SELECTMAN, SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER, VOLUNTEER, CITIZEN

Jim Culverhouse passed away after a courageous battle with declining health. He was born in Springfield, Mass. and was a graduate of Worcester State College. He lived in Milton since 1985. Jim is survived by his wife of 36 years, Esther, their three sons, Jason, Matthew and Joshua, and one grandson, Cory. Jim was a Vietnam War Veteran, having served in the U.S. Coast Guard. He was employed as a letter carrier with the United States Postal Service in Sanford, Maine.

Jim was very generous with his time, volunteering as a 20 year member of the Milton Parks and Recreation Commission. He was also involved with Milton Little League Baseball for many years, and worked for 15 years to make the Winter Carnival such a wonderful success. He served as Town Selectman for a total of nine years, including several years as the board's chairman. He was a member of the Milton School Board, past president of the Postal Union in Sanford, Maine, and a member of the American Legion and VFW.

At his funeral, Jim was remembered as a remarkable public servant. "During his nine years as selectman, he handled himself with quiet, competence. As chairman of the board, he effectively ran the meetings with a calm demeanor. He kept the town out of the newspapers and got town's business done without fanfare. Among his accomplishments were stable taxes, the purchase of the town hall and the Emma Ramsey Center and the rebuilding of the Base Ball Park at the Town Beach. Jim represented a fast disappearing natural resource, the selfless, hardworking, individual who is deeply committed to his community." With his steady hand and devotion to our town, he will be truly missed.

About Milton

Milton is a small town with spectacular scenery of the Milton Three Ponds and abounding with historical buildings and sites. Most of the town's population wraps around the water's edge enjoying the quiet tranquility of the large fresh water ponds fed by the Salmon Falls River. Growth also climbs the surrounding foothills and Teneriffe Mountain creating winding roads through old forests and farmlands with great outlook spots along the way.

Incorporated in 1802, Milton was originally the 'North Parish' of Rochester. Milton is a rural town situated in southeastern New Hampshire, with a population of over 4,000. The major transportation system providing access within Strafford County and to connecting routes is the Spaulding Turnpike, a divided expressway running north to south through the town. It connects with Interstate 95 at Portsmouth, in close proximity to Pease International Tradeport. US route 4, an east-west highway, provides access to Concord and Manchester and NH route 125 is a north to south local road, connecting many of the smaller towns plus has a section over Plummer Ridge that is a natural and scenic state highway.

Small convenience stores and gas stations provide patrons and visitors with local news and friendly conversations. Other shopping needs are primarily met in neighboring Rochester, as are hospital facilities. The Spaulding Highway access in Milton makes access to Dover and Portsmouth very convenient for additional shopping, malls, hospitals and other medical services.

Milton's municipal government consists of: an elected three member Board of Selectmen; Budget Committee; Planning Board; Zoning Board of Adjustment; five member School Board; and numerous other appointed boards and committees. The Town has an excellent on-call Fire and Ambulance Department, along with a well staffed Police Department and summer marine patrol. The Selectmen are ready to assist new business ventures in securing land in the Town's Industrial Park.

Recreational opportunities abound. The Winter Carnival held in February, is a weekend-long event with festivities like snowmobile races and ice cutting held amidst a spectacular winter backdrop on the ice and in the snow with indoor activities for all ages. The annual 4th of July celebration in Milton Mills offers events for all, including a parade. In the winter ice fishing, ice racing and ice-skating abounds. The warmer weather lures fishermen, boaters, and swimmers. Residents and visitors often come and relax at the Town Beach. Other recreational amenities include two baseball fields, and two picnic areas. Seasonal camping is enjoyed at the local campground on Northeast Pond, and the New Hampshire Farm Museum offers a nostalgic look at old-time farming with special programs throughout the year.

DELIBERATIVE (First) SESSION

The Annual Town Meeting (articles of business in the Town Warrant) was held on February 2, 2008 at the Nute High School cafeteria. The meeting was called to order by Moderator, Chris Jacobs at 1:06 pm. All recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Moderator Jacobs asked for a moment of silence for those departed last year and this meeting was in memory of John Hescocock, Selectman and Emma Ramsey former Tax Collector and School Board member. Next, Moderator Jacobs introduced himself, Tom Gray and Charlie Karcher – Board of Selectmen and noted that Selectman Leo Lessard was not present, Ed Ryan – Town Administrator, Jim Sessler – Town Attorney, Carol L Martin – Town Clerk, Pam Arnold, Bob Srnc, Larry Brown, Lisa Stewart, Dan Steinbach and Kim Morrill – Budget Committee Members, Rosemary Jeffries, Karen Brown and Bob Ferris – Supervisors of the Checklist, Larry Brown and Bob Srnc – State Representatives, Andy Lucier – Fire Chief, Pat Smith – Public Works Director, and Mark McGowan- Police Chief. The rules to be used for today’s meeting were explained and non-Voters would be allowed to speak. However, only registered voters could vote on the articles.

A letter was drawn by Moderator Jacobs for the placement of names on the ballot. The letter “A” was drawn.

By a show of hands, the voters decided to act on the articles in order.

Moderator Jacobs read the warrant (first and second session).

Robin Weeks, Fire and Ambulance, gave a presentation on the current fire station and the need for a new station.

Article 2

Selectman Tom Gray, seconded by Selectman Charlie Karcher, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$975,000.00 for the purpose of the construction of a new fire station in Milton, the total of such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the Municipal Finance Act, RSA 33:1 et seq., as amended; to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, obtain and accept federal, state, or other aid, if any, which may be available for said project and to comply with all laws applicable to said project; to authorize the Selectmen to issue, negotiate, sell and deliver said bonds and notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon and the maturity and other terms thereof; and to authorize the Selectmen to take any other action or pass any other vote relative thereto. (3/5 ballot vote required for approval)

Selectman Gray, seconded by Selectman Karcher, made the motion to amend the article by adding “passage of this article shall override the 10 percent limitation imposed on this appropriation due to the non-recommendation of the Budget Committee” at the end. Amendment carried.

Main motion, as amended, carried. To be placed on ballot as amended.

Tom Gray made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 2, seconded by Charlie Karcher. Motion carried.

Article 3

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karker, made the motion to raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$3,072,942.00. Should this article be defeated, the operating budget shall be \$3,089,808.00 which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. Warrant Article 3 (operating budget) does not include special or separate warrant articles.

Tom Gray made the motion, seconded by Charlie Karcher, to amend the article by adding \$1,150.00 to the budget, making the total \$3,074,092.00. Amendment failed.

Steve Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to lower the operating budget to \$2,883,928.00. This would be the same as last year. Amendment failed.

To be placed on ballot as written.

Tom Gray made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 3, seconded by Charlie Karcher. Motion carried.

Article 4

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the Applebee Road Landfill Cleanup for the purpose of costs of cleanup of leather scraps and other items at the Applebee Road Landfill as mandated by the Federal Environmental Protection Agency, including the use of the fund as matching funds for grants that might come available, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400,000.00 for deposit in that account and to authorize the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from that fund. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article.)

Tom Gray made the motion to reduce the appropriation by \$75,000.00, making the total appropriation \$325,000.00, seconded by Charlie Karcher. Amendment carried. To be placed on ballot as amended.

Pam Arnold made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 4, seconded by Tom Gray. Motion carried.

Moderator Jacobs wanted to publicly thank CMA, EPA and DES for all their help with the Applebee Road landfill cleanup.

Article 5

Andy Lucier, seconded by Tom Gray, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$290,000 for Highway Road Construction, of which at least \$25,000 will be used for overlaying roads. This appropriation will be non-lapsing for 2 years or until the project is complete, whichever ever comes first. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 5. Motion carried.

Article 6

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$28,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing a Police Department vehicle as shown on the town's Capital Improvement Plan. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article). Motion carried.

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 6. Motion carried.

Article 7

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 to be placed in the Milton Fire Department Equipment and Apparatus Capital Reserve Fund as shown on the town's Capital Improvement Plan. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article.)

Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 7. Motion carried.

Article 8

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 to be placed in the Milton Highway Department Truck Capital Reserve Fund as shown on the town's Capital Improvement Plan. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article).

Steve Gagne, seconded by Les Elder, made the motion to amend the article to \$0.00.

By card vote the results: Yes 18 and No 16. Amendment carried. The main motion as amended to be placed on ballot.

Steve Gagne, seconded by Pam Arnold made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 8. Motion carried.

Article 9

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 to be placed in the Milton Highway Department Equipment Capital Reserve Fund as shown on the town's Capital Improvement Plan. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article).

Les Elder made the motion to amend the article to \$0.00, seconded by Steve Gagne. Motion failed. To be placed on ballot as written.

Tom Gray made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 9, seconded by Charlie Karcher. Motion carried.

Article 10

Tom Gray, seconded by Jim Clark, make the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to be placed in the Milton Fire Department Vehicle Repairs and Improvements Capital Reserve Fund as shown on the town's Capital Improvement Plan. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article.) Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as written.

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 10. Motion carried.

Article 11

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karker, made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,000.00 to be placed in the Milton Free Public Library Capital Reserve Fund. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the general operating budget article.)

Judy Lover, seconded by Jen Palmatier, made the motion to amend the article to read \$0.00. Amendment carried. To be placed on ballot as amended.

Jim Clark, seconded by Steve Gagne, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 11. Motion carried.

Article 12

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the Milton Townhouse for the purpose of repairs and restoration to the building, including the use of the fund as matching funds for grants that might come available, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be placed in the Milton Townhouse Capital Reserve Fund, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from this fund. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article.)

Judy Lover, seconded by Pam Arnold, made the motion to amend the article to read \$0.00. By card vote the results: Yes 12 and No 20. Motion failed.

Dan Steinbach, seconded by Larry Brown, made the motion to amend the article to read \$3,000.00. By card vote the results: Yes 20 and No 13. Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as amended.

Pam Arnold, seconded by Jim Clark, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 12. Motion carried.

Article 13

Steve Gagne, seconded by Jim Clark made the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be placed in the Milton Recreation Department Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of repairs and improvements to town parks and park buildings and the purchase of equipment related to the parks and recreation programs, as shown on the town's Capital Improvement Plan, including the use of the fund as matching funds for grants that might come available and to authorize the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from this fund. This is a Special Warrant Article. (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article 3, the operating budget article.)

Steve Gagne, seconded by Jim Clark, made the motion to amend the article by adding "previously established" after Capital Reserve Fund and before for. Motion carried. The main motion as amended to be placed on ballot.

Tom Gray made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 13, seconded by Charlie Karcher. Motion carried.

Article 14

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher made the motion to adopt the "New Hampshire Building Code" or "State Building Code" pursuant to RSA 155-A:1 and to adopt by reference the International Building Code 2006, the International Plumbing Code 2006, the International Mechanical Code 2006, the International Energy Conservation Code 2006, and the International Residential Code 2006, as published by the International Code Council, and the National Electric Code 2005. Motion carried.

Tom Gray, seconded by Steve Gagne, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 14. Motion carried.

Article 15 (by petition)

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to reclassify a portion of Piggott Hill Road, beginning at the Paey Pit Road, (approximately 1,840 feet from Alan Hastings Road), and then southwesterly for 2,160 feet from a Class VI road to a Class V (Town maintained) road.

Tom Gray, seconded by Doreen Valente, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 15. Motion carried.

Article 16 (by petition)

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to reclassify Ellis Drive in it’s entirety from a Class VI road to a Class V (Town maintained) road.

Chris Jacobs, seconded by Pam Arnold made the motion to add the words “subject to the owner (s) granting a deed to the right of way to the town” at the end. Amendment carried.

To be placed on ballot as amended.

Tom Gray, seconded by Brian Boyers, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 16. Motion carried.

Article 17

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion (pursuant to RSA 154:24) to authorize the Milton Fire-Rescue to go to the aid of any other city, town, village, or fire district within or without the state, for the purpose of extinguishing fire or rendering other emergency assistance or performing any detail as requested.

Chris Jacobs, seconded by Jim Clark, made the motion to add the wording “subject to a mutual aid agreement” at the end. Amendment carried. To be placed on ballot as amended.

Tom Gray, seconded by Jim Clark, made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 17. Motion carried.

Moderator Jacobs called for a short break while the Board of Selectmen consulted with the town attorney.

Article 18

Tom Gray, seconded by Charlie Karcher, made the motion to appoint the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from the previously established New Ambulance, ambulance equipment and /or Fire Department Revenue Account, which expenditures are to be only for purposes for which the fund was created.

Steve Gagne, seconded by Jim Clark, made the motion to add the word “vehicles” after Fire Department and before Revenue Account. Motion carried. To be placed on ballot as amended.

Jim Clark, seconded by Tom Gray made the motion to restrict reconsideration of Article 18. Motion carried.

Pam Arnold, seconded by Carol L Martin, made the motion to adjourn. Moderator Jacobs declared the meeting adjourned at 6:30 pm.

Hello to all fellow Miltonians

Another Year has come to an end, and 2008 has proven to be another very challenging year for all of us here in Milton and Milton Mills.

Due to the extreme 2007/2008 winter, and previous Budget Cuts we started off the year with an immediate strain on the total Town Budget. We had to hire outside trucking contractors to haul the snow away from the down town area and many other areas as well. This put a huge strain on an already slim budget.

On a lighter side, the 2008 Winter Carnival was huge success, a fun time was had by all that attended. The fire works display was nothing short of spectacular. We would like to express our sincere appreciation and say Thank You to our Recreation Director Christine Collins for another great job.

We would also like acknowledge and express a very sincere Thank You to all of the spectators and rescue personnel that were on hand and helped pull the Trail Groomer operator from the icy waters when that machine went through the ice at the Winter Carnival. Thanks to all of you brave individuals that man got to go home to his family.

We once again found ourselves searching for a new Town Administrator. Ed Ryan our previous Town Administrator, has chosen to resign on May 19, 2008. Ed came to Milton on January 3rd 2008 and although Ed had limited experience in Municipal Government we had truly hoped that he would grow into the position of Town Administrator.

With the passing of Daniel Steinbach in April we lost a great friend and dedicated man to the Town of Milton. Dan spent numerous hours working on the Planning Board, Budget Committee, and Zoning Board of Adjustments.

After reviewing numerous resumes' and conducting several interviews we have rehired Brian Boyers to once again become the town's part time Building Inspector and Code Enforcement Officer. Brian has many years of knowledge and experience from his previous tenure with Milton and with his current position with the Town of Alton.

Over the past couple years we have been negotiating with Metrocast to renew our Franchise agreement. This year we were successful in coming up with a mutually beneficial agreement. We were able to get Metrocast to agree to extend service to some of the outlying areas of town, and Metrocast was able to pick up some new customers.

We found that the Town of Milton has left itself vulnerable with outdated and ineffective Zoning Ordinances, and Regulations. After reviewing numerous resumes' and conducting several interviews we have chosen Jerry Coogan as our part time Planner to help straighten out some of our short falls in those areas.

We have chosen to contract with Municipal Resources Inc. for an interim Town Administrator, and were very fortunate to acquire the services of a very qualified and likeable individual named Rick Bates. Rick came to us with many years experience and knowledge in Municipal Government.

We are extremely happy to report that the Apple Bee Road Landfill site is all cleaned up and complete. There was a lot of hard work that went into the clean up effort by a lot of agencies and individuals. We would to thank each of the individuals involved for their parts in the clean up effort. Rich Haworth with EPA, John Regan with DES, Bob Grillo and his team with CMA, Drew Shelby and his team with CEA, and a special thank you to John Katwick representing the Milton Mills Cemetery Association. Without the efforts of the aforementioned individuals, and all of you Residents of Milton and Milton Mills none of this would have been possible. We are also happy to report that the clean up effort has come in under budget, by approximately \$25,000.00

In October Milton lost a Great Friend and a Great Leader. The passing of Jim Culverhouse was a great loss to each and every one of us. Jim served nine years on the Board of Selectmen. Jim also served on the Recreation Commission, the School Board and many other Committees and Sub Committees.

Then it came time to set our tax rate so that we can get the tax bills out. Due to a number of unexpected delays, we were once again unable to get all the necessary information to the Department of Revenue Administration in a timely fashion. This meant a late setting of the tax rate and a late billing of the tax bills. Once we got all the necessary documentation from all parties involved to the Department of Revenue Administration, we were finally able to set our tax rate. Although the over all tax rate increased by *“Two Dollars and Sixty Four cents”* per

increased by “*One Dollar and Ten Cents*”, of that Dollar Ten increase approximately “*Eighty Five Cents*” of that is a direct result of the cost to clean up the Applebee Road Landfill. That is a one time expense and will not show up on next years tax bill.

Late this year we were faced with an ice storm that caused devastation all across New Hampshire and beyond. This once again put the Town’s budget in peril.

We would like to recognize the individuals that in the face of this very difficult event performed flawlessly. Thanks to the Professionalism and Leadership of Fire Chief Andy Lucier and Captain Robyn Weeks all of the residents of residents of Milton and Milton Mills were well taken care of. They had directed their team of Professional fire fighters to go out and provide whatever assistance was needed. We all should all not only be proud but be thankful for the entire team of emergency personnel that we have here in Milton.

At last years Deliberative session you all had asked us to use money that was previously approved to make necessary emergency vehicle purchases, instead of asking for new money. We did just that, we had replaced a Police Cruiser, purchased the previously leased Fire Truck, and purchased a new Roll Off truck for the transfer station. These purchases were absolutely necessary and will have “NO” negative impact on any ones taxes.

In the face of all this adversity, this Board of Selectmen stood strong, and never lost our focus on what is most important. That is doing what is in the best interest of Milton and Milton Mills and all the residents of Milton and Milton Mills.

I would like to express my sincere thanks to each and every person, who worked so hard during these difficult and trying times. I honestly feel that we have the absolute finest employees and volunteers anywhere, and I am extremely proud to be associated with each and every one of them.

In closing on behalf of my team of Selectmen - Leo Lessard, Charlie Karcher, and I, we would like to thank all of you for allowing us to serve you. As always we truly appreciate all of your continued support and assistance.

Town Administrator's Report

2008 was a year of many challenges, most caused but unpredictable “natural” events. The budget passed in March of 2008 was very lean to say the least and the highway department suffered some very serious cuts during that process. The weather threw everything at the town beginning with a winter than used up a great many of the available resources for snow removal and salt. A spring of heavy rains and washouts added insult to injury to the town's budget, leaving the highway budget in serious danger of over expending. Further, dramatically increased fuel costs that far exceeded expectations, caused overruns in every budget with fuel, heating oil and gasoline lines, which left the town with no option other than to cut other areas to maintain the bottom line of the overall budget. Finally the “Ice Storm at year end stretched resources to the point of breaking.

Former Town Administrator, Ed Ryan, left the town of Milton suddenly in May leaving the town without an administrator in very trying times. Board chair, Tom Gray stepped in temporarily, to fill the gap, until Municipal Resources Incorporated (MRI) was contracted in late June to begin providing management services for the Town, beginning July 1, 2008. I was assigned to Milton, beginning on that date. In a rather bizarre twist of fate, so to speak, I retired from Raymond, as Town Manager, in June of 2007 after 30 years of service there and Chris Rose, the former Milton Administrator was hired to replace me in September of '08 and left Milton.

Once onboard, I was made aware of several serious problems. First, the budget was in very bad shape because of cuts in the previous budget process and because of unpredicted weather events, which resulted in a great deal of extra costs for everything we did. Second, the new fire truck, leased by the town in 2005, was unfunded and we were in danger of losing it and our rather significant investment in it, for lack of money in the budget, to make the lease payment. This would have meant that the town would have lost a critical, first attack, fire apparatus, leaving fire fighters without the apparatus to fight serious fires and residents under-protected in case of fire. No matter how dedicated firefighters might be they need the right equipment to save lives and property.

Police cruisers had not been replaced in several years and were well over acceptable mileage leaving them constantly broken down and in need of repair. This left residents with less than adequate police coverage during these times. Finally, the ‘roll off truck’ the town had successfully used, to keep solid waste costs down, was continually breaking down and in need of repair. Failure to keep that vehicle on the road would have cost residents of Milton approximately \$60,000.00 a year in trash and recycling hauling fees and forced the town to rely on a “contract” trash hauler. This would have made the town subject to uncontrolled costs and annual expenditures that would make change and improvement very difficult and cost taxpayers money.

The good news was that while the budget was in very bad shape, department heads were doing an excellent job of getting it back in line, by monitoring and controlling expenditures. This was accomplished by delaying, reducing or eliminating planned projects or annual maintenance work

and vacant positions were left unfilled. The good news was that the town had put aside, all of the necessary funds for several large capital expenditures in reserve funds that were believed to be unavailable for one reason or another and were not being requested.

The Town was able to develop an approach to deal with each of the issues on their own merits and with the help of town counsel, Jim Sessler, addressed them systematically. The provisions of 32:10 (“no, means no”), relates to the “transfer” of appropriations from one budget line to another budget line, within a specific budget year, in which a specific item or warrant request was denied by the voters. It is silent as to whether it applied to previously established capital reserve funds, that were held by the trustees for that specific purpose. While Town Counsel’s opinion stated that it did not, the Local Government Center and DRA did not have a specific opinion, other than they believed that the silence amounted to a “gray” area that could result in a local challenge, that the Court would have to weigh in on and settle.

First, the fire truck lease which was thought to be subject to the provisions of 32:10. (the no means no legislation) was shown to be invalid, as the vote that would have possibly triggered 32:10 was in effect the year the vote was taken (2003) and not in any way in 2008. Further, there were adequate funds available in the Capital Reserve Fund for items described in the CIP plan adopted in 2004. A formal request was made of the trustees and granted. The lease was voided and the truck purchased outright.

Next, the replacement of the roll-off truck, was approached and shown that again, the provisions of the “no means no” legislation did not apply as thought as the voters voted down the “highway truck” (plow truck) which was separate and distinct from the roll- off truck needed at the transfer station. Further the vehicle was listed in the CIP Capital Reserve Fund, adopted in 2004. Again a formal request was made of the trustees, granted, and the truck purchased.

Finally, the most difficult and complicate issue was the purchase of the new cruiser using Capital Reserve Funds. There were those that believed that once the voters voted down the request to raise and appropriate new tax money in 2008 to purchase the new cruiser, the provisions of 32:10 (“no, means no”) which relates to the “transfer” of appropriations within a budget applied. It was the town’s belief that the law clearly is meant to restrict the town from “transferring” surplus funds from one budget (i.e. highway) to the police budget for a purpose that was voted down in that year. The Town chose not to move forward with the request in 2008. While there was disagreement as to the applicability of 32:10 to the cruiser request in 2008, everyone agreed that the law did not apply in 2009 and the request could be made once the new budget year began. While there were some that believed that the town was taking advantage of a “loophole” in the law, it was my belief that the “loophole” as it is called, is what kept us from replacing the cruiser in 2008. That “loophole” or gray, in the law, clearly had no standing in 2009. The request was made and granted in early January of 2009.

While department heads did an excellent job getting the budget in line by the end of the year, bad weather and the ice storm put us back over budget and an “emergency expenditure” request was made of DRA and granted for us to expend up to an additional \$60,000.00 out of fund balance.

The town is facing some very difficult issues in 2009, not the least of which is the economy and the uncertainty of fuel prices, however, we have some options that will help the town in the future, including additional changes and improvements to the transfer station that will reduce the burden of that facility on the taxpayer, but making it more efficient and cost effective. Further, update and revision of the CIP will help level out the tax rate and maintain capital projects for the coming years.

It has been a pleasure serving the people of Milton over the past year and I wish to thank the people of Milton, the Board of Selectmen and Staff and Department Heads for their help and support these past 6 months. While my current contract with the Town runs out on June 30, 2009, I look forward to a productive time for as long as the town feels the need to continue my services or until a suitable full time replacement is found.

2008 Advisory Committee for the Restoration of Milton's Town House



The Milton Town House was constructed immediately following the Town's incorporation in 1802 as a separate community from the town of Rochester, New Hampshire. The Federal styled, single story, heavy framed building has been significantly modified since its original construction.

The Milton Town House has long served the Town of Milton and its people. Constructed as a meetinghouse, the building served as the focal point for both organized religion and government of the young town of Milton. By 1855, with the various congregations having moved into new church buildings of their own, the meetinghouse was sold to the town and largely renovated to reflect the building that is seen today. Until 1973, all of the town's major decisions were made at annual meetings held in the building. These meetings were moved to larger facilities elsewhere in the town but voting was still conducted in the building for several more years.

Listed on the National Registry, the Selectmen have agreed to give administrative assistance to Doreen Valente to start an Advisory Committee to assess the building's needs and find resources to support the building and its revitalization program by fund raising and applying for grant assistance.

The members of the Advisory Committee, Doreen Valente, Chair, Leo Lessard, Tom Gray, John Katwick, Polly Katwick, Rusty Martin, Bonnie Dunton, Bob Naegar and other supporters such as are Gloria Martin, Ann Walsh, Emery Booska, Larry and Suzanne Brown, Anne & Jim Clark, Lorretta and Al Banks and the Women's Group have worked diligently making baked goods and cooking great spaghetti dinners and assisting with fund raising. The flea market we put together last June 2008 was a huge success! The Committee has acquired donations from several residents and businesses and the Trustees of the Trust Fund. John Waitner from Colonial Period Renovators has donated his expertise in guiding us through the many steps of refurbishing the new shutters. The building has been cleaned out, inspected and the bats have relocated.

Moving forward, our next phase is to refurbish the glass panes which will be a major project. One of our goals is to invite the public for their further support to ensure this building has a wonderful future for our children

On behalf of the Advisory Committee for the Restoration of Milton's Town House we wish to thank our Members, Supporters and Sponsors for their generous contributions and hard work and assistance. To date, the Committee has raised a total of \$5,068.22.00.

It was a tough year again. We had record snow fall which resulted in over 1592 hrs of overtime, and more salt and sand than we had budgeted for. Fuel costs have more than doubled. Forty-five percent of the budget was spent by the end of March. As a result many of our maintenance and planned projects were not done.

We paved Mason Road and Thurston Road, shimmed School Street and Steeple Street, and overlaid Branch Hill Road. This was possible with the road construction warrant that was passed. We had several weeks of wash outs which caused some reconstruction on our drainage ditches and culverts.

We ended the year with the ice storm, causing many hours of clean up this spring, and several loads of debris. We are currently working with FEMA to get some of the money spent reimbursed.

I appreciate your cooperation and patience.

Thanks again, to all of the residents for your support and I look forward to serving you in 2009.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT – SOLID WASTE

I would like to thank Russell Ellis, Robert Ferris, Richard Johnson and Al Metrano for their years of service to the town. I welcome Gary Newell and Skip Gilman as our transfer station attendants.

During the year we saw the market jump up and down. At times we did well with our revenues, but unfortunately the last quarter of the year we saw drastic drops. We were getting \$85.00 per ton for paper and now we pay \$55.00 per ton to dump it. Aluminum cans dropped from \$.73 per pound to \$.34 per pound. Comingles were free and now we pay \$35.00 per ton. These are examples of how much solid waste has changed over the year and I expect more increases through 2009.

The Town is a member of the Northeast Resource Recovery Assn. (NRRA). This membership allows towns to ensure the best prices for our recyclables. This has helped keep the cost of running our transfer station as low as possible.

During the year I estimated the cost of having a contractor haul out waste versus the cost of hauling our own waste. If the town hired a contractor it would cost \$65,000.00 for the first year, with an annual increase through the life of the contract. The length of the contract would be a minimum of five years and a maximum of seven years. I estimate on the conservative side a cost of \$500,000.00 over a five year period, assuming an average of \$100,000.00 per year.

I got three quotes from truck dealers for a new roll off truck. I researched the length of service a new truck would give the town, (currently we have a 1987 Mack, 22 years old) and estimate 20 years or more. The town purchased a truck for \$143,463.00 with money raised in 2005 for the CIP. This truck purchase will give the town approximately a \$2.2 million dollar savings in transportation fees over a 20 year period.

My goal has always been to keep solid waste as low as possible. I feel the residents of Milton do a great job with recycling. I thank you all for your efforts and patience.

I wish to thank you for your continued support and welcome any suggestions or ideas you may have to help serve you better in the future.

Once again we close out another busy year in our town. As you will see our calls for service are up again however our arrests have dropped. Unfortunately I don't believe this is because we had less crime I believe its because we had more and less time to solve crime and make arrests.

The small town of Milton is not what most of us remember. We have seen a huge increase in our violent crimes. We have had a large increase in crimes involving deadly weapons. I will be trying a new abbreviated format this year for our statistics report. I would appreciated feedback on it and can return to the prior format if people prefer.

Our staff at the department has changed but we have kept a majority of our officers. This year Corporal White left us as a full time officer but remains with us as a part time officer. We hired Officer Andy Crone to fill the vacancy. This is a first time since I've been here that we were able to hire a certified officer instead of training them at a cost of \$29,000.

Our biggest issue this year has been our police cruisers. We currently have three cars that desperately need to be replaced. We haven't had a new vehicle since 2005. Currently our two cars have 184,000 and 146,000 miles on them. This is way beyond the life of a police cruiser.

Fortunately we have a way to replace two of them this year at **no tax impact!** The first is by using the funds in the CIP plan from 2005 to buy one of the cars. The second, which you will be voting on in article 8, will come out of our detail reserve live. This line was established in 2005 and is money paid by outside agencies to the town. We will also be rewording this account to make it simpler to use as well as instantly reimburse the town instead of voting each year to reimburse the town. This is done by reimbursing the town 71,000 to offset taxes in Article 9, then forming a new revolving account which is Article 10.

As always I need to thank our valued employees and all of our residents for your continued support.

The Ice Storm posed an extra challenge to our reporting system. With our limited facility and personnel, the fire department and Carroll County Dispatch did an exceptional job of trying to keep track of every address and every call which came in. However, the reports of wires down, trees down and lack of power made documenting these incidents difficult. These numbers are below what were actually reported and responded to in the heat of the moment.

As you can see, we have had a busy year. The Milton Fire and Ambulance is averaging just under 3 calls for service a day. Again this year we experienced another Natural “Event” in the Ice Storm. We are extremely lucky for the volunteers who took days away from their families to serve you, the townspeople of Milton. We covered a range of different types of calls during the storm and days after. These include but are not limited to, trees on wires, trees thru roofs, flooded basements, blocked roads, welfare checks, carbon monoxide issue and the list goes on and on. During the storm we had a structure fire that just added to the mix. We survived due to the dedication of the Firefighters who serve you. This is the third major event that we have had in the past three years. We can train and train but we never know what we are going to be up against next. The snow of last winter and this winter has and will be an additional strain on our services from accidents to service calls.

Again, before you is the bond for the new station. We all understand the economy and how tight money is, but our need has not gone away. It is extremely difficult operating out of a construction trailer. The Ice Storm really made our operations difficult as we also had no power and no backup. We hope to get your support in obtaining this much needed station.

Please take the time to thank the firefighters and EMT'S who serve you. It does mean a lot to them. I personally appreciate all that they do for the community. The getting up at 2:00 AM for a service call or a 6:00 PM missing supper for a cat in the tree.

We have explored all avenues to make sure that the town is covered by ambulance personnel. Our best solution short of paying for fulltime coverage is to pay a "per diem" stipend to be on call. What this does is pay two personnel to be available during the uncovered shifts of the fulltime on the weekends. Is this the perfect solution? Absolutely not. It is becoming extremely difficult in getting EMT'S. It is a big time commitment for the certification and the continuing education process. Please be supportive of this attempt to provide the best emergency service to the community and its visitors.

As always, a big Thank You to the personal who provide this service to us. It is a very difficult job. We see you when you are at your worst and we have to be at our best. I am very proud of the EMT'S who serve you. It takes a special person to drop everything that they are doing to assist you in your time of need.

ASSESSING DEPARTMENT 2008

The Town of Milton continues to utilize the services of Corcoran Consulting Associates to act as the Town's contract Assessor. The staff of Corcoran Consulting reviews all new homes, sales of property, changes in buildings, and divisions of land throughout the year and assist the Board of Selectmen in carrying out their statutory assessing duties.

The assessing office had a full-time assessing clerk until the end of October, who assisted the community with general assessing questions, updates tax maps and property tax cards, tracks and gathers the sales of property from the Registry of Deeds, researches deeds and determines changes of ownership, assists taxpayers to file exemption forms for senior citizens, veterans, and the blind, processes and maintains records and reports as required by the New Hampshire Department of Revenue Administration.

2008 Recreation Report

The Recreation Department has been expanding in popularity. More and more people are utilizing the department.

The Recreation department is a vital piece of the Town. It serves the youth, seniors, and families with programming and events that brings the community together. In this tough economy many people are dependent on the recreation department for their families' entertainment and for some it serves as a childcare during the summer.

The Recreation Department offers many programs and events, but the biggest and most successful program is Camp Three Ponds Summer Youth Camp for ages 6-11 and is held at Milton Town Beach. The camp averages about 70 participants and is 8 weeks long. We revamped the program to be more exciting and entertaining for the children with Red Carpet Day, Fear Factor Day, Weekly field trips, and plenty of relay races. The camp expanded by adding CIT's (Counselors in Training) to the program ages 15 & 16. This year we started a Teen Adventure Camp (ages 12-16) it had 20 participants and was amazing with White Water Rafting Trips, overnight camping, rock climbing, and plenty of fun! We received a grant to help offer scholarships to families and help provide a quality program to our youth.

Special Events in 2008 included:

Spring:

- An Easter Egg Hunt was held at Emma Ramsey Community Center parking lot followed by crafts and activities offered in the inside of the building along with a visit from the Easter Bunny! The children were divided by three different age groups. It was fun and we had around 80 children participate.
- A Health and Wellness Fair was offered at the Emma Ramsey Center, where vendors came in to share information and offer free gifts and testing for participants.

Summer:

- Arts' n the Park program offered musicians, storytellers, and magicians on Wednesday mornings that were greatly enjoyed by beach visitors and summer camp participants.
- Summer Kick-Off and Town Wide Yard Sale was the best yet. We had a petting zoo, a rock climbing wall, many vendors and community members set up tables at the beach to sell products and yard sale items. Maps were given out for people around the town who were having yard sales. The day ended with a Barbeque dinner at the Town Beach!

Fall:

- Our Soccer program was filled with 80 participants and included ages 3-12. The season was great and ended with a banquet attended by parents and athletes.
- A co-sponsored Halloween Café was held at the Nute Library. There were coffee, hot cocoa, soup, sandwiches, punch, kitty litter cake, and snacks offered.

Around 65 children registered for the Costume Contest where trophies were awarded to the best costume and most original in three different age categories.

Winter:

- 16th Annual Winter Carnival with snowmobile racing, fishing derby, ice skating, food and lots of community spirit.
- Our Basketball Program had 80 participants and opened to ages 3-4 and grades K-6th. We had our 3rd & 4th grade and 5th and 6th grade teams travel to other recreation departments to play games.

Daily Events in 2008 included:

- Senior Bingo every Tuesday (60-73 participants), Sunday Senior Bingo (20-30 participants). Senior Meal once a month through Nute Parent Teacher Student Group, Meals through Strafford Nutrition Program at least once a month (30-40 participants), Holiday party for seniors with Nute Elementary School Students visiting, singing and giving gifts.
- Tai Chi Classes every Wednesday
- Pilates/Yoga and Low impact aerobics every Thursday and Friday
- Movie Night once a month

All new and ongoing programs are advertised in the Town Newsletter, The Gazette, and also on the Town of Milton website under Recreation. Check out these valuable resources so you know what is going on in your Town.

The year 2009 will bring many changes to the Recreation Department. We lost a valuable member of the Community and Recreation Department. Jim Culverhouse passed away in 2008. He was one of the founders of the Recreation Department serving on the Commission since it was established. He helped the recreation department obtain a full time Recreation Director. He will be greatly missed.

At the end of October I took a full time position with another recreation department and continue to work part time for the Town of Milton. We will have the changing of the guard in 2009 when a new recreation director is hired. I will miss working for the Town of Milton, but will continue to be an involved citizen as I am a resident of the Town of Milton.

It has been a pleasure serving the Town of Milton.

The Milton Free Public Library (MFPL) is not always your typical quiet library. Some days the “Little Red Schoolhouse” is quite loud. The children of Milton have discovered that libraries are more than dusty buildings full of books and shushing old ladies. Libraries can be fun –and so are books.

The number of patrons using the library has doubled over the course of this year over last. (1403 people came in the building in 2007 to use the library, 2812 people in 2008). The library issued 73 new cards in 2008. 1840 books were checked out, 817 videos and DVD’s and 49 magazines went out as well.

The computer usage has also increased. Often all four of the public computers are being used. Sometimes there is a wait for use of a computer and the one-hour usage limit must be enforced. The wireless access is also being used. People bring in their laptops for research (or checking email!). During the summer, many brought their laptops and sat outside to use the wireless even if the library was closed.

MFPL receives traffic for more than research and books. There are groups that meet weekly that keeps the library crowded: The Thursday evening craft group has been well attended. The crafters (mostly knitters) exchange patterns, ideas, and problem solving. The younger knitters (teens!) have made bookmarks for the library that were donated as a fundraiser for the library. Want to join the fun? The craft group meets Thursday evenings from 6PM –7:30. All crafters are welcome and encouraged. Beginners of all kinds of crafts can receive help from our in-house expert Sarah Clarke.

During the school year, Friday afternoons at 2:30 MFPL hosts a “recess time” for home school students. Home schooling students from kindergarten through high school age meet on the playground (or upstairs in inclement weather) to play games and relax. Many of the parents of these children use this time to socialize, share resources, or relax while their children have a safe place to socialize.

Yoga classes are available on Saturday mornings at 8:30. The library may not be “noisy” during this time, but locals leave feeling strong, stretched and centered. MFPL also hosts a men’s Alcoholics Anonymous group that meets on Sunday mornings.

Four times a year the library hosts a pizza decorating party for children to help usher in the seasons. Children are able to write and draw on the many blackboards and windows, make crafts, and draw pictures and fill up on pizza to celebrate each new season.

In February, the Friends of MFPL hosted the first annual “Fun Fan Fiction” contest. Students from Nute Middle and High Schools wrote (rather re-wrote) a portion of their favorite story. The Middle School winner was Emma Baker who wrote an extra paragraph to her favorite book “Twilight” by Stephenie Meyer illustrating the main character’s klutziness. Matt Greeney won the High School award rewriting the ending for John Steinbeck’s “Of Mice and Men”. In this alternate ending, no one died and Lenny and George’s dreams come true. Each student won a \$125 award.

This past spring, MFPL received a grant from The Libri Foundation. This grant provided 65 new children’s books to the library. These books have been well received. Many of our local children have been enjoying these books.

The summer reading program “G’day for Reading” focused on Australia. 15 local children became “e-pals” with children in Australia. Several of those friendships continued into the winter months. The children learned about the “Land Down Under” through crafts, games, and food. A paper Mache kangaroo was made for the July 4th parade in downtown Milton Mills, We all loved the gooey (Rooney?) mess!

The building is being well taken care of. Most recently, we had “zombie proof” doors installed. (Some of the staff and patrons love campy horror flicks) These doors add to the beauty of the building, and help with energy efficiency.

The library assistants keep the library running efficiently. Sarah Pollock Clarke keeps track of the books-what we have, what we need -and is our “Information Desk”, an invaluable guide to the library and to crafts, “cheesy” horror flicks, and animal husbandry. Doreen Johnson comes up with innovative ideas for Children’s crafts and games.

The Trustees this past year is: Jennifer Palmatier, the chair of the Trustees, Justin Mayrand, the treasurer, and Bob McKinley, freshman trustee. The Trustees are ultimately responsible for MFPL: making sure that the Director, Betsy Baker, has all the resources to run a small town library, the budget stays on track, and that the building is maintained.

Susann Foster-Brown is the fearless leader of the Friends of the Milton Free Public Library. Other members are Bette White (treasurer), Jen Palmatier, Kathy Chatt (who maintains the library’s website), and Les Elder. In addition to judging the “Fun Fan Fiction Contest” the Friends raise funds to better the library: selling refreshments at polling places during elections, selling wreathes during the winter holidays, and selling calendars. The 2009 calendars feature Milton’s heroes: Police, Fire and Rescue squads, and the Highway Department and the Three Ponds’ own “Miltie”. Want to help? Contact Betsy at the library for more info.

2009 continues to show increased activity. The library remains active. Here is the 2009 “wish list”: The electronic cataloging system should be updated. The windows will be replaced for energy efficiency and safety and the steeple anchored onto the building again.

Milton Conservation Commission 2008 Annual Report

New Hampshire State statute RSA 36A clearly mandates the purposes and powers of our State's Conservation Commissions. The following are the mandates the law gives to the Commission: "Protect and encourage the proper use of local resources: protect watershed areas; conduct research on the use of local land and water areas; seek to coordinate local conservation groups; establish an index of open space and wetlands areas with information as to their proper and best use (Natural Resource Inventory)."

Conservation Planning: Milton's Master Plan states several policy goals directly related to conservation planning. Policy Goal #3 states: "*Protect Milton's significant open space areas and natural resources by promoting sustainable development, supporting and utilizing tools for land protection, and raising public awareness of conservation practices.*"

The following are some of the pro-active planning initiatives the Conservation Commission has undertaken to fulfill the conservation policy goals as stated in Milton's Master Plan:

- **NHEP Community Technical Assistance Program (CTAP):** The MCC was awarded \$8,500 from the NH Estuaries Project, in cooperation with the NROC Better Planning & Ordinances subcommittee and Strafford Regional Planning Commission. The purpose of the grant is to assist the Town of Milton in assessing, improving, and adopting land use regulations that better protect Milton's water resources. The MCC has held several working sessions with professional planner, Jack Mettee and the Better Planning Group which reviewed Milton's Master Plan, current regulations and ordinances. Mr. Mettee also helped coordinate a public forum on how to protect Milton's water resources.
- **Milton's Open Space Plan:** Milton's Conservation Commission held two workshops to develop criteria for an Open Space Plan for Milton. The meetings were facilitated by Moose Mountains Regional Greenways Director of Land Conservation, through a grant from the NH Estuaries Project. Strafford Regional Planning Commission has been instrumental in developing maps for open space planning.

The MCC developed a list of lands of high conservation value, and MMRG sent the landowners invitations to a well attended MMRG workshop on conservation techniques and the estate planning tax benefits of donating conservation easements.

- **Monitoring of Milton's conservation lands:** In preparation for properly monitoring all Milton conservation easements and lands, the MCC developed a template for baseline documentation to be applied to 65.2 acres of Milton's conservation easements, 65.6 acres of Milton conservation lands, and 48 acres of properties that are owned by Milton and approved by town vote to be placed under conservation easements held by Strafford County Conservation District.

The MCC prepared baseline binders for all Milton's conservation lands with deeds and surveys. The MCC contracted with forestry graduate student, Mike Simmons to perform baseline documentation including GPS of boundaries and important landmarks, and marking the physical boundaries lines with Milton conservation signs. Mike Simmons completed the baseline documentation of the Ball property overlaying Milton's public drinking water supply wellhead.

- **MS4 Report mandated by the EPA**– the MCC made recommendations to the Selectmen and Planning Board to perform the work which is required by law. This is an unfunded federal mandate, and therefore the MCC recommended developing a plan to perform the work through grants and volunteers.

2008 Conservation Projects:

Milton's Conservation Fund: The Conservation Fund has enabled the Conservation Commission to assist landowners of strategic natural resource areas in Milton in pursuing land protection projects. These conservation projects fulfill Milton's Master Plan objectives to protect Milton's strategic water resources, forestlands, wildlife habitat, and farmland with the multiple benefits of ensuring clean air and water, recreational opportunities, and preserving Milton's scenic beauty and the unique rural character of its communities. The Conservation Fund receives 50% of the land use change tax.

The balance in Milton Conservation Fund at the end of 2008 is \$51,273.13.

Salmon Falls Headwater Project: In June of 2008, the Society for the Protection of NH Forests purchased 340 acres of property along the Salmon Falls River from the Howard Jappe family after three years of complex negotiations and grant writing. The NH Fish & Game controls the conservation easement on the property, guaranteeing public access for multiple recreational uses. Because this property forms the headwaters of the Salmon Falls River and is delineated as core focus area by the NH Coastal Plan, SPNHF was awarded an LCHIP grant, and successfully met the challenges for meeting the match requirements of the grant. In a special public hearing, the Milton Conservation Commission listened to a presentation by SPNHF on the important conservation value of this property to safeguard the water quality of the Milton Three Ponds and Milton drinking water supply. For these reasons, and because Milton's Master Plan has prioritized the Salmon Falls watershed for protection, the Milton Conservation Commission unanimously voted to support the allocation of \$25,000 from Milton's Conservation Fund toward this project. The Milton Conservation Commission asked to be on the Selectmen's agenda regarding this allocation, and received unanimous support from the Milton Selectmen. In order to meet the in kind match that the LCHIP grant mandates, the Karcher family generously donated an easement on 80 acres of their property, and the Orlando family also generously donated 7.5 acres of river frontage contiguous with the Jappe property.

This issue was introduced to the Selectman from Lebanon, ME at the Milton Selectmen's meeting on Jul 21. The Lebanon Selectmen agreed to work with us in resolving this issue. We are planning to meet with them soon.

This past year 22 of our 94 cemeteries have been maintained by residents of the property where these cemeteries are located or volunteers who have joined our adopt-a-cemetery program. We owe all of these people a huge debt of gratitude. Thank you to all those who are helping us preserve the integrity and sanctity of these sacred grounds. We played a vital role in the *first in the nation* Presidential Primary Elections, along with our other New Hampshire cities and towns on January 8th, as we registered a record number of 215 new voters.

We held ten sessions to register new voters, as required between January and October. The early winter months kept us busy with the Town Deliberative, School Deliberative, Town/School Elections (27 new voters) and Water District Annual Meeting. The latter part of the year brought the State Primary Elections (10 new voters) on September 9th. Throughout the year, there was much work to accomplish that was required of us.

The culmination of 2008 was the Presidential/State General Election Day on November 4th. We anticipated a very busy day, but surpassed all expectations when we processed 332 same-day voter registration forms. In addition, we handled many name, address and party changes. We had made some procedural alterations and were pleased that the Supervisors of the Checklist, working with volunteers, Selectmen, Moderator, Town Clerks and Ballot Clerks, were able to expedite voters through the registration process and promote a positive voting experience. It was especially exciting to see our younger voters exercise their right to vote as free citizens in a democracy!

We welcomed James Smith as our newly-elected Supervisor in March. Bob Ferris has graciously assisted us as needed throughout the year and we were also pleased to have Kathy Boyers assisting us at Elections. We extend our gratitude to Sara Watson for her invaluable assistance on November 4th. "Veterans" Karen Brown and Rosemary Jeffries are pleased to continue working with such a great team!

With a decrease in elections in 2009, we shall be channeling our energies into continuing the project of entering the required data into the statewide voter database to bring our records in compliance with the requirements of the Help America Vote Act.

As always, we shall endeavor to follow the changes in Elections laws, uphold these laws for the fairness of all and to serve the citizens of Milton to the best of our ability!

PLANNING BOARD 2008 TOWN REPORT

2008 was a hard year for the Strafford County Real Estate economy. Property values dropped 26.4% this year alone and are down 46.9% since 2006. Here in Milton foreclosures rose from 7% in 2006 to 27% in 2008 whereas the number of mortgages written dropped from 452 in 2006 to only 246 in 2008.

The Ad Hoc committees established by the Selectmen continue to provide citizen impact on zoning issues affecting our lands and waters, and an environmentally sound economic development. Kathy Wallingford, our land use clerk, has taken on an additional task to help prepare both our tax records and our property owners for the upcoming State mandated reassessment/revaluation. Her "in house" competence will reduce our long term costs.

Please support the Zoning Warrants recommended by the Planning Board. Jerry Coogan, AICP our part-time planner has culled, rewritten, clarified, renumbered and drafted several of our ordinances and regulations to make them easier to find, easier to understand and easier to implement.

Lastly, as Members and Alternate Members of this Board, we thank you for the opportunity to serve our Town. We meet the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of the month, at 6:30PM at the Town Hall. Our meetings are open to the public and local democracy depends on local volunteers.

STRAFFORD REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION 2008 REPORT

Strafford Regional Planning Commission (SRPC), a political subdivision of the State of New Hampshire, serves in an advisory role to Milton and seventeen other communities in Strafford, Rockingham and Carroll Counties. We provide planning services to boards, officials, and citizens and facilitate regional collaborative efforts to fund regional and local projects. SRPC's staff offers a range of planning services in transportation, land use, hazard mitigation, economic development, natural resources, and geographic information systems (GIS) mapping and analysis. These services are designed to meet the needs of the volunteers who are the foundation of SRPC communities. Our member communities have access to SRPC educational resources including our website, workshops and forums, and personalized training.

SRPC conducted the following projects and initiatives for Milton in 2008:

- Compiled 2005 NH DOT Crash data and prepared a 3x3 ft map for the Town
- Compiled simplified Natural Resources data such as wetland acres, important farmland soils and Wildlife Action Plan habitats
- Inventoried road name, length and class changes and 1.8 miles of new public road
- Provided the Conservation Commission with Habitat Co-occurrence, Significant Soils and Steep Slopes map
- Completed annual NH DOT traffic counts
- Compiled 2007 Population Estimate Data from NH OEP
- Gave presentation on Operation Lifesaver
- Coordinated Bike Walk To Work Day
- Provided 26 *New Hampshire Planning and Land Use Regulation* books with a value of \$1352 to land use boards.

In 2009 the NH Charitable Foundation, coordinated through the Piscataqua Regional Estuaries Project, has funded SRPC to prepare an environmental assessment of each Town's land use policies, regulations, and ordinances. SRPC is the Census 2010 Primary Participant for Strafford County. As the federally mandated Metropolitan Planning Organization, SRPC will collect traffic counts, road inventory changes, update the traffic model, provide air conformity analyses, and assist with the development of grant applications for Town projects. We will continue to collaborate with NH DOT, federal agencies and your officials and staff in regard to federally funded transportation programs, NH Ten Year Plan transportation projects and economic stimulus projects for Milton.

We look forward to working with the citizens and officials of Milton in 2009. Thank you for the opportunity to serve you and for your continuing support of regional planning. **ROCHESTER DISTRICT VNA
ANNUAL REPORT for 2008**

Rochester District VNA (Your VNA) continues to serve as your home health agency providing skilled nursing, rehabilitative therapies, medical social work, licensed nursing assistance and supportive services on an intermittent basis throughout your community. We are proud to provide you with highly skilled and well trained clinicians.

Home health care continues to incur reductions in Medicare reimbursement with additional reductions threatened for the next three years. Skilled service provided under Medicaid is reimbursed by the state at less than half the cost to provide it. The numbers of uninsured individuals increase each year. Your funding of these services is crucial to people in need of skilled nursing and therapy care. Adequate funding for home care is critical to keeping patients in their home, the most cost-effective place to receive care.

The acuity of our patients is constantly increasing. Many patients need IV therapy, chemo therapy, enteral feedings, therapy after knee/hip replacements and complicated wound dressings. Patients are discharged very quickly from hospitals and require the skilled services provided by our trained nurses and therapists. Many hospital admissions are avoided by a referral directly to home care from the physician.

We continue to provide support services including: homemakers, personal care attendants and in-home companions paid by Title XX and Strafford County funding as well as by the patient. These services allow individuals requiring minimal support to remain safely in their homes at the lowest possible cost. We opened our Adult Day Center one year ago, which benefits many families by providing a safe, family atmosphere for loved ones no longer able to be at home alone.

We continue to improve our utilization of electronic charts resulting in the following: improved clinical efficiency and accuracy of documentation, flow of data to appropriate disciplines at the time most needed, ease of viewing historical data, improved coordination of care, decreased man hours with less manual paper processes and a reduction in errors. We have reduced office staff by relying more on technology. This saves dollars and improves access and accuracy. Telehealth use continues to increase. The results of daily monitoring of our most seriously ill patients have prevented additional visits to the emergency room through early interventions.

Our biggest and most critical challenge is being dependent on the government for 85% of our revenue. We set charges for services, but are dependent on what the government pays regardless of the cost to provide the care. Therefore, your continued support of Rochester District Visiting Nurse Association (Your VNA) is vitally important to our abilities to meet the many health needs in your community. It is also important when you need home care to ask for us by name. You have a choice. Ask for Rochester District VNA by name.

CHANCES is dedicated to providing opportunities for youngsters who have broken the law to be responsible for their actions without becoming further involved in the judicial system and to further court sanctions of those who have become involved with the judicial system. The goal of the program is to significantly increase the juvenile offender's awareness of his/her inappropriate actions and reduce further incidents of delinquency.

We operate from a restorative justice philosophy, based in reparation of harm to victims and community, teaching competency skills through psycho educational programming and community service and reducing, possibly obliterating, recidivism.

- Trained family mediators provide mediation services for families which allow kids to stay in the home. Mediation opens lines of communication and creates positive changes for all members of a household.

We have collaborated and shared resources with other organizations in the community including Nute Library, Milton Fire Department, NH Farm Museum, Milton Learning Center, Milton Elementary and Nute schools, Milton Recreation Department and the Milton Police Department, to educate our youth, increase cooperation and provide support and services to assure the success of youth and families and to increase community safety.

In 2008, we provided services to 69 newly referred Milton youth and their families. These referrals came from parents, schools, physicians, police department, DCYF, the Rochester District Court, and other agencies. These youth and their families have enrolled in at least one of the programs named above. In 2008 these 69 new referrals from Milton, successfully completed 89 programs.

CHANCES is pleased to report to the Town of Milton that we continue to have a 93% success rate or a 7% recidivism rate. This translates that of the 69 youth in the Town of Milton referred to us, 64 youth will not re-offend or commit a crime in your community.

Attached please find a copy of our 2008 and 2009 budgets, the number of children we served from each Strafford County town or city, an itemized list of expenditures to Milton and the amounts requested and received from other towns/cities.

COST OF COMMUNITY SERVICES 2008 REPORT

The Cost of Community Services Study Committee (CCSSC) was formed in May 2006. The Selectmen created the committee to work in response to a recommendation of the Cost of Community Services Study completed in September 2005. The original charge to the committee follows:

“The Milton Cost of Community Services Study Committee will produce recommendations for promoting balanced growth among residential, commercial /industrial, and open space/conservation land uses in order to more closely balance the Town’s revenues and expenses so the Town’s property tax burden becomes more stabilized. These recommendations will include policies, programs, and processes and mechanisms based upon analyzed data.”

In 2008, we contributed to the success of the Milton NROC (Natural Resources Outreach Coalition) program. We have additional recommendations that will require more work from this committee going forward into 2009:

- **Workforce housing issues**
- **Sustainable, context-sensitive economic development strategies**
- **Education, outreach and process strategies for the Transfer of Development Rights - Ordinance**

In 2008, several of our members committed themselves to the on-going NROC effort to plan for residential and economic growth while maintaining the rural character of the town on each of three sub-committees. The Natural Resource Outreach Coalition (NROC), a partnership involving several state, regional and nonprofit organizations will oversee the program and prepare a final recommendation report. Please refer to the NRPC committee reports also included in the Town Report.

During most of 2008, we temporarily suspended our regular meetings in order the NROC folks and sub-committees to do their work, however, the CCSSC will resume their regular bi-monthly 7 PM Wednesday meetings, open to all, at the Ramsey Center beginning in March.

Our committee’s goals continue to be to:

- Reduce municipal costs.
- Protect and enhance property owners’ equity.
- Stabilize the town’s revenues/expenses.
- Protect critical environments and establish a regulatory process for review and advice as covered under RSA 483:B (shorelands) and 474:55 (wetlands) where none had existed previously.

The committee membership is Bruce Woodruff, Tom Gray, Emery Booska, Cynthia Wyatt, Cherie Corbett, Charlie Karcher, Steve Frisselle, Brian DiMambro, Robbie Parsons, Roger Burkhart, Ellen Lankhorst, Larry Brown, and Susann Brown. Other members from the community have attended from time to time and offered valuable input. Our work is ongoing. We look forward to working with the other Boards and Commissions to promote progressive, positive, community-sensitive change for our town and its residents.

2008 Program Summary for the Town of Milton Submitted by the Northern Strafford County Health and Safety Council

The Town of Milton and the Northern Strafford County Health and Safety Council (NSCHSC) celebrated their fifth year of public health partnership in 2008.

Mr. Hank Soucy, Milton Health Officer, continued in his position as board representative. Mr. Soucy's continued dedication to improving the health and wellbeing of the residents of the Town of Milton has been a great asset to the board. We look forward to continuing this work with him in 2009.

We continued our partnerships with the six participating communities (Farmington, Middleton, Milton, New Durham, Rochester and Strafford), Frisbie Memorial Hospital and Avis Goodwin Community Health Center. All six municipalities and listed organizations signed a memorandum of understanding and have a commitment to meet our mission: *To improve and protect the public health and well being of residents in the region through the facilitation of diverse organizations, institutions, and community residents that collaborate in the enhancement of clinical and community based systems.*

In 2008 we were able to access additional funding and add staff to enhance the public health capacity of the region. The following is a summary of 2008 programs:

Emergency Preparedness and Planning

- Received an 80% score from NH Homeland Security and Emergency Management on our mass vaccination plan which will assist Northern Strafford County residents should a disaster occur that requires broad vaccination or prophylaxis distribution. This score is one of the highest in the state and reflects the regional commitment of emergency responders and community leaders to the regional planning and response.
- Responded to the December Ice Storm. The Rochester Shelter was opened for five days. The Acute Care Center was opened for the first time providing medical and functional needs sheltering to residents of Strafford County and beyond. NSCHSC, Rochester Fire Department, Frisbie Memorial Hospital, and Rochester District VNA played major roles with several other partners participating. The region's first pet shelter was also opened by the NH Disaster Animal Response Team. An after action meeting occurred and state representatives commended regional partners for their leadership in the state regarding medical sheltering.
- To strengthen our emergency response workforce and test our plans, we conducted multiple trainings and exercises with our planning partners.
 - i. Conducted two drills:
 - MACE drill with regional social service organizations to test the triage and communications of the region
 - Call-down drill of the MACE in December to test response time in preparation for the full scale POD exercise planned for May 2009
 - ii. Conducted one training:
 - Public Information Officer Training

iii. Conducted two workshops:

-MACE and Farmington POD Workshop in May

-Continuity of Operations Training in conjunction with Rochester Fire

Department, Rochester Police Department and Rochester Chamber of Commerce to help sustain business operations after an emergency

- Completed All Health Hazards Plan. Waiting for feedback from NH DHHS. Revisions to be made in early 2009.
- Conducted Regional Emergency Preparedness Education campaign in collaboration with Southern Strafford County, Portsmouth Region and Exeter Region Emergency Preparedness. Campaign website can be found at <http://www.getpreparednh.com/>
- Continued growth of regional Citizen Corps Unit. Developed website and recruitment materials for the Strafford County Citizen Corps. Website can be found at <http://www.straffordcountycitizencorps.org/> Residents are encouraged to contact NSCHSC at 335-0168 to become a trained volunteer.
- Awarded \$18,000 from US DHHS Office of the Civilian Volunteer & NACCHO Capacity Building Award to develop newly founded Medical Reserve Corps consisting of medically trained emergency response volunteers. Residents are encouraged to contact NSCHSC at 335-0168 to become a trained volunteer.
- Collaborated with regional fire departments for Safe Heat 2008 public education campaign.
- Increased working relationships among home health, Community Health Center, mental health, and education communities for emergency planning.
- Began work with Community Organizations Active in Disasters (COAD). This is network of local businesses, non-profits, municipalities, and religious organizations working to reduce duplication of services following disasters.

Public Health Programs

- Continued work with New Hampshire Charitable Fund Teen Health Grant. Worked with regional teen coalition to write a teen health guide and with Spaulding High School Art Department to create teen health posters. Guide and posters set for printing and distribution to schools, teen centers, and community organization in early 2009.
- CSO Grant of \$15,000 for continued work with Community Support Organization toward effective coalition building to address regional public health issues, provide strategic planning opportunities and increase the capacity effect access to healthcare, substance abuse, housing needs and transportation.
- Awarded \$225,000 over 5 years from 21st Century Grant to develop after school program. FAMEE: Farmington and Milton Extending Education Program Coordinator and Site Director positions have been filled and classes began in the Fall of 2008.
- Awarded Drug Free Coalition Grant in the amount of \$225,000. Bridging The Gaps Coalition Coordinator position has been filled. Coalition work is focused toward reducing teen drug and alcohol access and use issue for the Rochester Community.

Planning and priority setting for health improvement

- Municipal and Health Provider partners signed a Memorandum Of Understanding for coordinated planning which included shared goals of local government, health care and NSCHSC.
- Awarded \$75,000 from the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services for ongoing support of NSCHSC.

In 2008 we said goodbye to a few dedicated staff and board members. After helping to found and lead NSCHSC for five years, Executive Director Betsey Andrews Parker, left on December 31st for a new position at URS/EG&G defense contractors. Deb Lee left her position on the NSCHSC board and as Farmington Emergency Management Director. And finally, Jason Lamontagne left his position as New Durham Emergency Management Director. We would like to thank all of them for their many years of service and dedication to strengthening the public health and preparedness of the region. We wish them all the best in their future endeavors!

NSCHSC looks forward to our continued partnership with Milton and the region on public health initiatives during 2009. We welcome feedback and increased participation in programs for the town and region. For more information, please contact the organization at:

Milton Wastewater Department 2008 Annual Report

The wastewater facility treated approximately 24,365,000 gallons of sewage at an average daily flow of 66,755 gallons. We continue to operate around 60% of plant design capacity allowing future growth within the community.

The carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand (CBOD) removal efficiency averaged 96.8% and the total suspended solids (TSS) removal efficiency averaged 93.7% for the year. The minimum acceptable removal efficiency for each of these test parameters is 85%. The annual whole effluent toxicity (WET) test passed with no indication of the effluent having any toxic effect on the Salmon Falls River. These effluent parameters show that the plant continues to perform exceptionally well and discharges a good quality effluent.

We continue to add a chemical called “alum” to the raw sewage from April thru Sept. to reduce the amount of total phosphorus (TP) being discharged to the river. We have done this for 7 years with good results. Reducing TP is important because it is a vital nutrient for algae growth, which causes oxygen deficiencies in the river. The plant effluent averages 4.0-5.0 mg/l prior to alum and between 2.0-3.0 mg/l with the addition. The average is 2.6 mg/l. This represents a 50% reduction to the river and keeps the plant in compliance with our discharge permit.

All plant equipment is operational and in good working order. One new effluent pump was installed in April and the plant well pump was replaced in December. One air leak in the lagoon aeration system was repaired and 10 blow off air lines were replaced.

We applied for a new 5-year discharge permit in 2005 as required. A representative from the EPA came in July to check the plant in anticipation of issuing a permit. At this time it is unknown if there will be any new effluent limits.

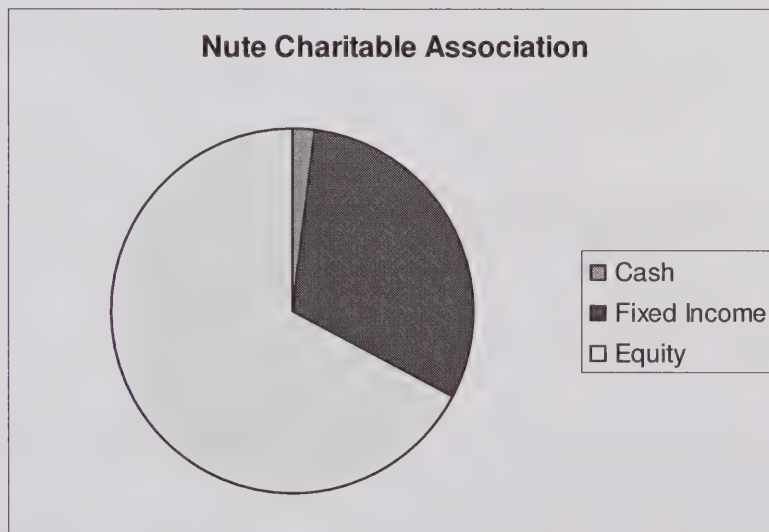
Nute Charitable Association 2008

In the past the Nute Charitable Association was regularly included within the Town's Annual Report. It is our hope to have a regular report included in the future.

This year this is a brief report to provide an update on the finances of the organization.

As of December 31, 2008 the fund has a portfolio value of \$ 606,579.06.

Trustees of the Trust Funds December 2008 Annual Report

The Trustees of the Trust Funds are responsible for handling the investments and disbursements of Trusts left to the town, Cemetery Perpetual Care Funds, Geneva Lockhart Fund, Nute Common School Fund, Carl Siemon Scholarship Fund, and Rodney Nason Scholarship Fund. The Trustees are also responsible for all Capital Reserve Funds voted at the Annual Meetings and CRF funds of the Water and Sewer Departments.

All monies held by the Trustees are in accounts at Citizens Bank called the Concentration Account Program, which is used by many Trustees of Trust Funds. The Trustees have arranged for these funds to be collateralized by United States full faith and credit securities held at the Bank of New York.

In the year 2008 - \$5,297.26 in interest from the Nute Common School Fund was turned over to the Milton School District. The Lockhart Fund gave \$1,000.00 toward the Restoration of the Town House, \$300.00 toward the Winter Carnival, \$2,835.00 to purchase benches and tables for the Beach, \$150.00 for three "Welcome to Milton" signs and \$360.25 for flowers around Town. A big "Thank You" to those who planted the flowers.

The interest from the Cemetery Perpetual Care Trust Fund covers part of the cost of maintaining individual or family lots, cleaning headstones and placement of Memorial Day flowers for those who have established funds for that purpose. In 2008, \$5,701.63 was turned over to the Milton Mills Cemetery Association, which included flower money, \$2,539.91 to the Town of Milton, plus \$187.00 for flowers and \$614.10 to the Hayes Cemetery in West Milton.

The following report contains more detailed information and the annual MS10 and MS9 forms will be filed with the State.

Tax Collector 2008

I always like to start by welcoming any new residents to Milton. Reading these pages will enlighten you to information that may be helpful to you in the future. I hope that some of you are willing to get more involved with our town by helping on a Board or Committee. New faces are always welcome.

Since there was such a drastic increase in our tax bills this December, I would like to explain the process. The July payment consists of ½ the **TOTAL** amount of the previous tax year (other publications were wrong). Your July bill is **ONLY** an estimated bill. Unfortunately we cannot increase this amount so that the December's bill is not as large. In October the State Department of Revenue takes into account all revenue and what you voted into the budget at the March election. It is then that the State calculates the Town of Milton tax rate.

Given that Milton is a SB2 town, it is extremely important for everyone to attend the deliberative sessions to discuss the year's budgets. Our second half of the process is the actual voting on the second Tuesday in March. **YOUR VOTE** is important!!!

All address changes are handled through the Assessing Department; so if your address has changed due to home delivery, moving or for any other reason, please let us know. Having a wrong address does not stop your tax bill from being due on its assigned date.

Tax bills are normally due July and December first. If you have not received yours prior to those dates, please give my office a call at 603-652-4501 ext 4.

Our normal hours of operations are:

Monday from 8am-2pm

Tuesday from 1pm-4pm

Thursday from 1pm-7pm

Please note that there are always extended hours the week **before** tax bills are due. If my hours are not convenient for you, you may mail your payment in or drop it off in the lock box located outside near the front steps. If you would like a receipt, please include a self addressed stamped envelope.

Capital Improvement Plan 2008

The original capital improvement plan was approved in 2004 and funded to a small extent in 2005. These are the funds used in recent months to make the purchases of the new fire truck, roll off truck and police cruiser. While the plan is fairly new, Milton residents have actually done a fairly good job of “raising and appropriating” tax money into specific Capital Reserve Funds (CRF) since the mid to late 90’s.

There has been some confusion in recent years as to how the town could access CRF’s for specific items listed in the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), however those were worked out and the funds accessed to purchase a new fire truck (leased in 2005), a new roll off truck, to help keep hauling fees down and a new police cruiser to replace the one that had 180,000 miles on it. This is the way the CIP is supposed to work; over \$320,000 was spent on replacement of existing equipment, at no increase in the tax rate. The money was put into the fund in 2005, in better economic times, to “save” for the day when those items needed to be replaced.

The Capital Improvement Plan is just that, a “plan” of when, large “big ticket” items are planned on being purchased. It is often confused with the “funding” of the plan that takes place during budget season and Town Meeting. Items in the CIP are typically your anticipated large expenditures for things such as vehicles and apparatus, heavy (construction) equipment, buildings upgrade and maintenance projects and planned construction and improvement projects on roads sidewalks and new buildings. However, items are also typically included that don’t fall into these very broad categories, like computer servers, revaluation projects, land purchases for conservation etc. The general rule of thumb for small communities is CIP items need to have a cost of purchase or replacement of more than \$5,000.00 and a usable lifespan of more than 5 years. The funding of the CIP is meant to help stabilize the tax rate by anticipating large expenditures and planning for how that need will be met so that those that are to be paid for by taxes will not cause big spikes in the tax rate.

While the CIP is the “plan”, the second important component of meeting the town’s CIP needs is the “funding” of the plan. Not surprisingly, the funding of the CIP in recent years has been lower than necessary to meet the needs of Milton over the years, because of the economic times. Unfortunately, while the funding of the items in the plan may be low, the need does not go away. Admittedly, we can put off some purchases until a later date; the purchases will have to be made. The question is not is there enough money in the Capital Reserve Fund to replace a critical piece of equipment, the question is whether or not the purchase will spike, taxes to meet the need.

The CIP is not meant to be a static document that once created it is not looked at again and items continue along without review and update. Things change, needs change as do costs, for that reason the plan needs to be reviewed and updated on an annual basis as a result of input from department heads, board members and residents alike. It needs to be a plan that is well thought out, developed over time and most importantly, the voters understand if we expect their support when it comes to funding. Because of the changeover in administrators the plan was not revised in 2008. Revision of the plan should take place in July and August and should be the result of meetings and input from department heads and members of a CIP committee formed to provide the initial review and make recommendations to the Board.

The CIP as it now stands follows and was last updated in 2007.

The second session of the annual town meeting, to elect town officers by official ballot and to vote on all warrant articles as they may have been amended at the first session, will be held on Tuesday, March 10, 2009 at the Emma Ramsey Center. Polls for voting by official ballot will open at 8:00am and close at 7:00pm.

Article 1

To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year for which there are vacancies, for such terms as may be permitted by law.

Article 2

Zoning Amendment # 1:

Are you in favor of the proposed amendment that transfers relevant personal wireless definitions from Article II Definitions to Article VII Personal Wireless Service Facilities?

Article 3

Zoning Amendment # 2:

Are you in favor of the proposed amendment that provides appropriate and updated definitions in Article II Definitions?

(This appropriation is covered by the revenue received from police details and there will be no funds raised from general taxation and no tax impact.)

Article 9

To see if the Town will vote to rescind its vote of March 14, 2006 adopting Warrant Article 14 whereby the Town voted to restrict 100 % of the revenues from police special details and to deposit those revenues into the Police Detail Special Revenue Fund. This article is contingent on the successful passage of article #8 above. If passed, all remaining funds in the Police Detail Special Revenue Fund estimated to be Seventy One Thousand Dollars (\$71,000.00) will revert to the general fund to reduce taxes.

No expenditure shall be made in such a way as to require the expenditure of other town funds

which have not been appropriated for that purpose. This article is contingent on the successful passage of Articles 8 &9 above.

(This appropriation is a Special Warrant Article and is in addition to Warrant Article 6, the operating budget article.)

Article 16

To see if the Town will vote to establish a Milton Townhouse Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of making repairs and restoration to the Milton Townhouse Building, including the use of the fund as matching funds for grants that might come available, and to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to be placed in the Milton Townhouse Capital Reserve Fund, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from this fund.

(This appropriation is a Special Warrant Article and is in addition to Warrant Article 6, the operating budget article.)

Article 17

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to be placed in the previously established Milton Recreation Department Capital Reserve Fund.

(This appropriation is a Special Warrant Article and is in addition to Warrant Article 6, the operating budget article.)

Article 18

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred and Seventeen Thousand, Two Hundred and Fifty Two Dollars (\$117,252.00) for the purpose of making improvements to the facility and equipment at the Milton Transfer Station in order to improve the operation, efficiency and safety at the Milton Transfer station and to authorize the withdrawal of One Hundred and Seventeen Thousand, Two Hundred and Fifty Two Dollars (\$117,252.00) from the Transfer Station Special Revenue fund previously established. (Majority vote required).

(Majority vote required)

(This appropriation is covered by the revenue received from the users of the transfer station and there will be no funds raised from general taxation and no tax impact.)

Article 19

To see if the Town will vote to rescind its vote of March 14, 2006 adopting Warrant Article 15 whereby the Town voted to restrict 100 % of the revenues from the operation of the transfer station and to deposit those revenues into the "Milton Transfer Station, Special Revenue Fund". This article is contingent on the successful passage of article 18 above.

Article 20

To see if the town will vote to establish a Solid Waste and Recycling Revolving Fund pursuant to RSA 31: 95-h for the purpose of paying for the costs of providing solid waste and recycling . The revenues received from the operations of the Transfer Station

shall be deposited into the Fund, shall be allowed to accumulate from year to year, and shall not be considered to be part of the town's general fund balance. The town Treasurer shall have custody of all monies in the fund and shall pay out the same only upon order of the Board of Selectmen (no further town meeting approval required). The funds may be expended only for costs related to the operation of the transfer station including the purchase, repair, maintenance and replacement of equipment and vehicles necessary to operate the transfer station. No expenditure shall be made in such a way as to require the expenditure of other town funds which have not been appropriated for that purpose. This article is contingent on the successful passage of Articles 18 & 19 above.

Article 21

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty Six Thousand Dollars (\$26,000.00) for the purpose of paying a per diem stipend to those employees who provide shift coverage for the Town ambulance on weekends and holidays throughout the year in order to ensure "on call" ambulance coverage for the health and safety of the public on weekends and holidays.

(This appropriation is a Special Warrant Article and is in addition to Warrant Article 6, the operating budget article.)

Article 22

To see if the Town will vote to change the purpose of the existing Capital Improvement Plan, Capital Reserve Fund created in 2005, which has as its purpose the funding of vehicles, buildings and equipment set forth in the Town's Capital Improvement Plan, to the General Government Buildings Improvement and Construction, Capital Reserve Fund and to name the Selectmen as agents to expend, for the purpose of undertaking major maintenance, upgrades, improvements and additions to existing town buildings as well as for undertaking preliminary engineering, architectural design, and planning for the construction of new town buildings.

(2/3rds ballot vote required)

Article 23

To see if the Town will vote to modify the elderly exemptions from property tax in the Town of Milton based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers to be as follows: for a person 65 years of age to 75 years Forty Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$42,500.00); for a person 75 years of age up to 80 years Sixty Four Thousand Dollars (\$64,000.00); for a person 80 years of age or older Eighty Five Thousand Dollars (\$85,000.00). To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least 5 years, own the real estate individually or jointly or if the real estate is owned by such person's spouse, they must have been married for at least 5 years. In addition the taxpayer must have a net income of not more than Thirty Thousand Dollars

(\$30,000.00), or if married, a combined net income of less than Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00); and own net assets not in excess of Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00), excluding the value of the person's residence.

(Majority vote required)

Article 24

To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 36-A:4-a,I(e) to authorize the Conservation Commission to expend funds for contributions to "qualified organizations" for the purpose of property interest, or facilitating transactions related thereto, where the property interest is to be held by the qualified organization and the Town will retain no interest in the property.

(Majority vote required)

Article 25

To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA-A:4-a,I(a) to authorize the Conservation Commission to expend funds to purchase interests in land outside the boundaries of our municipality, subject to the approval of the local governing body.

Article 26

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept and maintain as a Class V Town Road that portion of Ohio Road, so called, running from NH Route 125 to the easterly side of the Northcoast Railroad tracks. This authorization shall include authorization to maintain the railroad crossing. The Board of Selectmen is authorized to accept the dedication of all easements and deeds necessary to accomplish the acceptance of this road.

(Majority vote required)

Article 27

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) for the purchase of the historical Plummer's Ridge Rural School House, located at 1116 White Mountain Highway, from the Milton Ridge Sewing Society. Tax Map 22, Lot 17. The purpose of this warrant article is to help preserve this historical school house.

(Majority vote required)

Article 28

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to appoint the Public Works Director and to discontinue the election of the Public Works Director upon completion of the current term set to expire on March 16, 2012.

(Majority vote required)

Article 29

To see if the Town will vote to accept the improved 1200 foot section of McKeagney Road as a Class 5 (Town Maintained) road from a class 6 (not Town Maintained) Road. A total of six houses are on this section.

This article is submitted by petition.

Article 30

To see if the town is favor of having the office of town clerk combined with the office of tax collector, thereby creating a new office of town clerk-tax collector to be held by one individual. If a majority of those persons voting on the question vote in favor of creating the combined office of town clerk-tax collector at the next annual meeting, occurring after the vote of approval, the town shall choose, by ballot, one individual as town clerk-tax collector, and such individual shall serve for a term of a term of 3 years. The term of any individual then in office as town clerk or tax collector shall cease and the newly elected town clerk-tax collector shall take office.
