by the Attorney General, State Department of Education, and local counsel
- 18. Coordination of guidance programs
- 19. Coordination of insurance programs
- 20. Education of the handicapped
- 21. Development of School Board policies and job specifications
- 22. Payroll-Social Security, teacher retirement, state retirement, etc.
- 23. Establishment of attendance school registers and truancy
- 24. Coordination of the federal school lunch program
- 25. Determination of related services school nurses, mentally handicapped, remedial programs, etc.
- 26. Securing government surplus properties
- 27. Establishment of federally supported vocational education programs
- 28. IBM data processing payroll, accounts receivable, budget control, student reporting, etc.
- 29. Development of school directory

In 1979 we can safely say that Supervisory Union #35 continues to provide the previously listed services and to this list we should now add - #30-38.

- 30. Staff Development Programs and re-certification of professional personnel
- 31. White Mountains Consortium (Union Multi-Handicapped Program)
- 32. Implementation of Handbook II (Revised)
- 33. Unemployment Compensation (pending)
- 34. R.S.A. 273A (State Collective Bargaining Law)
- 35. "Accountability"
- 36. Mandated 8-hour Bus Driver Training Program (Sept. 1979)
- 37. Supervision of the placement and payroll of CETA employees
- 38. New Federal laws P.L. 94-142 on Section 504

In seven short years the list of responsibilities has grown and grown, while the number of administrators and secretaries at the

Supervisory Union level has appreciably decreased.

The preceding comments are not a plea for more staff at the Union level. They are, however, an attempt to describe what we do for our six districts according to their individual needs and State and Federal law.

The unrecognized strength of a school district are the volunteers who work so long and hard for their district -- The town residents who transport children, faithfully attend meetings, raise money, serve as volunteer aides, and support their teachers and principals -- these make a significant difference in our schools. We wish to thank all of you - for you are the heart of our schools.

ACTING PRINCIPAL'S ANNUAL REPORT

Landaff's Blue School student enrollment has fluctuated this year between 19 and 15 children. In its deliberations with Linda Smith, our teacher, the Board chose not to employ the teacher's aide budgeted. At the Board direction, I sought other alternatives which would be of less cost (or no cost) to Landaff residents. As a result, we now have Miss Terry Flaherty, a highly-qualified teacher's aide, from federal Title I funds. She will work six hours a week with Mrs. Linda Smith through June, 1979.

The Board interviewed and hired Mrs. Karen Shepatin in December to replace Mrs. Karen Cunningham as part-time art teacher. She, along with Mr. John Blake as speech therapist, Mrs. Maryann Langdoc as music teacher, and Miss Flaherty as aide (all part-time positions), continue to provide a good, basic, well-rounded school experience for the children in Blue School.

Mrs. Helen Currier is your Board representative in the area of "Accountability." A recent mandate from the State Board of Education requires each school district to develop educational criteria for its overall educational program with measures of student performance. In our case, we are working jointly with Lisbon since our children normally begin attending there in grade six.

Willing donations of time, equipment, money, and "elbow grease" from civic groups and individuals represent the community spirit of Landaff's Blue School. The work of the Mount Hope Grange Community Service Committee, along with work by other individuals, plus the free use of light and heavy equipment and a generous donation by the late Everett Noyes, have made possible our greatly-improved playground, the ditch and drain pipe for the well, the well cap, and winterizing the outside of the building. These kinds of activities achieve community pride in Blue School--and reduce tax increases.

A serious consideration for the School Board and Landaff residents is the continued maintenance and needed improvements to the school building. One face of the building had new siding last year, but three sides still remain in questionable condition.

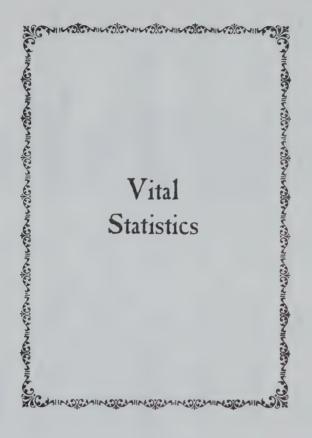
